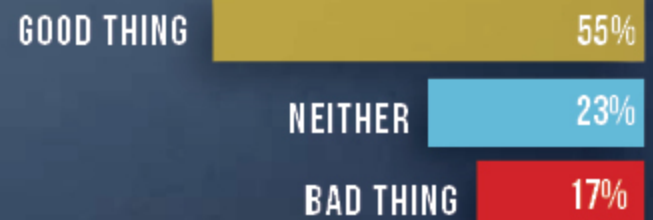

40% Pakistanis believe that greater respect for authority in the future will be a good change. The global comparative figure is 55%. (World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

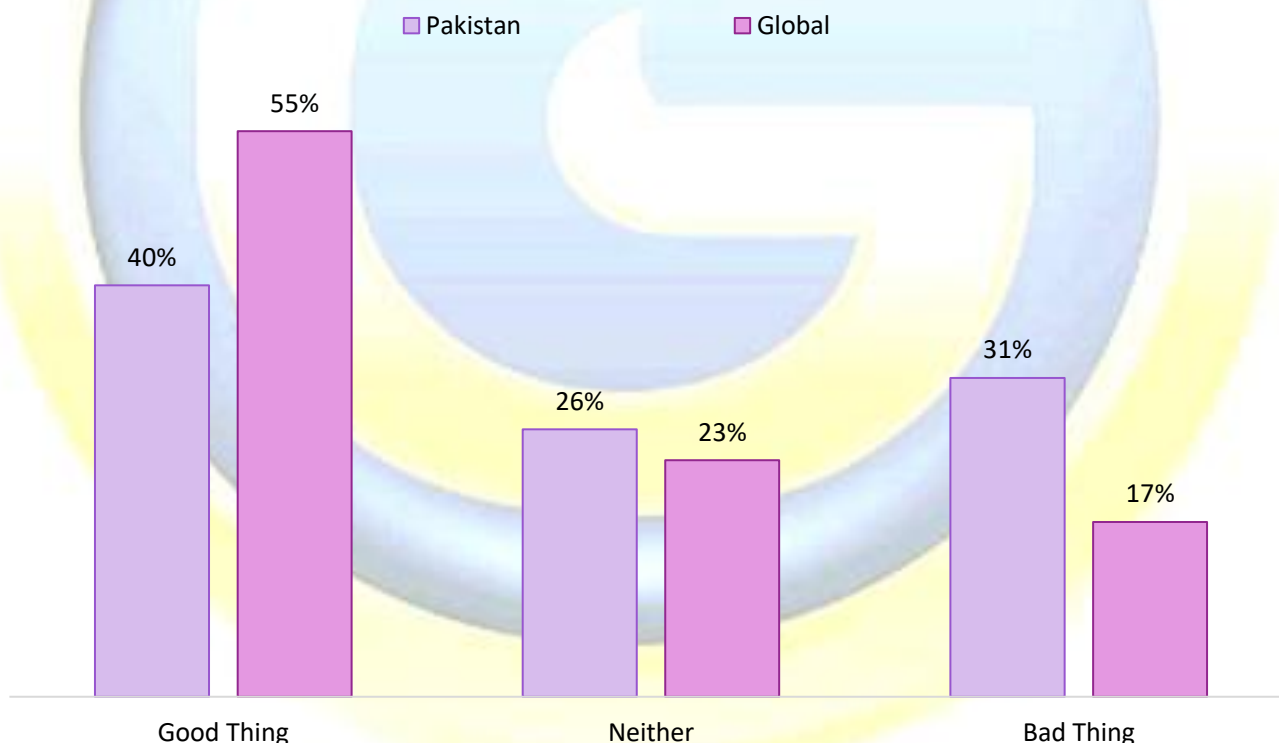

According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 40% Pakistanis said greater respect for authority in the future will be a good change.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“Do you think if the following change happens in the near future would it be a good thing, a bad thing, or neither? - Greater respect for authority”*. In response to this question, 40% said it will be a good change, 26% said it will be neither bad nor good and 31% said it will be a bad change.

Global Results: Globally, 55% believe it will be a good change.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
