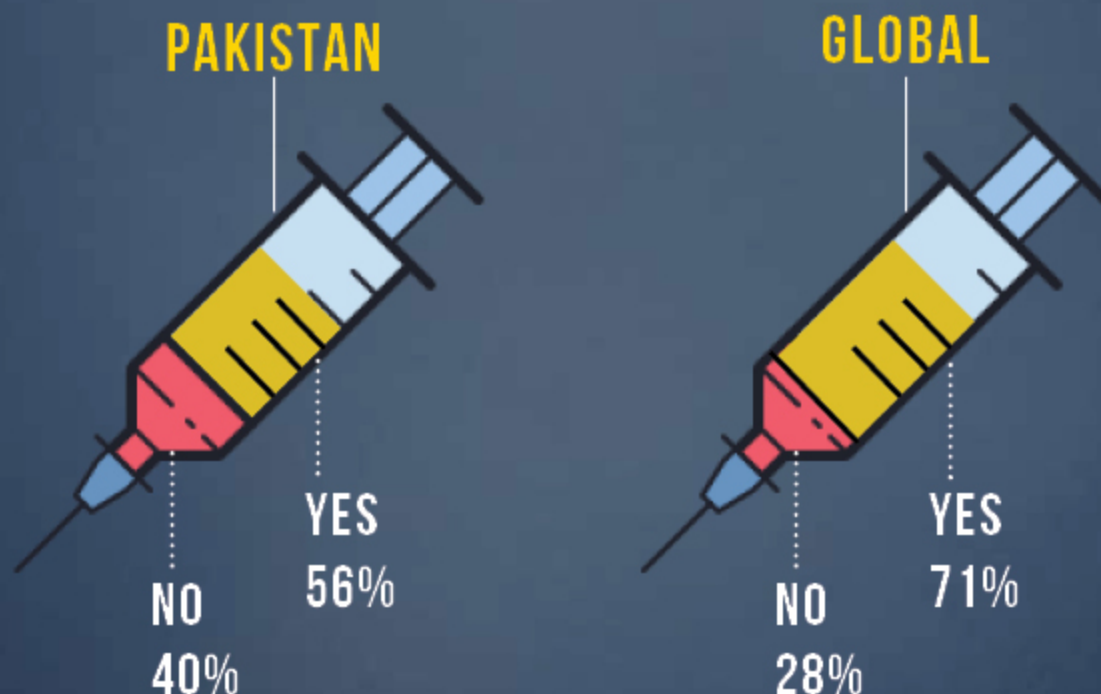

4 IN 10 PAKISTANIS NON-COMMITTAL WITH RESPECT TO COVID-19 VACCINE. COMPARED TO THE GLOBAL FIGURE, 20% MORE PAKISTANIS SAID THAT THEY WILL DEFINITELY NOT GET VACCINATED WHEN A VACCINE FOR THE CORONAVIRUS WILL BECOME AVAILABLE; RESISTANCE TO VACCINATE SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER THAN INDIA: GALLUP PAKISTAN AND WIN WORLD SURVEY.

4 in 10 Pakistanis non-committal with respect to COVID-19 Vaccine. Compared to the global figure, 20% more Pakistanis said that they will definitely not get vaccinated when a vaccine for the coronavirus will become available; resistance to vaccinate significantly higher than India: Gallup Pakistan and WIN World Survey

According to a Gallup Pakistan Survey in Pakistan (and similar surveys done by Worldwide Independent Network of Market Research (WIN) across the world), nearly 41% Pakistanis say they are either unlikely or very unlikely to get COVID-19 vaccination if it was offered to them.

34% Pakistanis said that when a vaccine for COVID-19 becomes available, they will definitely get vaccinated, 22% said that they will probably get vaccinated.

These findings emerge from an international survey conducted across the globe by The Worldwide Independent Network of Market Research (WIN): a global network conducting market research and opinion polls in every continent. WIN has published the annual WIN World Survey (WWS - 2020) exploring the views and beliefs of 26,759 individuals among citizens from 32 countries across the globe about the pandemic. The survey analyzes views and opinions related to the vaccine, the way governments handled the health crisis, the capacity of the national health systems and the likelihood of travelling in 2021.

COVID-19 Vaccination: 34 % Pakistanis say that when a vaccine for the coronavirus becomes available, they will definitely get vaccinated (as compared to 35 % globally) while 32 % Pakistanis say that they will definitely not get vaccinated (as compared to 12 % globally)

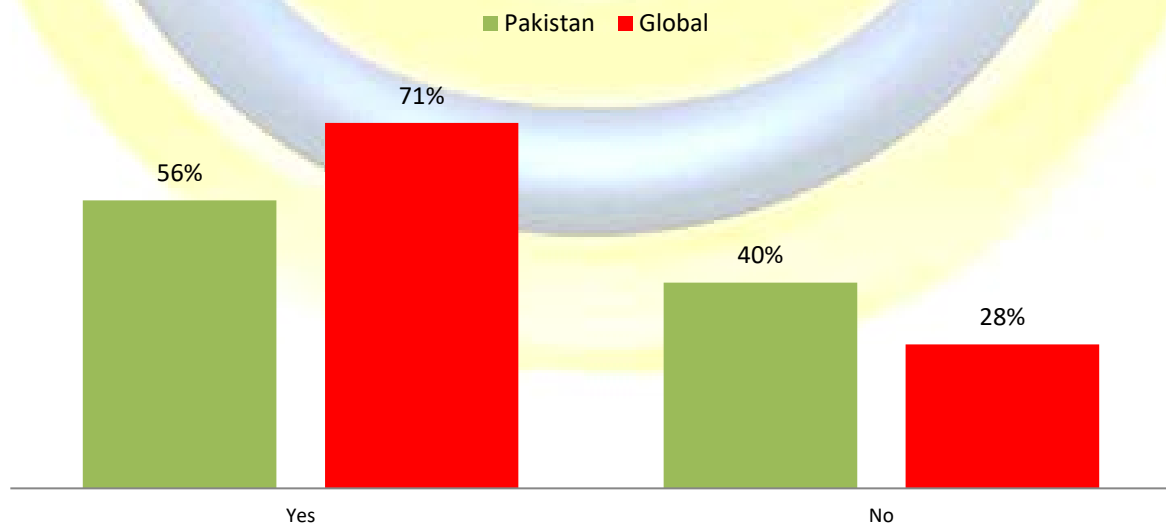
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*When a vaccine for the coronavirus will become available, will you get vaccinated?*” In response to this question, 34% said that they will definitely get vaccinated, 22% said that they will probably get vaccinated, 9% said that they probably will not get vaccinated while 32% Pakistanis said that they definitely will not get vaccinated.

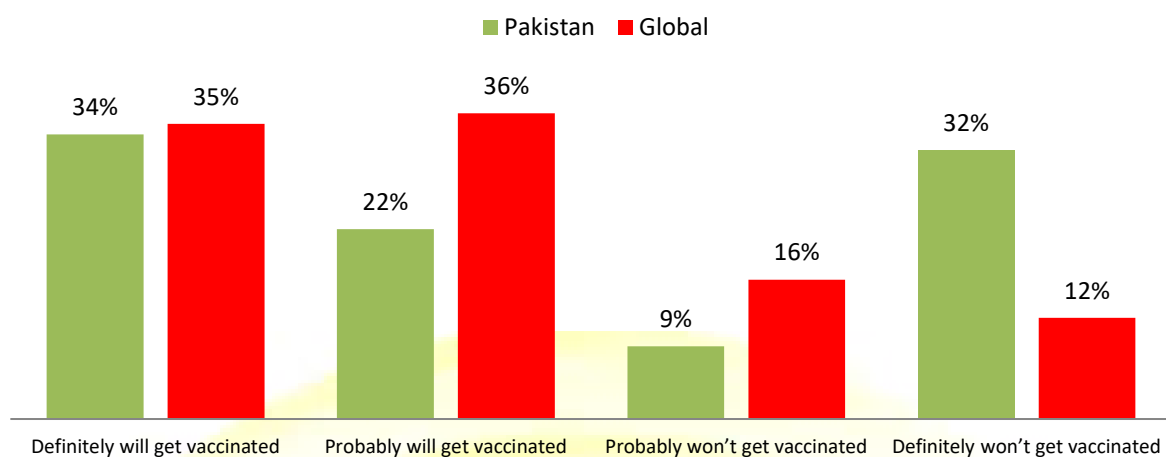
Global result: Compared to the global figure, 20% more Pakistanis said that they will definitely not get vaccinated when a vaccine for the coronavirus will become available.

Globally (when the same question was asked in another 31 countries), 35% said that they will definitely get vaccinated, 36% said that they will probably get vaccinated, 16% said that they probably will not get vaccinated while 12% globally said that they definitely will not get vaccinated. Compared to the global figure, 20% more Pakistanis said that they will definitely not get vaccinated when a vaccine for the coronavirus will become available.

Bilal I Gilani , Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan adds ‘*When positive options are clubbed (those saying definitely and probably get vaccinated), Pakistan’s score is 56% (34%+22% = 56%) as compared to global 71% (35%+36%= 71%). In other words, Pakistanis are less upbeat about COVID-19 vaccine by 20% points which is a very significant departure from the global feeling and emotions about the COVID-19 vaccine. What makes Pakistanis less enthusiastic about COVID-19 vaccine is a crucial subject for analysis and further studies.*’

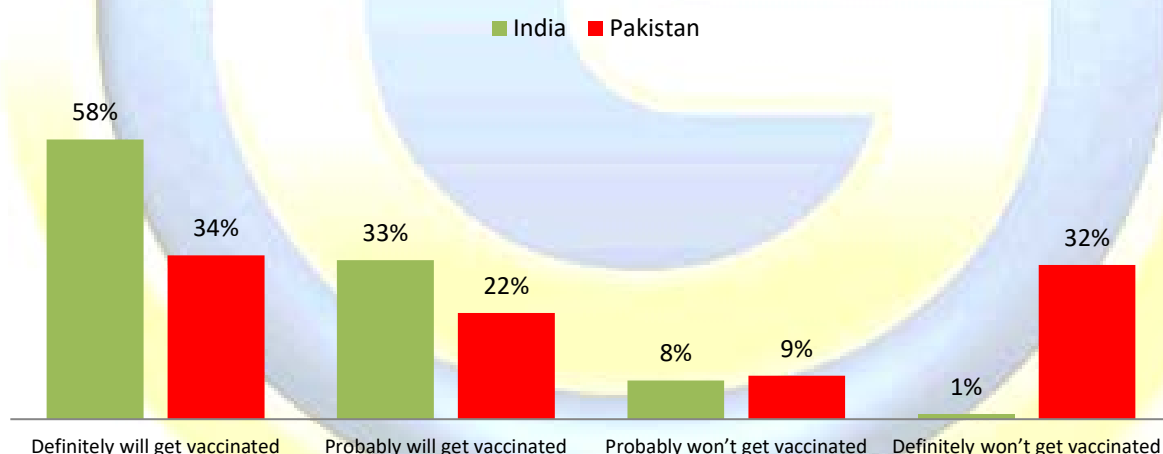

Regional comparative results: Only 9% in India say they will not get vaccinated as compared to Pakistan's 40%!

The survey was also conducted in India as part of the international study. Responding to the same question, in India, 58% said they will definitely get vaccinated, 33% said that they will probably get vaccinated, 8% said that they probably will not get vaccinated while 1% said that they definitely will not get vaccinated. This is in stark contrast with Pakistan where an astounding 32% have said that they definitely will not get vaccinated.

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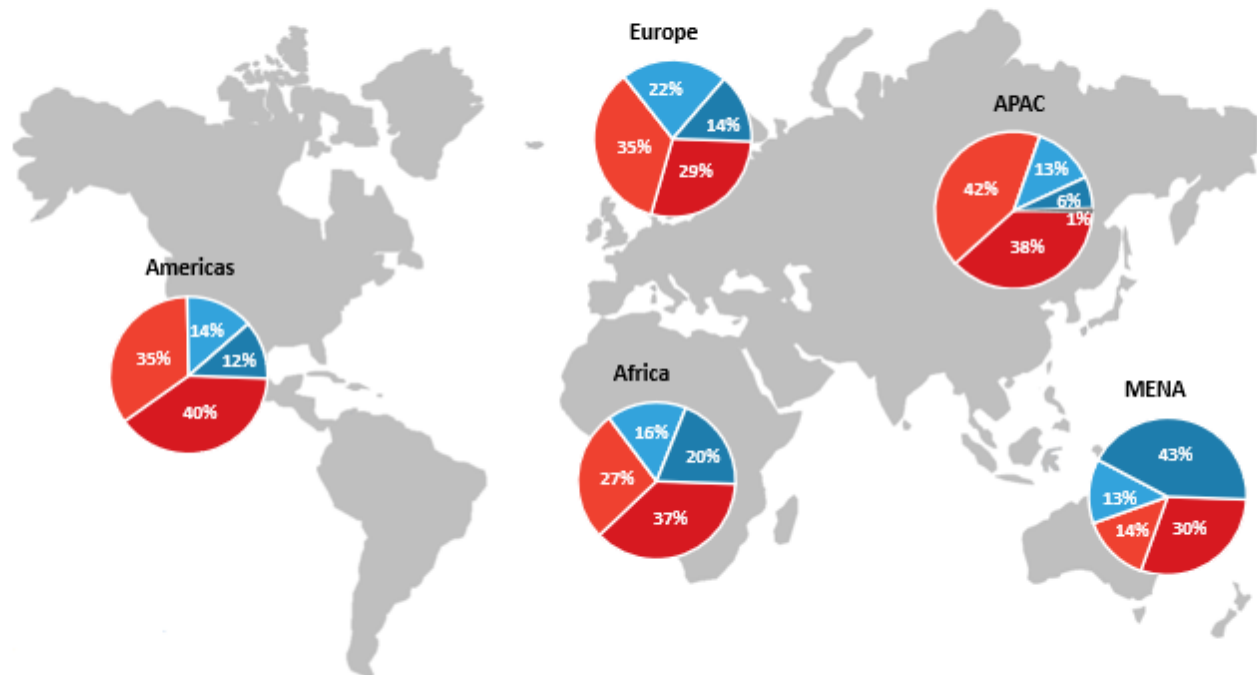
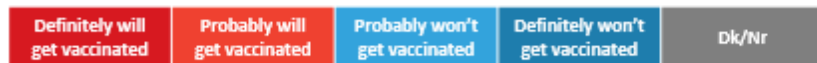
Further Regional Analysis: Commitment to vaccinate was found to be highest in Vietnam. Pakistan reports 24% less commitment towards vaccination as compared to the average in Asia Pacific region (80%)

The survey work was conducted across 31 other countries that belonged to all regions of the world. It was seen that commitment towards getting vaccinated was highest in Vietnam (98%) and lowest in Serbia (38%).

Pakistan lies in APAC region and as compared to rest of APAC regions our commitment (56%) was found to be less than the rest of the countries by 24%.

Pakistan ranks 19th among 32 countries surveyed with respect to commitment to get vaccinated for COVID-19

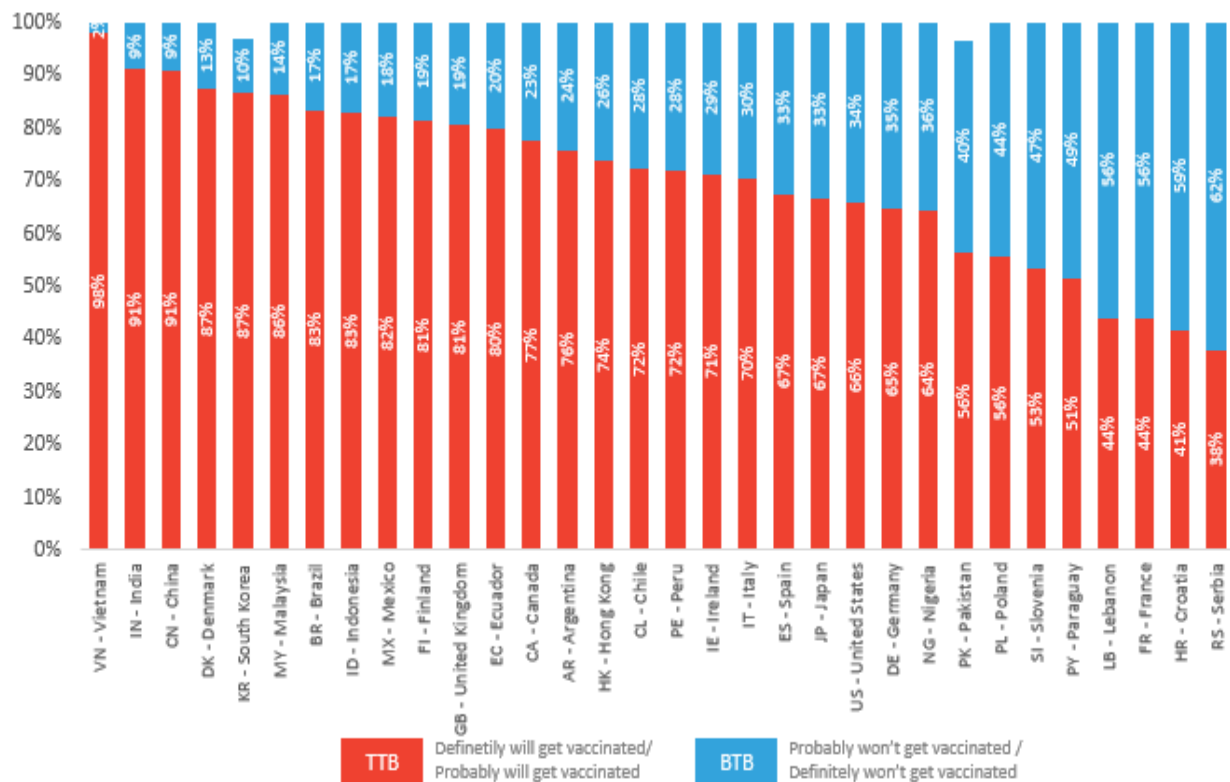
Among all the 32 countries surveyed in this international study, people in Vietnam showed the highest commitment to getting vaccinated where 98% said that they will get vaccinated. At the bottom was Serbia where only 33% respondents said they will get vaccinated.

Pakistan ranks 7th out of 32 nations where resistance to COVID-19 Vaccination was highest

Conversely Pakistan ranked 19th out of 32 countries surveyed in terms of commitment to get vaccinated.
