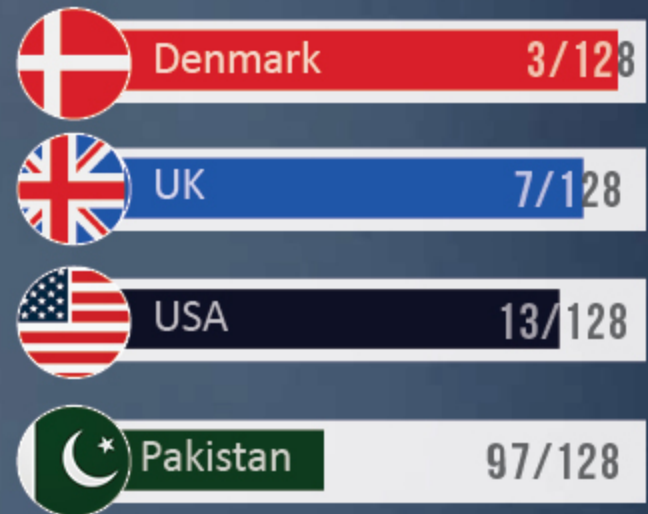

Pakistan ranks 97th across 128 countries in the world on having publicized law and government data, much lower than regional counterparts (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

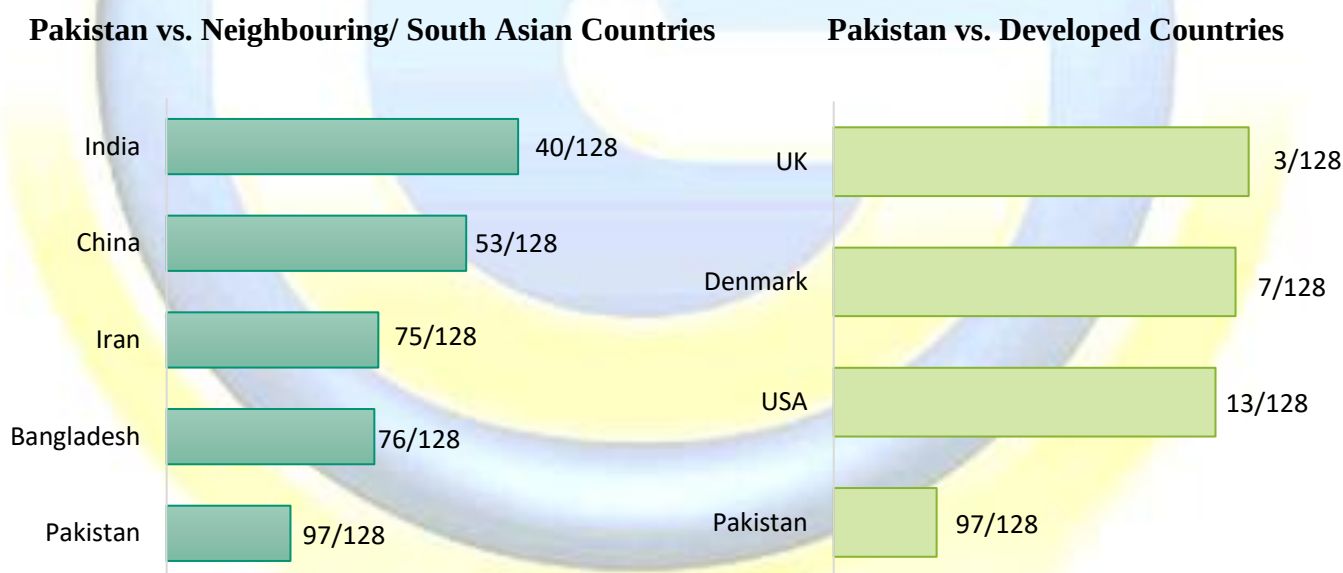

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 97 among 128 countries surveyed in the world on having publicized law and government data.

The global survey results are based on sub-Factor 3.1 of the WJP Open Government Index which measures whether basic laws and information on legal rights are publicly available, presented in plain language, and made accessible in all languages. It also measures the quality and accessibility of information published by the government in print or online, and whether administrative regulations, drafts of legislation, and high court decisions are made accessible to the public in a timely manner.

Pakistan vs. Neighbouring/ South Asian Countries: On this index, all neighbors rank much higher than Pakistan with India at 40th, China 53rd, Iran 75th and Bangladesh 76th.

Pakistan vs. Developed: UK ranks 3rd on this index, followed by Denmark at 7th and US at 13th.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
