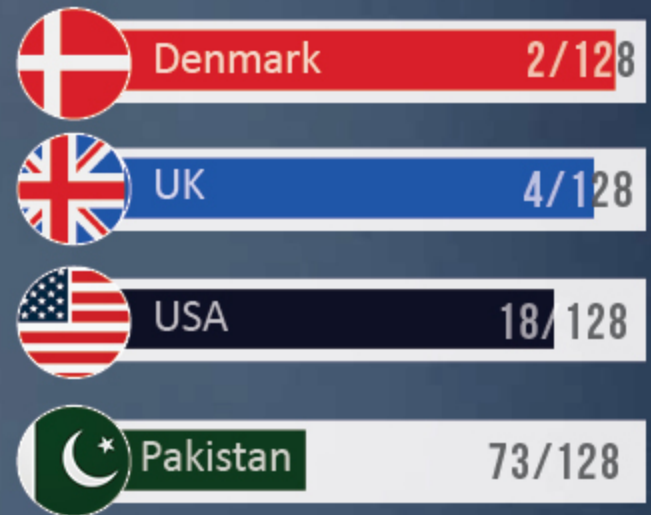

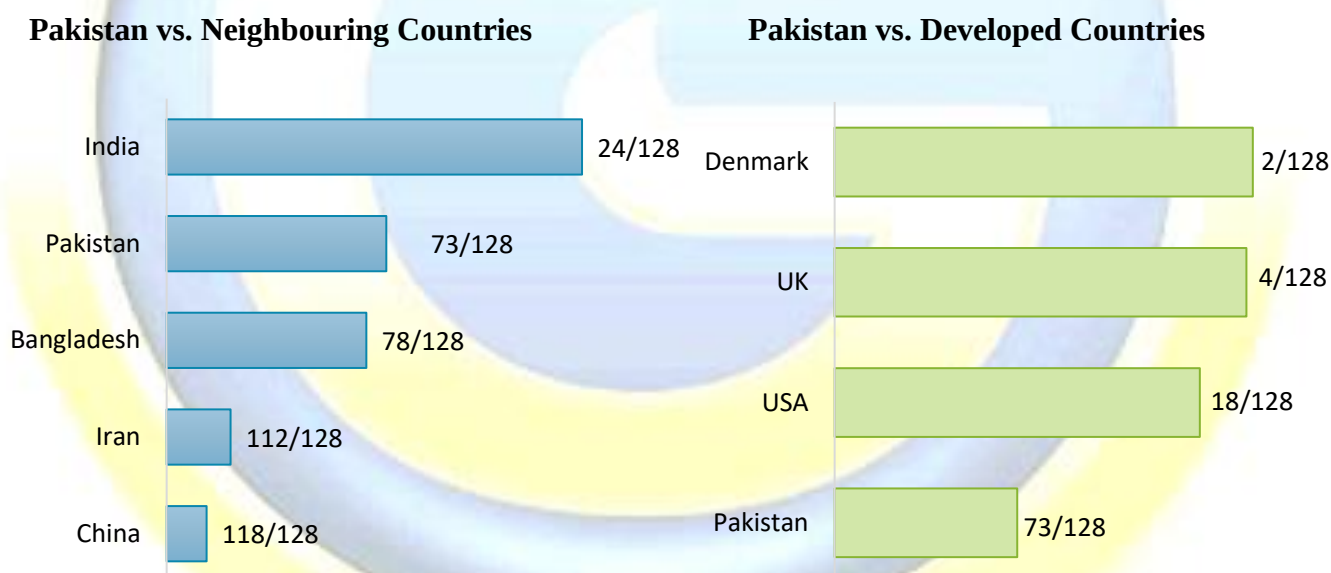

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 73 among 128 countries surveyed in the world in effectively limiting government power.

The global survey results are based on sub-Factor 1.1 of the WJP Constraints on Government Power Index which measures whether legislative bodies have the ability in practice to exercise effective checks on and oversight of the government.

Pakistan vs. Neighbors: On this index India ranks much higher than Pakistan at 24, while the rest of the neighbors rank below Pakistan with Iran ranking 112th, China 118th and Bangladesh 78th.

Pakistan vs. Developed: Denmark ranks 2nd on this index, followed by U.K at 4th and U.S at 18th.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
