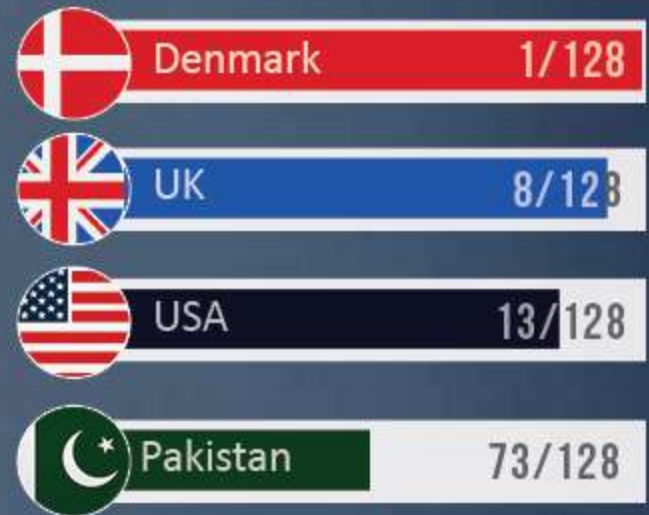

Law and Order****Civic Participation: Pakistan ranks 73rd across 128 countries in the world on civic participation. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)**

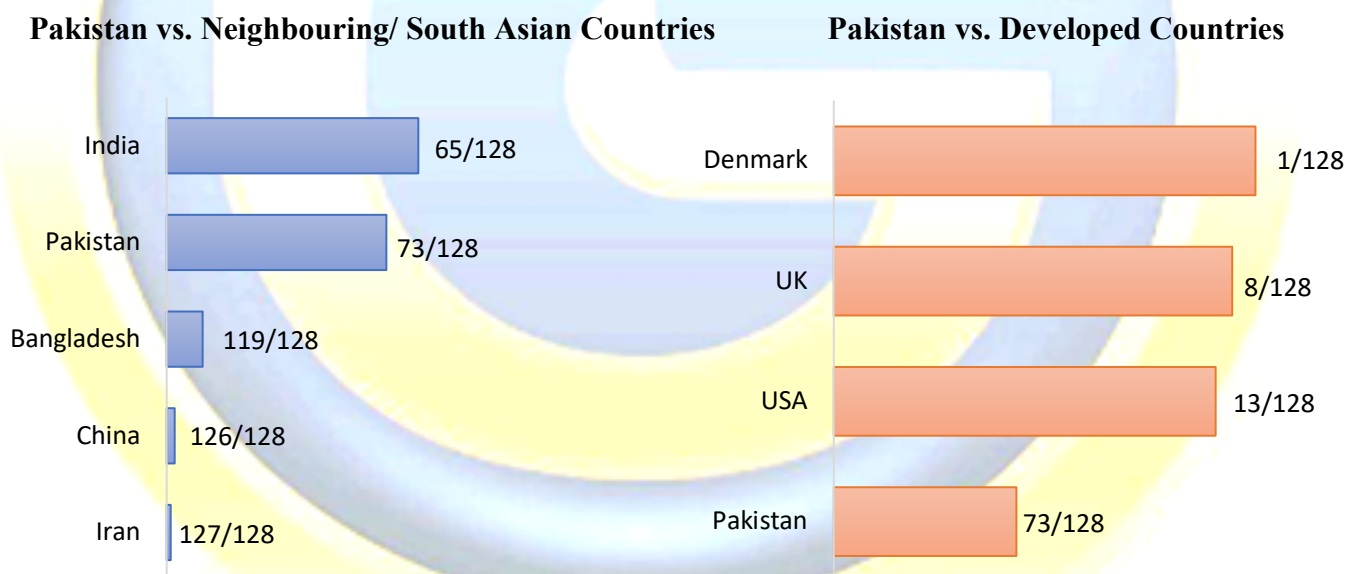

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 73rd across 128 countries surveyed in the world on civic participation.

The global survey results are based on sub-Factor 3.3 of the WJP Open Government Index which measures the effectiveness of civic participation mechanisms, including the protection of the freedoms of opinion and expression, assembly and association, and the right to petition the government. It also measures whether people can voice concerns to various government officers, and whether government officials provide sufficient information and notice about decisions affecting the community.

Pakistan vs. Neighbouring/ South Asian Countries: On this index, only India (65) ranks higher than Pakistan while rest rank much lower with China at 126, Bangladesh at 119 and Iran at 127.

Pakistan vs. Developed: Denmark ranks 1 on this index, followed by UK at 8 and USA at 13.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
