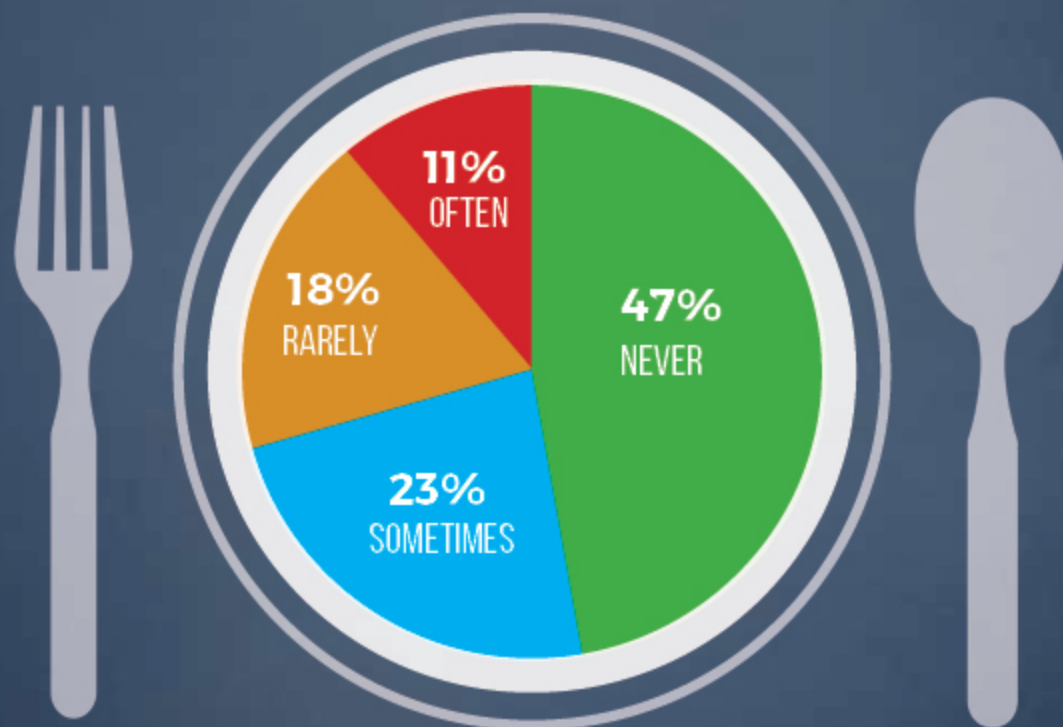

EVEN BEFORE COVID-19, 11% PAKISTANIS SAID THAT THEY OR THEIR FAMILIES HAVE OFTEN GONE WITHOUT ENOUGH FOOD TO EAT: WORLD VALUES SURVEY AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

Even before COVID-19, 11 % Pakistanis said that they or their families have often gone without enough food to eat: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

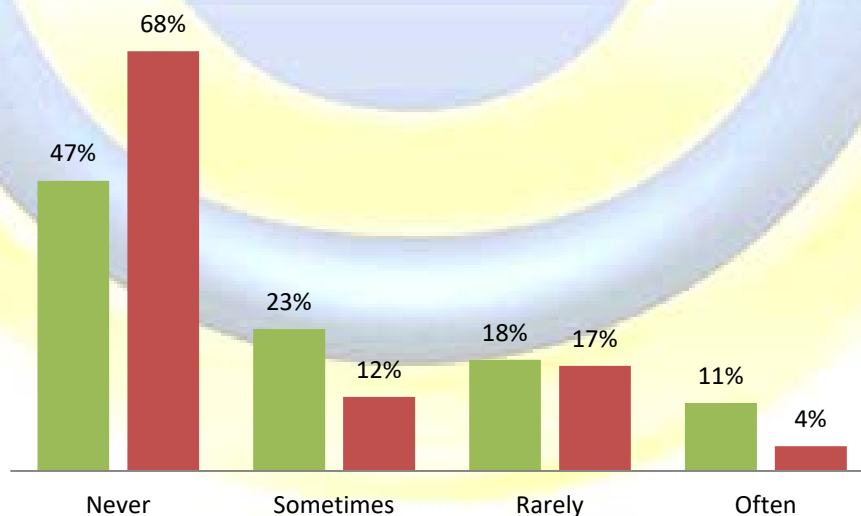
According to a World Values Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan in 2018, 11% Pakistanis claim than in the last 12 months, they or their families have often gone without enough food to eat.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*In the last 12 months, how often have you or your family gone without enough food to eat?*” In response to this question, 11% said ‘often’, 23% said ‘sometimes’, 18% said ‘rarely’, 47% said ‘never’ and 1% did not know/did not respond.

Global Comparison: Globally, 4% said that they have often gone without enough food to eat. Global figure is 7% lower than Pakistan’s.

When the same question was asked in around 70 other countries across the world with more than 70,000 respondents, 4% said ‘often’, 12% said ‘sometimes’, 17% said ‘rarely and 68% said ‘never’.

Top countries where most people say that they have never gone without food are Germany, South Korea, Andorra, China and New Zealand. Zimbabwe, Nigeria and Nicaragua have the lowest proportion of people who claim to have never gone without food. Pakistan is in the bottom 10 countries where people have never gone without food.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of Pakistan, between 4th November and 11th December 2018. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
