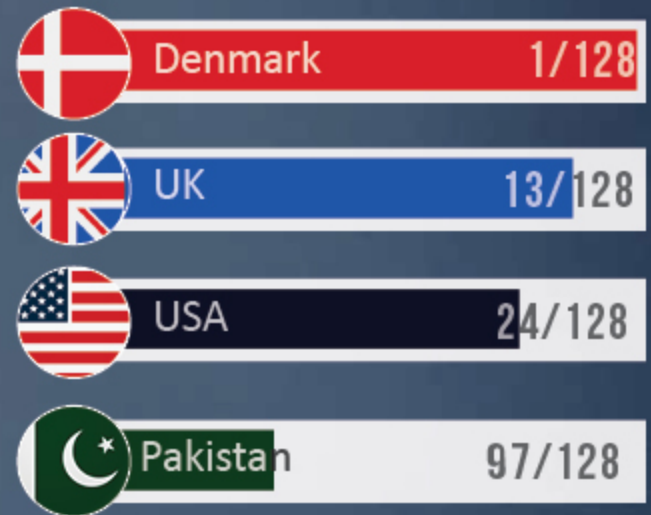

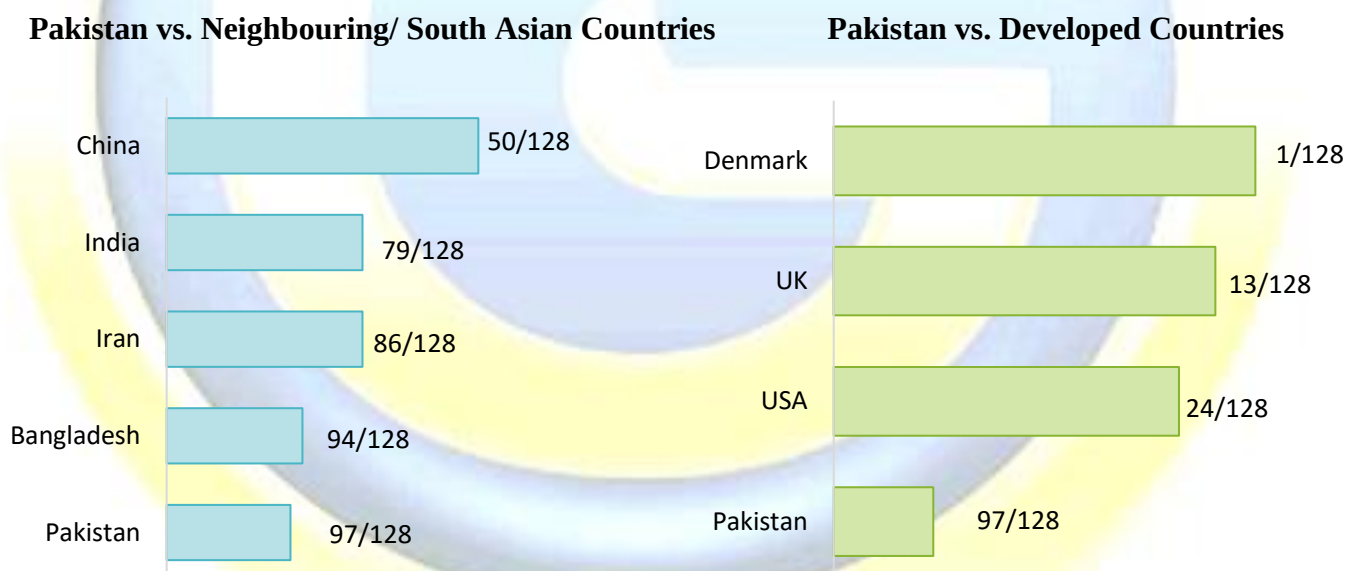

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 97 among 128 countries surveyed in the world on sanctioning government officials for misconduct.

The global survey results are based on sub-Factor 1.4 of the WJP Constraints on Government Power Index which measures whether government officials in the executive, legislature, judiciary, and the police are investigated, prosecuted, and punished for official misconduct and other violations.

Pakistan vs. Neighbouring/ South Asian Countries: On this index, Pakistan ranks lowest compared to its neighbors China and India ranking much higher than Pakistan at 50th and 79th respectively, while Iran ranks 86th, and Bangladesh ranks 94th.

Pakistan vs. Developed: Denmark ranks 1st on this index, followed by U.K at 13th and U.S at 24th.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
