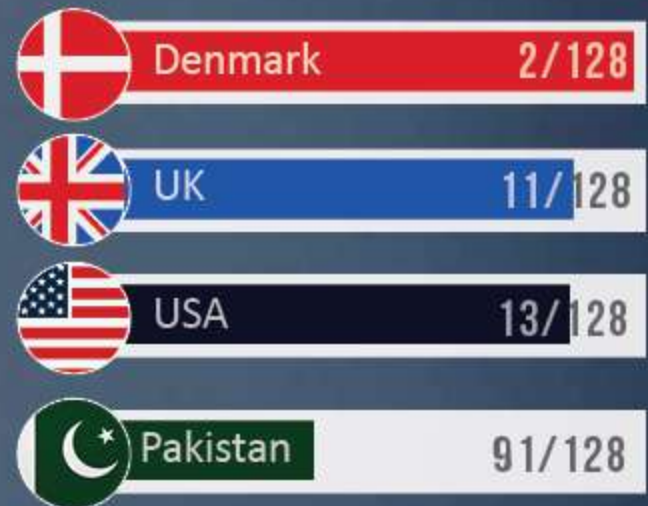

Pakistan ranks 91 among 128 countries in the world on open government index. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

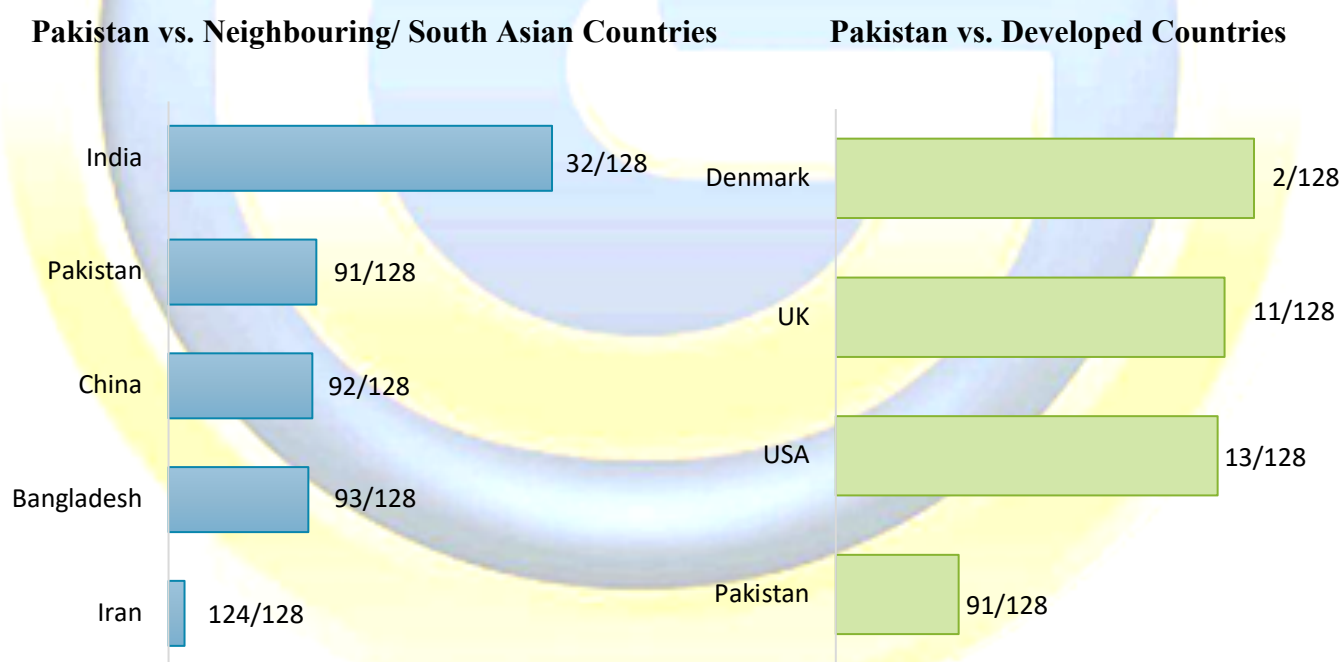

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 91 among 128 countries surveyed in the world in terms of open government.

The global survey results are based on Factor 3 of the WJP Rule of Law Index which measures the openness of government defined by the extent to which a government shares information, empowers people with tools to hold the government accountable, and fosters citizen participation in public policy deliberations. This factor measures whether basic laws and information on legal rights are publicized and evaluates the quality of information published by the government.

Pakistan's score on the index (0.43) fell in 2020 from (0.45) in 2019, thus indicating a fall in Pakistan's performance on the open government index.

The index is based on several indicators such as publicized law & government data, right to information, civic participation, and complaint mechanism. Within the sub-factors, Pakistan ranks 97/128 in publicized laws, while Pakistan ranks 103/128 in terms of right to information.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
