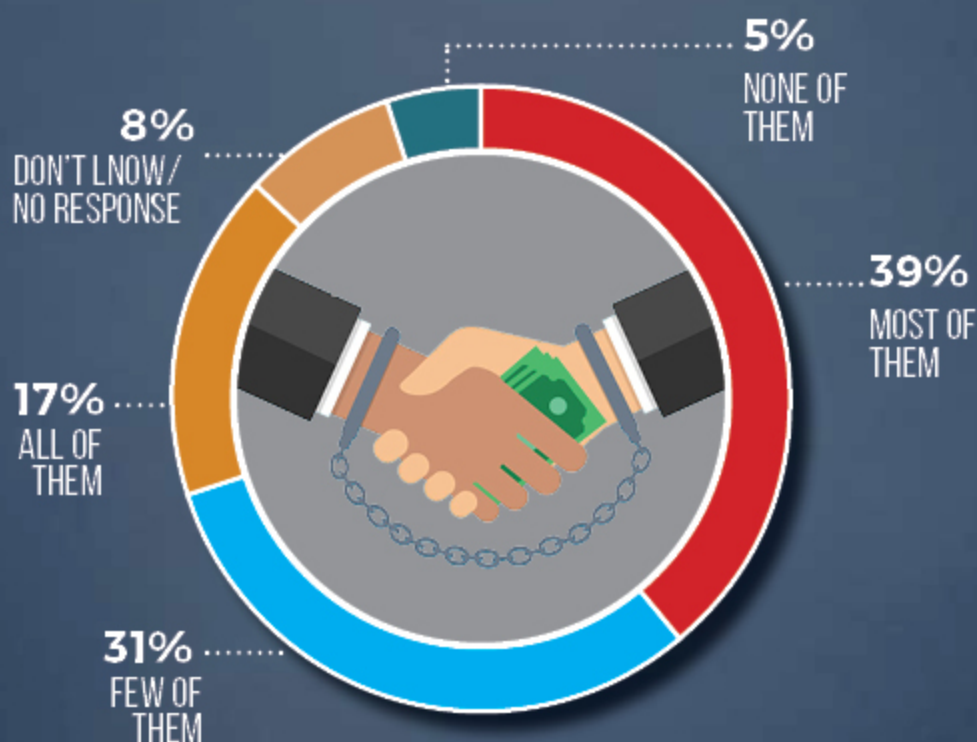

39% PAKISTANIS OPINE THAT MOST OF THE STATE AUTHORITIES ARE INVOLVED IN CORRUPTION: WORLD VALUES SURVEY AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

Among state authorities, how many do you believe are involved in corruption? Do you believe it is none of them, few of them, most of them or all of them?

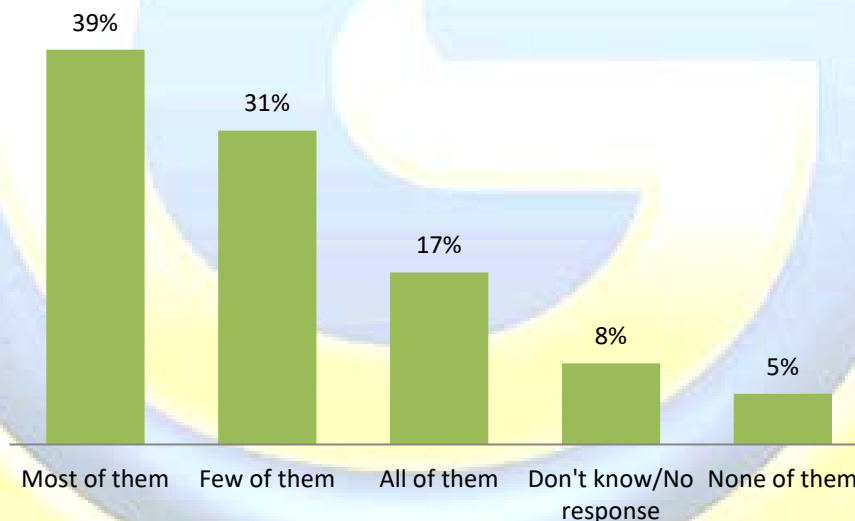
39 % Pakistanis opine that most of the state authorities are involved in corruption: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), January 25th, 2021

According to a World Values Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan in 2018, 39% Pakistanis are of the opinion that most of the state authorities are involved in corruption.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Among state authorities, how many do you believe are involved in corruption? Do you believe it is none of them, few of them, most of them or all of them?” In response to this question, 5% said ‘none of them’, 31% said ‘few of them’, 39% said ‘most of them’, 17% said ‘all of them’, while 8% did not know/did not respond.

People from Peru, Lebanon, Mexico most likely to say that state authorities are corrupt. People in New Zealand least likely; only 7.9% from New Zealand claim that all or most of the state authorities are involved in corruption.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of Pakistan, between 4th November and 11th December 2018. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
