

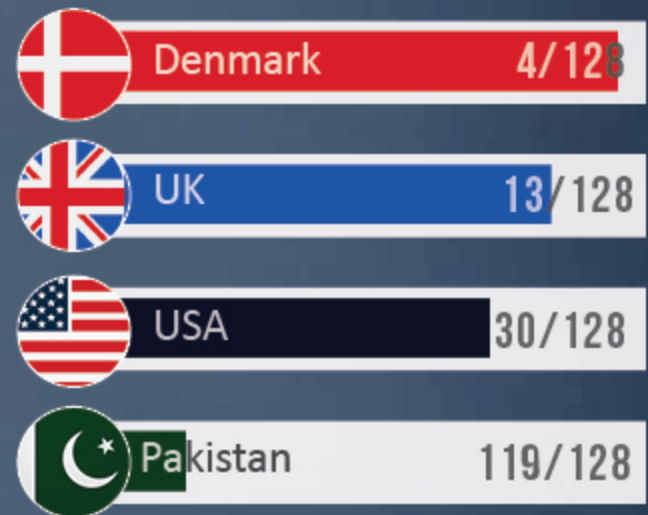

Law and Order****Pakistan ranks 119th across 128 countries in the world on due process of law and rights of the accused. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)**

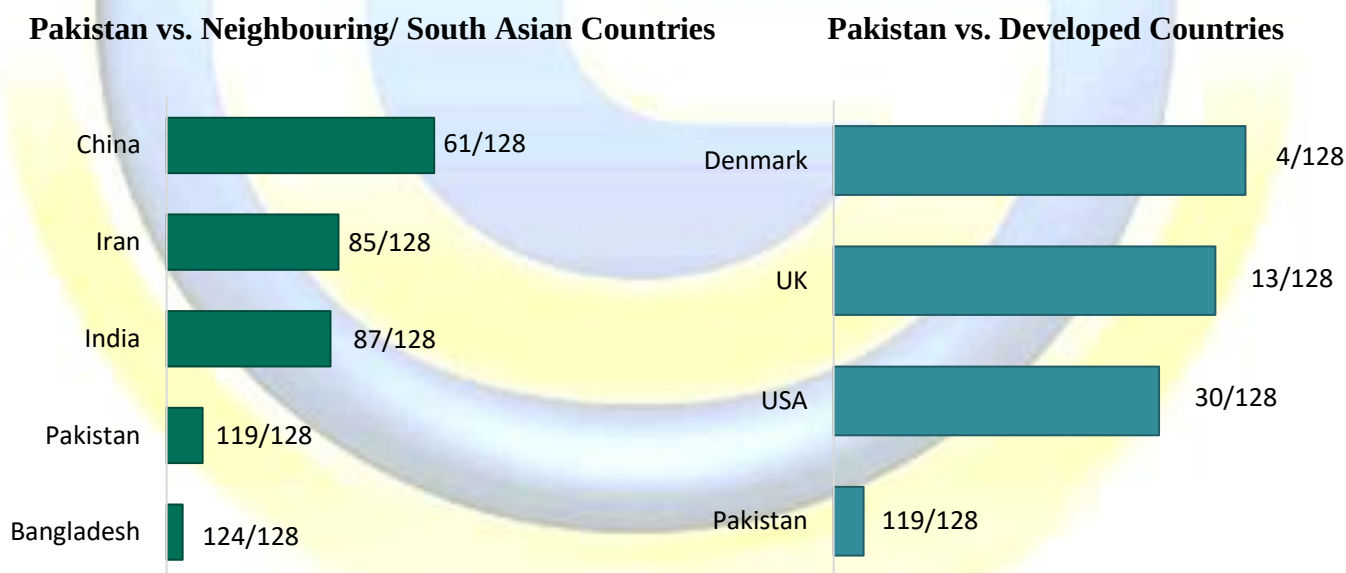

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 119th among 128 countries surveyed in the world on due process of law and rights of the accused.

The global survey results are based on sub-Factor 4.3 of the WJP Fundamental Rights Index which measures whether the basic rights of criminal suspects are respected, including the presumption of innocence and the freedom from arbitrary arrest and unreasonable pre-trial detention. It also measures whether criminal suspects are able to access and challenge evidence used against them, whether they are subject to abusive treatment, and whether they are provided with adequate legal assistance. In addition, it measures whether the basic rights of prisoners are respected once they have been convicted of a crime.

Pakistan vs. Neighbouring / South Asian Countries: On this index, China ranks much higher at 61 followed by Iran at 85 and India at 87, only Bangladesh ranks lower than Pakistan at 124.

Pakistan vs. Developed: Denmark ranks 4th on this index, followed by UK at 13 and USA at 30.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
