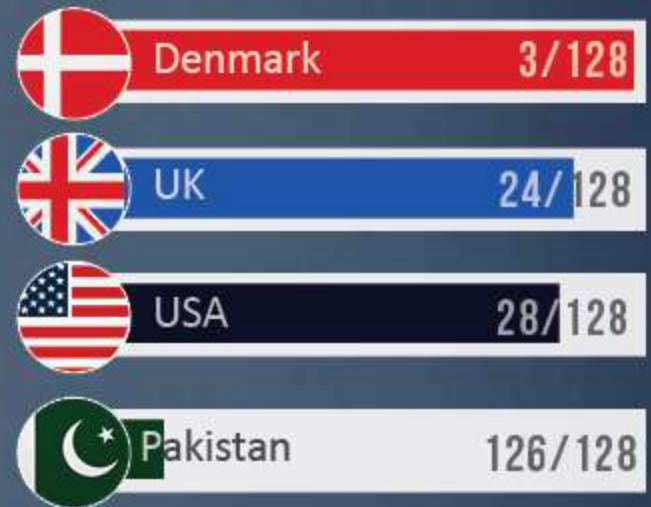

Pakistan ranks 126 among 128 countries in the world on order & security index. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

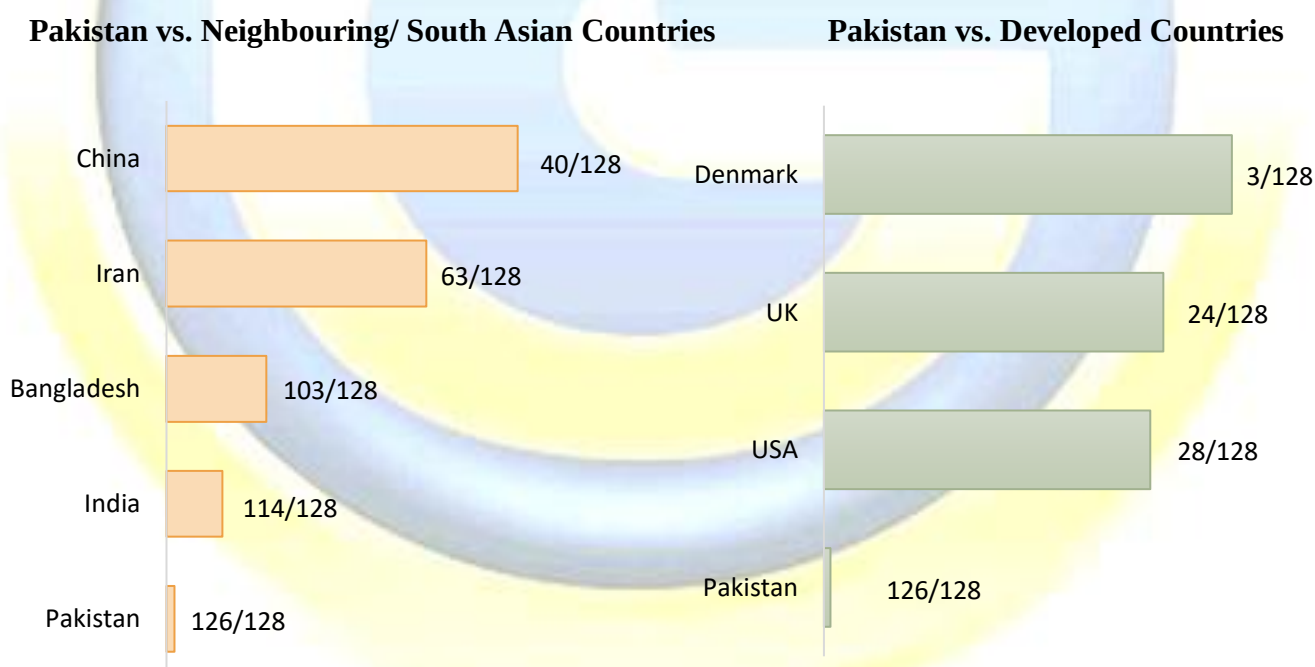

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 126 among 128 countries surveyed in the world in terms of order and security.

The global survey results are based on Factor 5 of the WJP Rule of Law Index which measures how well a society ensures the security of persons and property. Security is one of the defining aspects of any rule of law society and is a fundamental function of the state. It is also a precondition for the realization of the rights and freedoms that the rule of law seeks to advance.

Pakistan's score on the index increased from 0.36 in 2019 to 0.37 in 2020, however Pakistan's rank has remained unchanged at 126th.

The index is based on several indicators such as effective crime control, limited civil conflict and people not resorting to violence to redress personal grievances. Within the sub-factors, Pakistan ranks 108/128 in limiting crimes, 126/128 in effectively limiting civil conflict and 102/128 in people not resorting to violence to redress personal grievances.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
