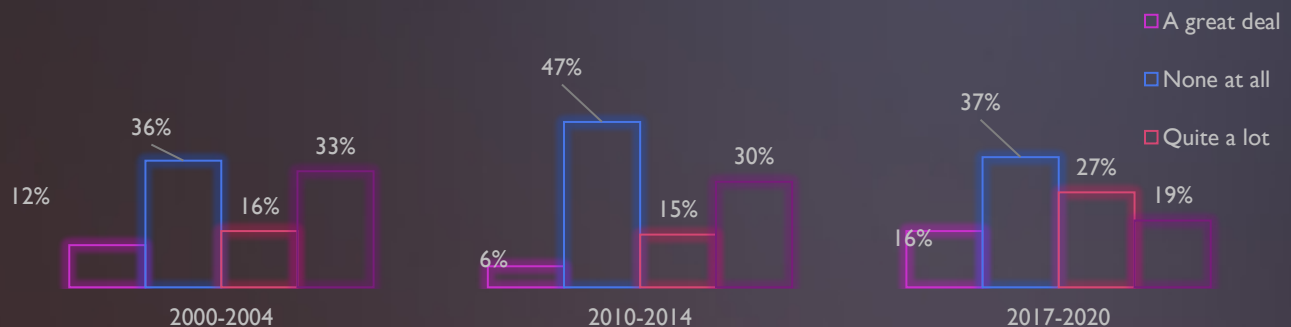

According to the World Values Survey conducted between the year 2000-2004, respondents were asked "Could you tell me how much confidence you have in the police: is it a great deal of confidence, quite a lot of confidence, not very much confidence or none at all?" In response 12% said 'a great deal', 16% said 'quite a lot', 33% said not very much, 36% said 'none at all' and 3% did not know/did not respond.

Comparative Picture: The question was asked again between 2017-2020 during Wave 7 of the World Values Survey to enable a comparison across the years. According to the 2018 results, 16% said 'a great deal', 27% said 'quite a lot', 19% said 'not very much' and 37% said 'none at all.'

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision making in Pakistan.
