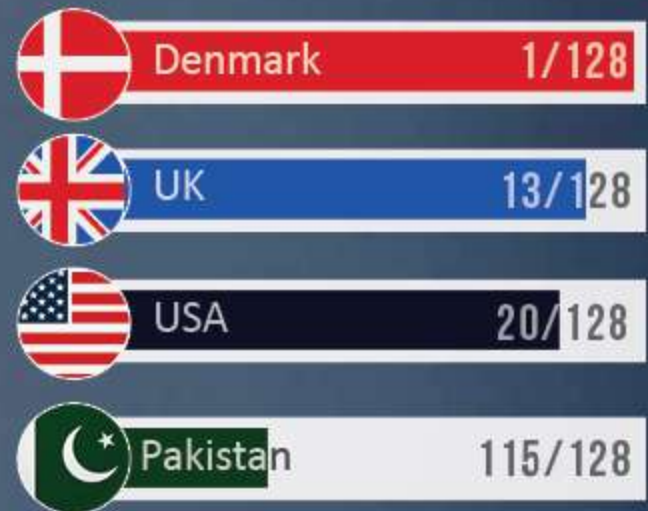

Pakistan ranks 115th across 128 countries in the world on regulatory enforcement index. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

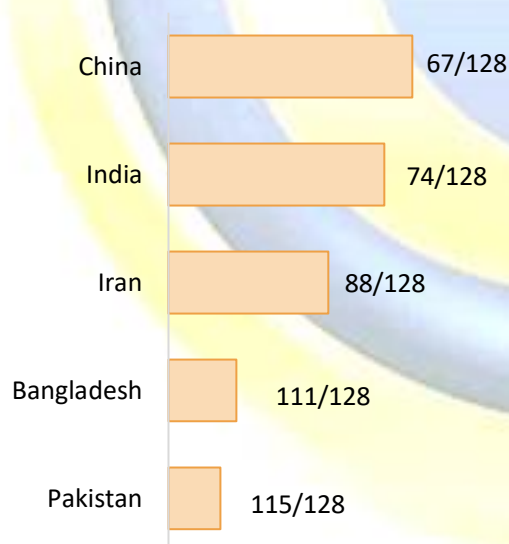
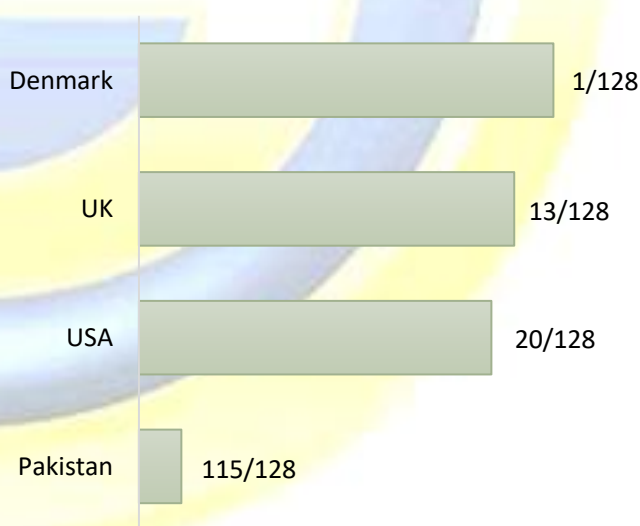

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 115 among 128 countries surveyed in the world on regulatory enforcement index.

The global survey results are based on Factor 6 of the WJP Rule of Law Index which measures the extent to which regulations are fairly and effectively implemented and enforced. Regulations, both legal and administrative, structure behaviors within and outside of the government. This factor does not assess which activities a government chooses to regulate, nor does it consider how much regulation of a particular activity is appropriate. Rather, it examines how regulations are implemented and enforced.

Pakistan's score on the index increased from 0.38 in 2019 to 0.39 in 2020, and Pakistan's rank has risen by two places.

The index is based on several indicators such as effective enforcement of government regulations without improper influences, administrative processes are conducted without unreasonable delay, due process is respected, and the government does not expropriate without lawful process and adequate compensation. Within the sub-factors, Pakistan ranks 123/128 in respecting due processes in administrative processes, and 97/128 in government regulations applied and enforced without improper influence.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
