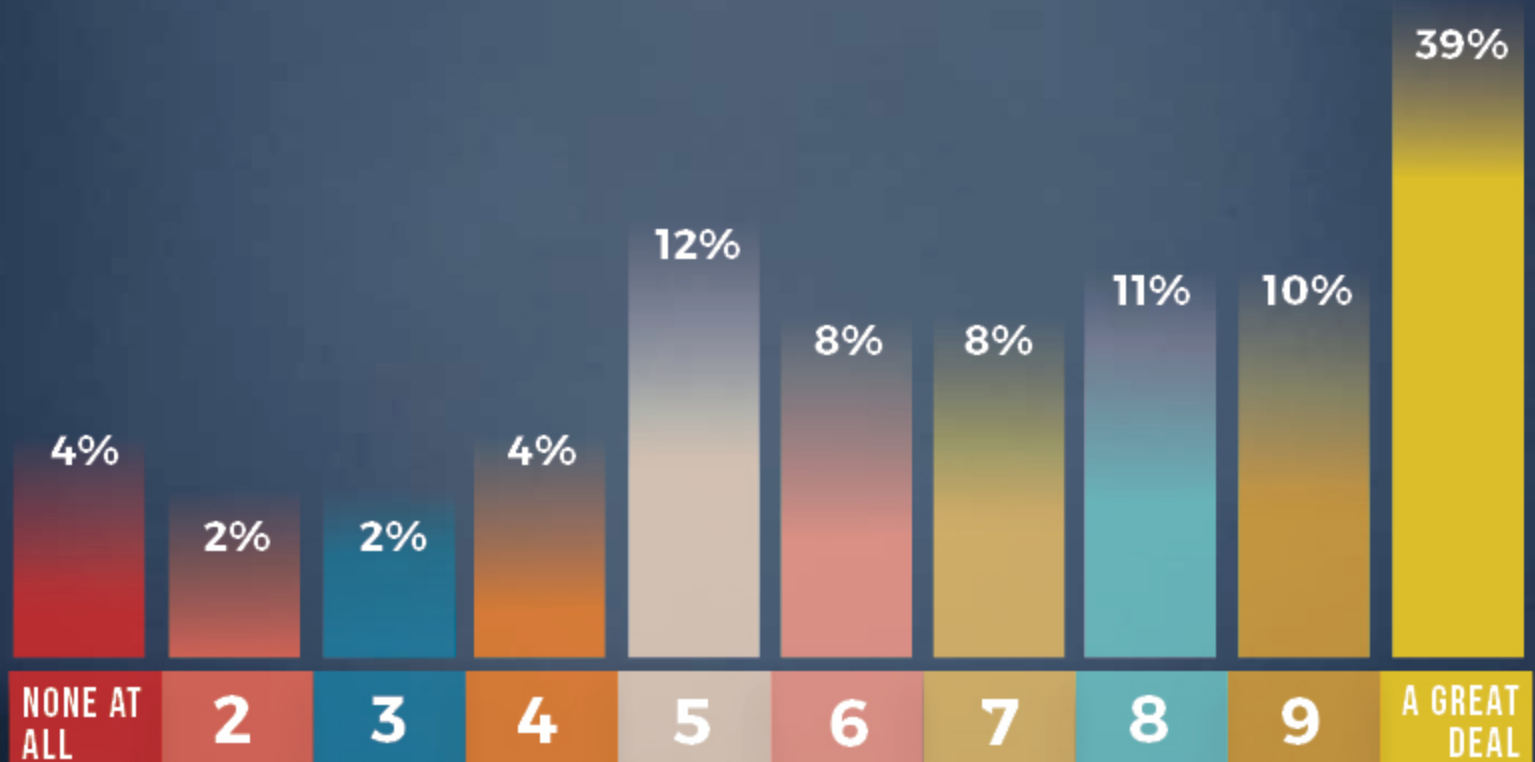

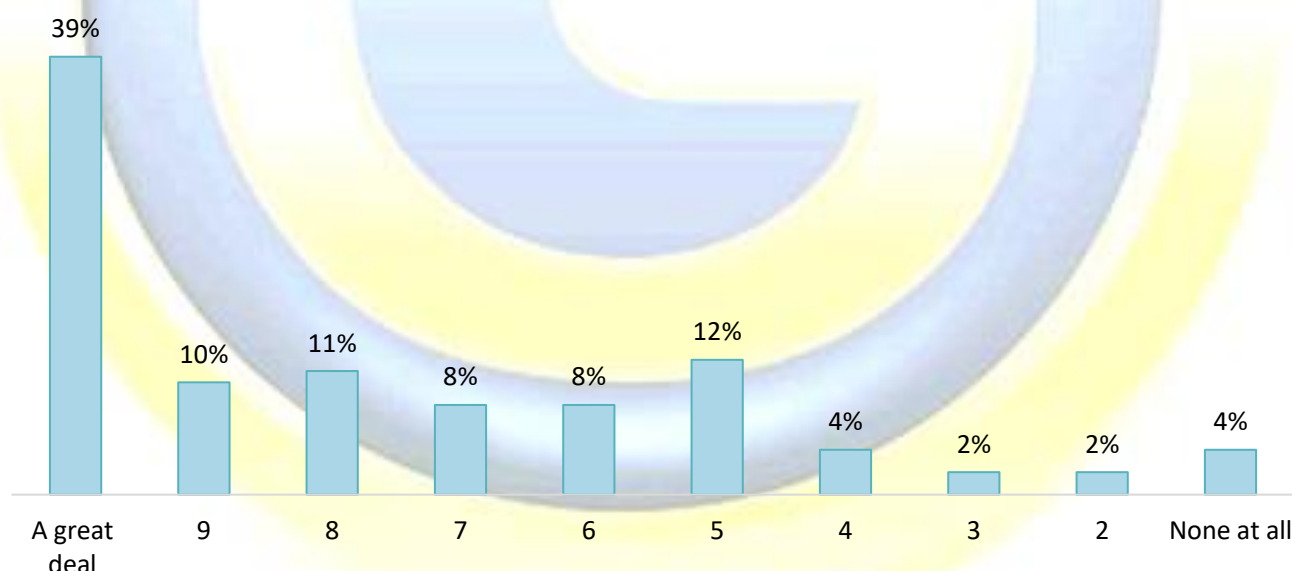
4 in 10 Pakistanis (39%) claim to have a great deal of freedom of choice and control over how their lives turn out (World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

Islamabad, 3rd November, 2020

According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 39% Pakistanis believe they have a great deal of control and freedom over their lives.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Some people feel they have completely free choice and control over their lives, while other people feel that what they do has no real effect on what happens to them. Please use this scale where 1 means “none at all” and 10 means “a great deal” to indicate how much freedom of choice and control you feel you have over the way your life turns out.” In response to this question, 39% said a great deal and 4% said none at all.

Question: “Some people feel they have completely free choice and control over their lives, while other people feel that what they do has no real effect on what happens to them. Please use this scale where 1 means “none at all” and 10 means “a great deal” to indicate how much freedom of choice and control you feel you have over the way your life turns out.”

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
