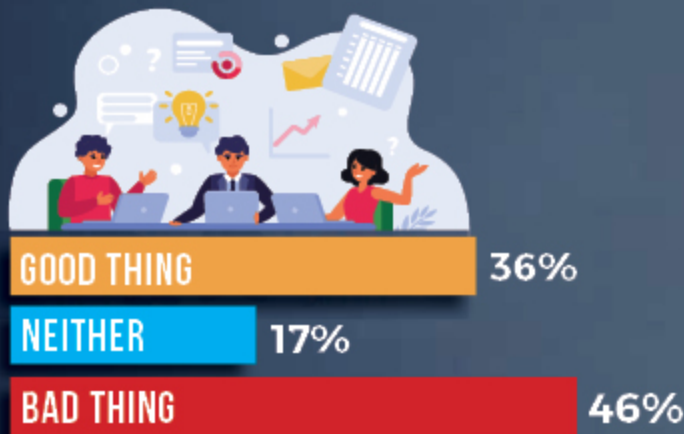

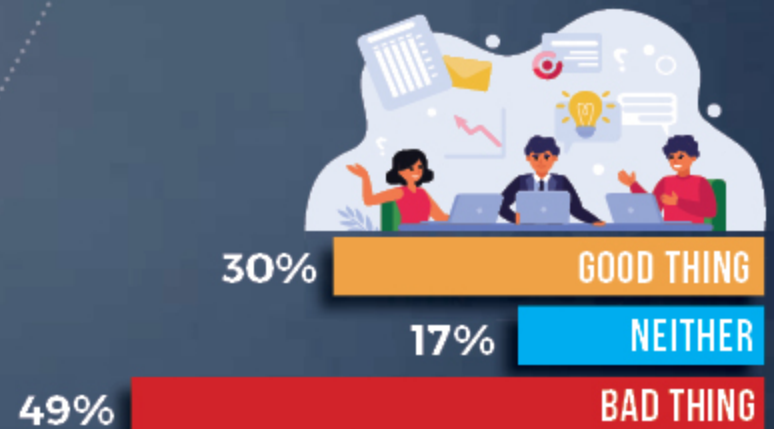

Nearly 1 in 2 Pakistanis (46%) believe placing less importance on work would be a bad change if it happens in the future (World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

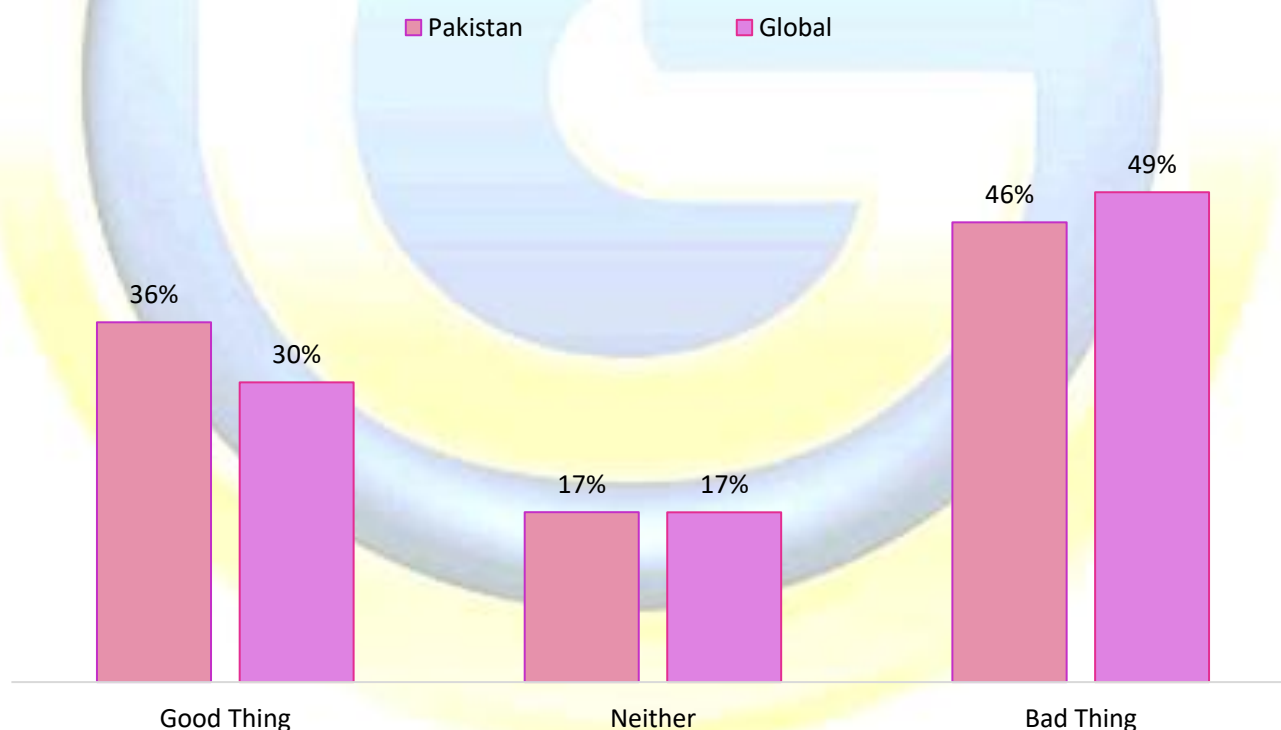

According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 46% said placing less importance on work would be a bad change in the future.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you think if the following change happens in the near future would it be a good thing, a bad thing, or neither? - Less importance placed on work in our lives”. In response to this question, 36% said it would be a good change, 17% said it would be neither bad nor good and 46% said it would be a bad change.

Global Results: Globally, 49% believe it would be a bad change.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
