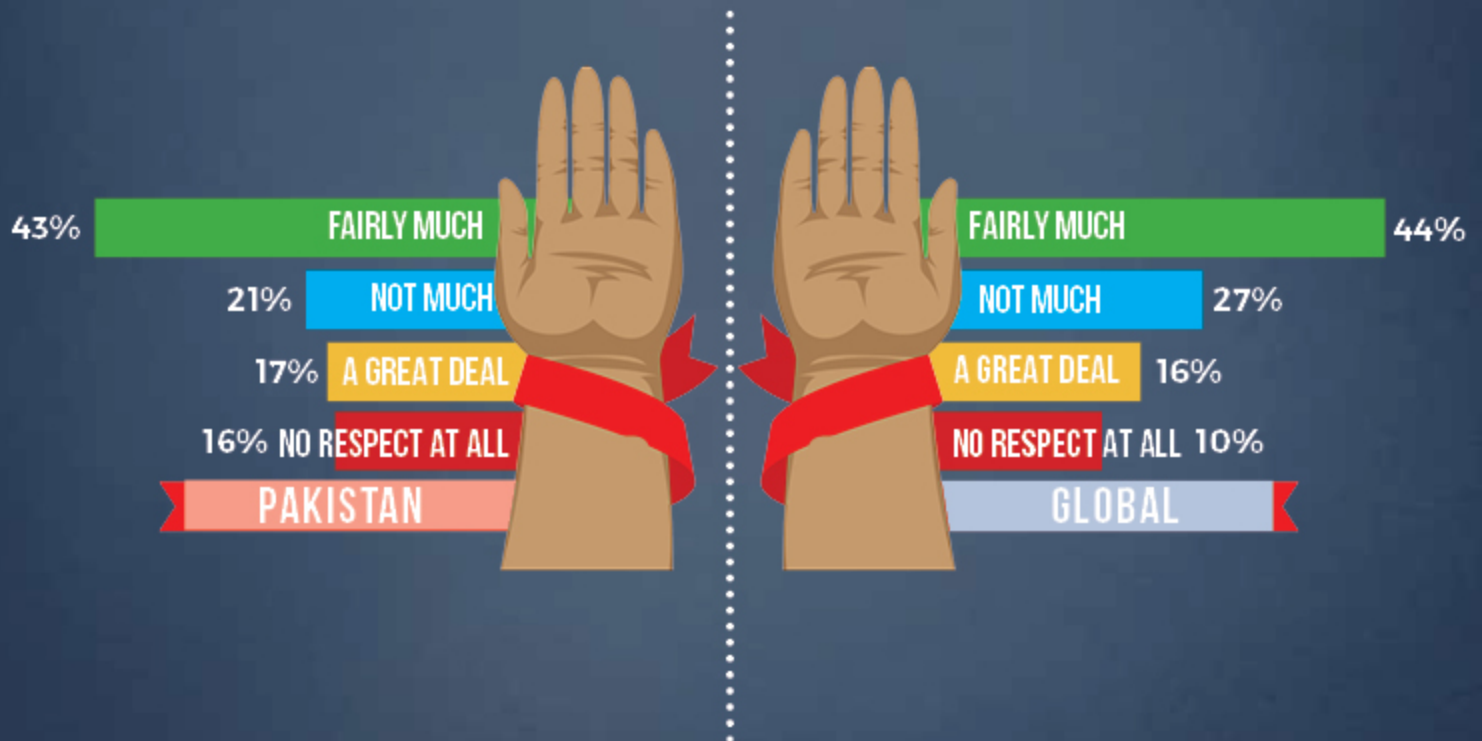

37% PAKISTANIS CLAIM THAT THERE IS LITTLE OR NO RESPECT FOR INDIVIDUAL HUMAN RIGHTS IN PAKISTAN: WORLD VALUES SURVEY AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

37% Pakistanis claim that there is little or no respect for individual human rights in Pakistan: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

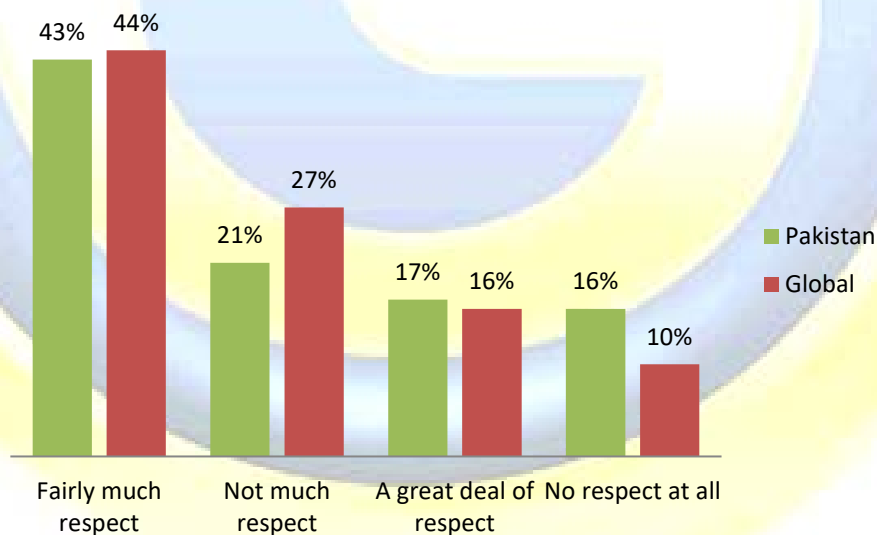
(Islamabad), January 13, 2021

According to a World Values Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan in 2018, 37% Pakistanis claimed that there is little or no respect for individual human rights in Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*How much respect is there for individual human rights nowadays in Pakistan?*” In response to this question, 17% said ‘a great deal of respect’, 43% said ‘fairly much respect’, 21% said ‘not much respect’, while 16% said ‘no respect at all’. 2% did not know/did not respond.

Global Comparison: When the same question was asked in around 70 other countries across the world with more than 70,000 respondents, 16% said ‘a great deal of respect’, 44% said ‘fairly much respect’, 27% said ‘not much respect’ and 10% said that there was no respect at all.

Considering the answer “a great deal of respect”, we find that Tajikistan, followed by Philippines, Andorra and New Zealand rank the highest. Those countries where the least number of people think that there is a great deal of respect are Peru at the top, followed by Romania, Brazil, and South Korea.
