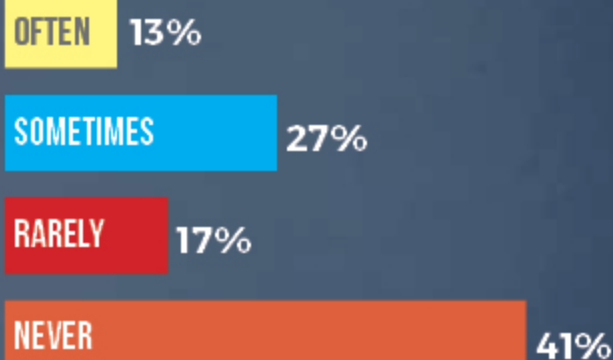

13 % Pakistanis say they or their families have often, in the last 12 months, gone without the medicine or treatment that they needed: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

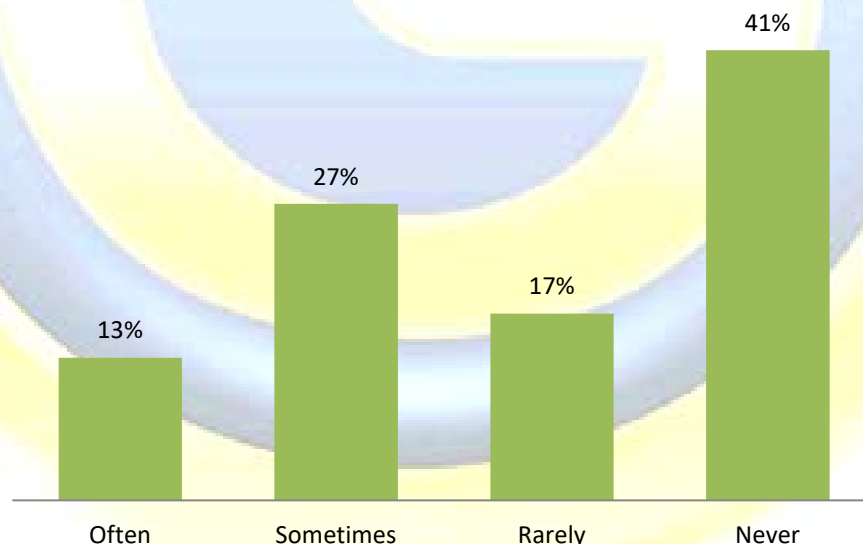

According to a World Values Survey conducted between by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan in 2018, 13% Pakistanis claim than in the last 12 months, they or their families have often gone without medicine or treatment that they needed. Another 27% say that they faced such a situation sometimes.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*In the last 12 months, how often have you or your family gone without needed medicine or treatment that you needed?*” In response to this question, 13% said ‘often’, 27% said ‘sometimes’, 17% said ‘rarely’, 41% said ‘never’ and 1% did not know/did not respond.

*The survey fieldwork was completed before COVID-19. These figures may have changed for the worse since then.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
