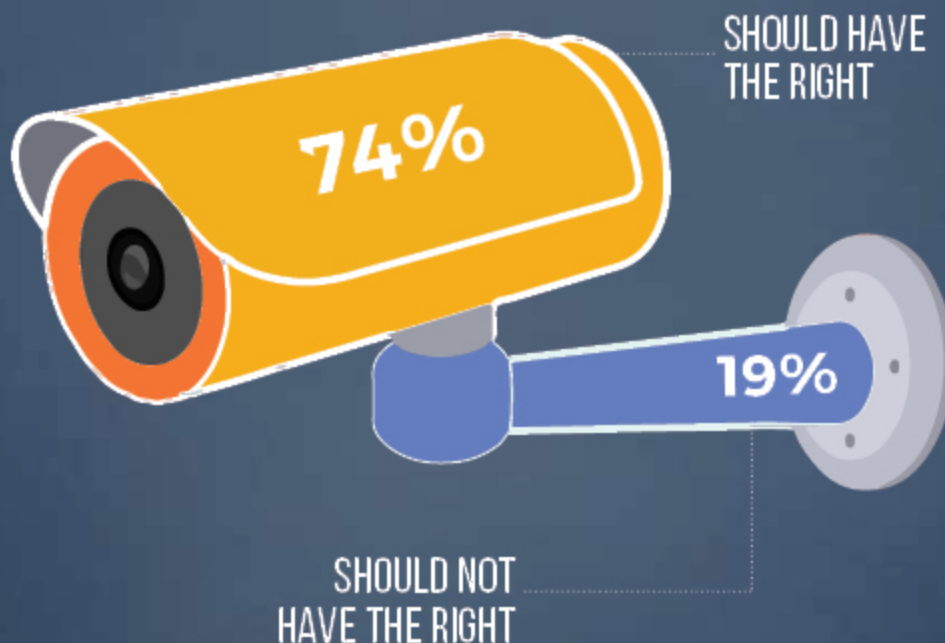

74% PAKISTANIS BELIEVE THAT THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD HAVE THE RIGHT TO KEEP PEOPLE UNDER VIDEO SURVEILLANCE IN PUBLIC AREAS: WORLD VALUES SURVEY AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

74 % Pakistanis believe that the government should have the right to keep people under video surveillance in public areas: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

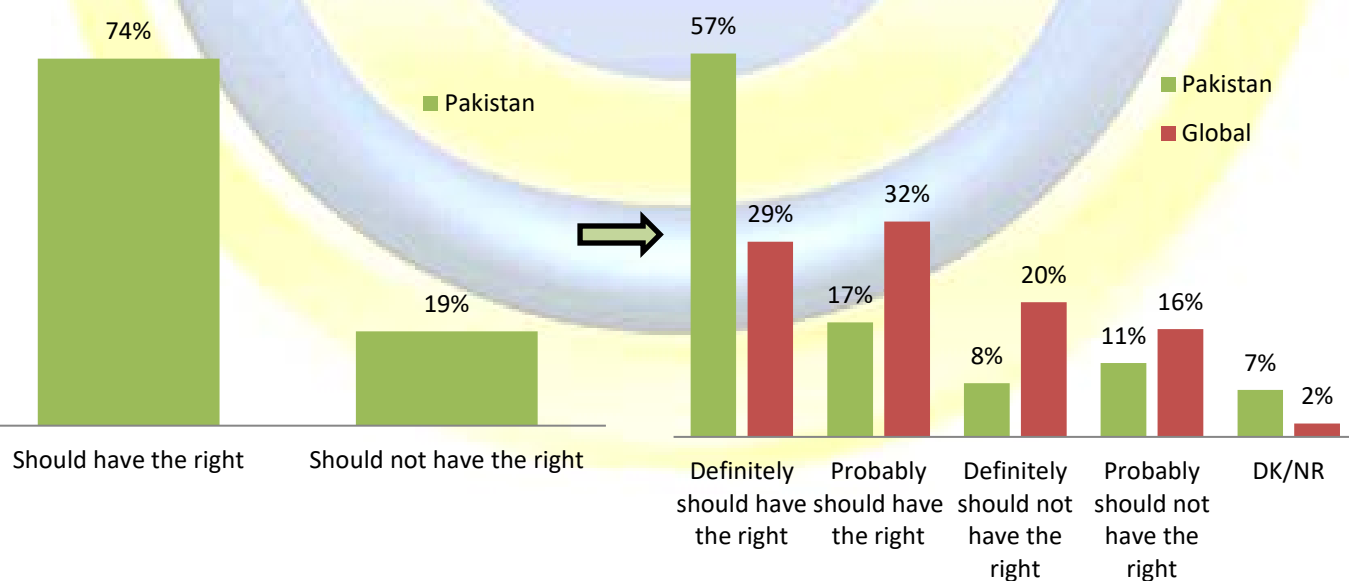
According to a World Values Survey conducted in 2018 by Gallup and Gilani Pakistan, 74% Pakistanis believe that the government should have the right to keep people under video surveillance in public areas.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you think Pakistan’s government should or should not have the right to keep people under video surveillance in public areas?” In response to this question, 57% said ‘definitely should have the right’, 17% said ‘probably should have the right’, 11% said ‘probably should not have the right’, while 8% said ‘definitely should not have the right’. 7% did not know/did not respond.

Global Comparison: Pakistan lies 13% higher than the global average in terms of favoring government’s right to keep people under video surveillance in public areas

When the same question was asked in around 70 other countries across the world with more than 70,000 respondents, 29% said ‘definitely should have the right’, 32% said ‘probably should have the right’, 16% said ‘probably should not have the right’, while 20% said ‘definitely should not have the right’. 2% did not know/did not respond.

Question: “Do you think Pakistan’s government should or should not have the right to keep people under video surveillance in public areas?”



Pakistan ranks 4th in terms of being in favor of government's right to keep people under video surveillance in public areas.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
