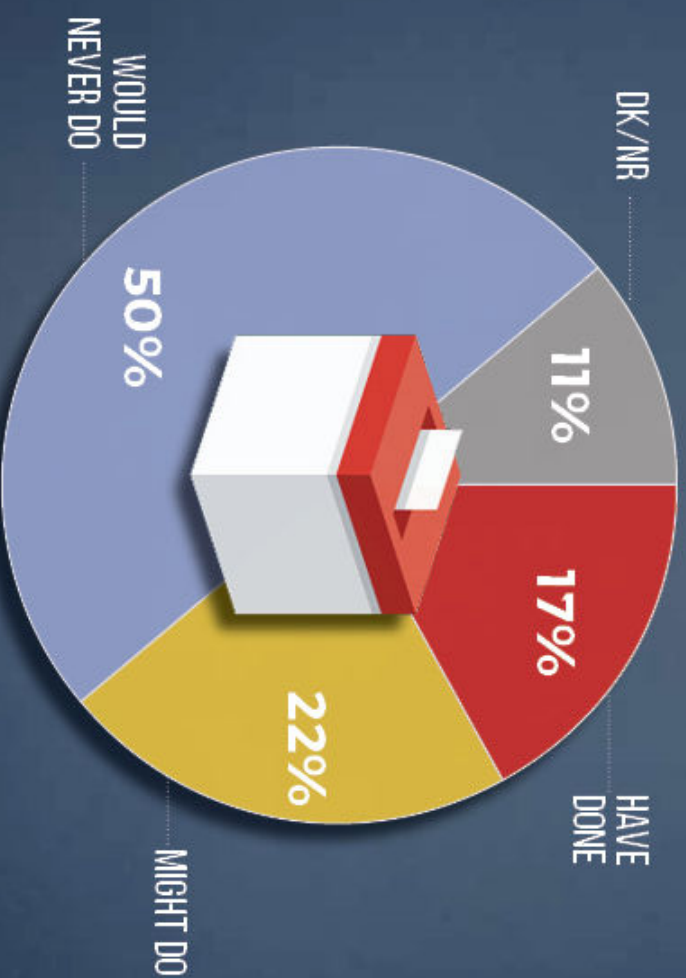

**NEARLY 1 IN 5 PAKISTANIS CLAIM TO HAVE ENCOURAGED OTHERS TO VOTE:
WORLD VALUES SURVEY AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN**

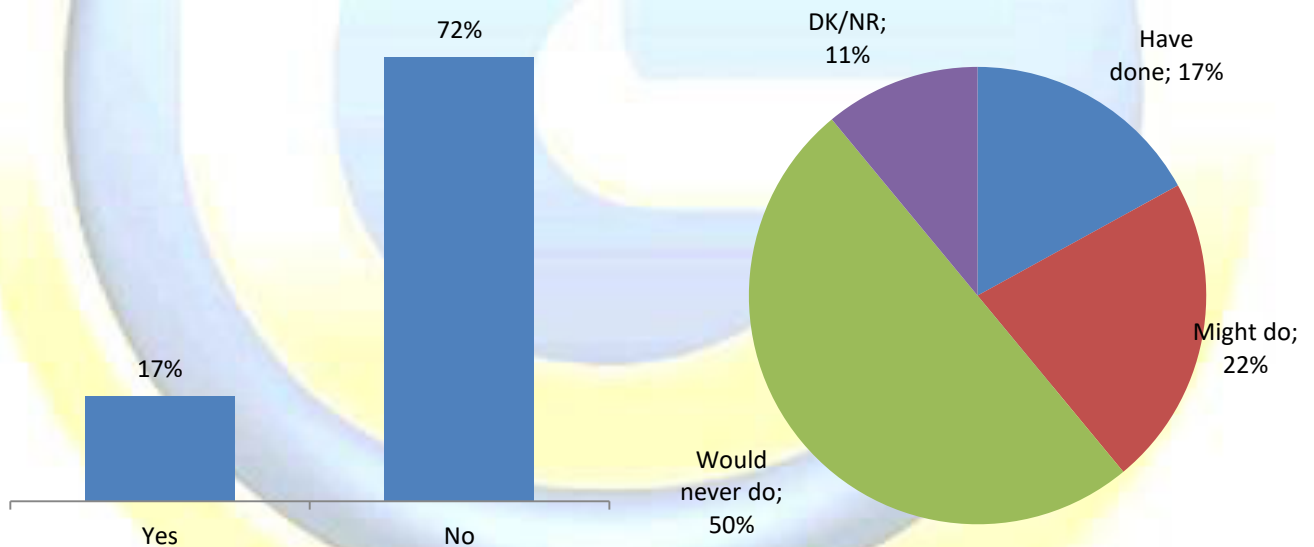
Nearly 1 in 5 Pakistanis claim to have encouraged others to vote: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), January 19, 2021

According to a World Values Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan in 2018, 17% Pakistanis claim to have encouraged others to vote; 50% said they would never encourage others to vote and 22% said that they might.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Have you actually encouraged others to vote, do you think you might or would never under any circumstances encourage others to vote?*” In response to this question, 17% said ‘have done’, 22% said ‘might do’, 50% said ‘would never do’. 11% did not know/did not respond.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
