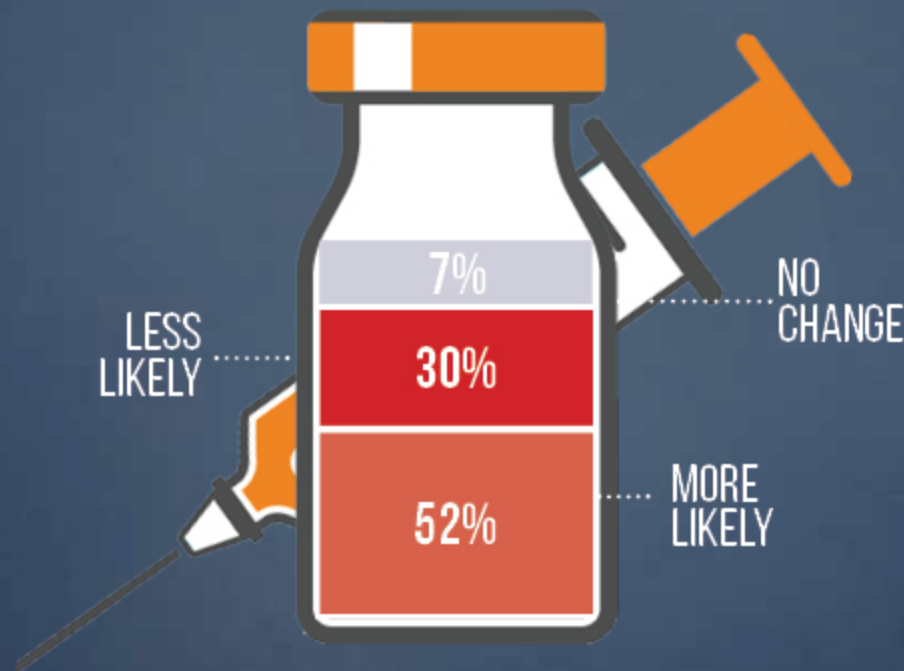

1 IN 3 PAKISTANIS BELIEVE THAT THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC HAS MADE PEOPLE LESS LIKELY TO TAKE OTHER VACCINES: GALLUP INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

1 in 3 Pakistanis believe that the COVID-19 pandemic has made people less likely to take other vaccines: Gallup International Association and Gallup Pakistan

(Islamabad), February 15, 2021

According to a Gallup Pakistan Survey in Pakistan (and similar surveys done by Gallup International Association across the world), 26% Pakistanis say the pandemic has made Pakistanis a lot more likely to vaccinate in general; 26% said it has made other Pakistanis somewhat more likely to vaccinate, 21% said a lot less likely and 9% said somewhat less likely. 7% think that there has been no change in people's views to vaccinate.

These findings emerge from an international survey conducted across the globe by Gallup International Association at the end of 2020. The survey covers 47 countries around the world and about **45,000 adult citizens**, which represents about 2/3 of the global population. During the whole of 2020 Gallup International Association followed the development of the global attitudes of the population towards the pandemic. The results, presented below, come from the fourth wave of global tracking. The fieldwork for Pakistan was conducted by Gallup Pakistan between **9th October and 2nd November 2020**.



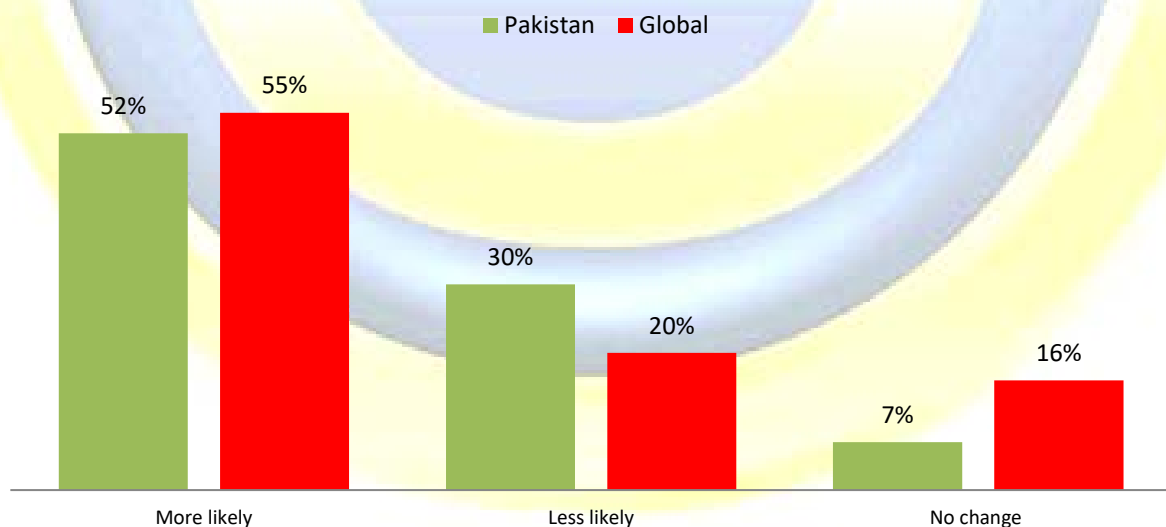
General Vaccination: 52 % Pakistanis say that the COVID-19 pandemic has made other Pakistanis more likely to vaccinate themselves in general.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “In your opinion, what do people in your country think about this? Would you say the global Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has made them more likely to be vaccinated, less likely, or has there been no change?” In response to this question, 26% Pakistanis said ‘a lot more likely’, 26% said ‘somewhat more likely’, 9% said ‘a lot less likely’, 21% said ‘somewhat less likely’, 7% said ‘there has been no change in peoples’ views to the vaccines’ while 12% did not know/did not respond.

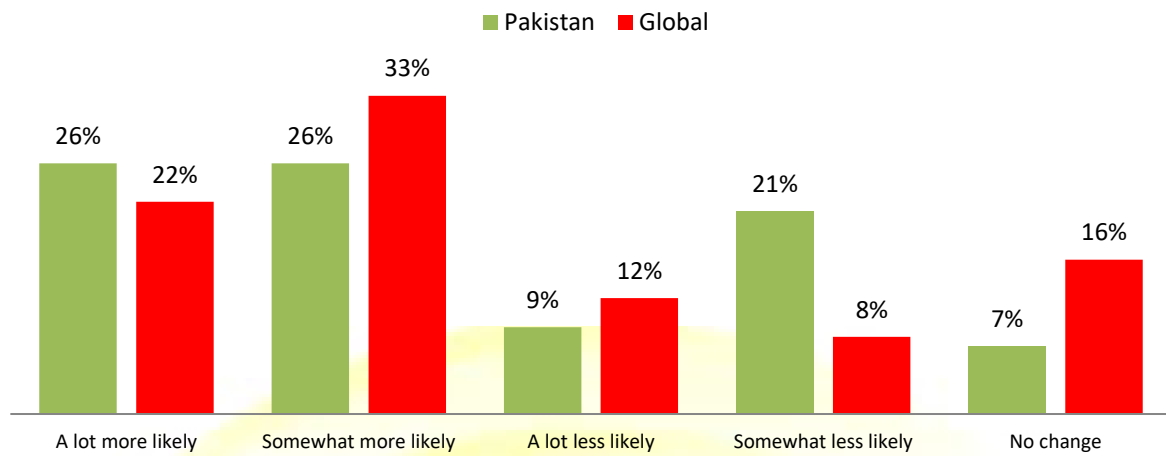
Global result: 1 in 5 globally believe that the COVID-19 pandemic has made people in their country more likely to vaccinate themselves generally.

Globally (when the same question was asked in another 46 countries), 22% said ‘a lot more likely’, 33% said ‘somewhat more likely’, 12% said ‘somewhat less likely,’ 8% said ‘a lot less likely’ 16% said ‘there has been no change in peoples’ views to the vaccinating while 9% did not know/did not respond. Clubbing the positive responses, we note that 55% globally believe that the pandemic has made people in their country more likely to vaccinate themselves. There is not much difference between Pakistan and the global figure in terms of this.

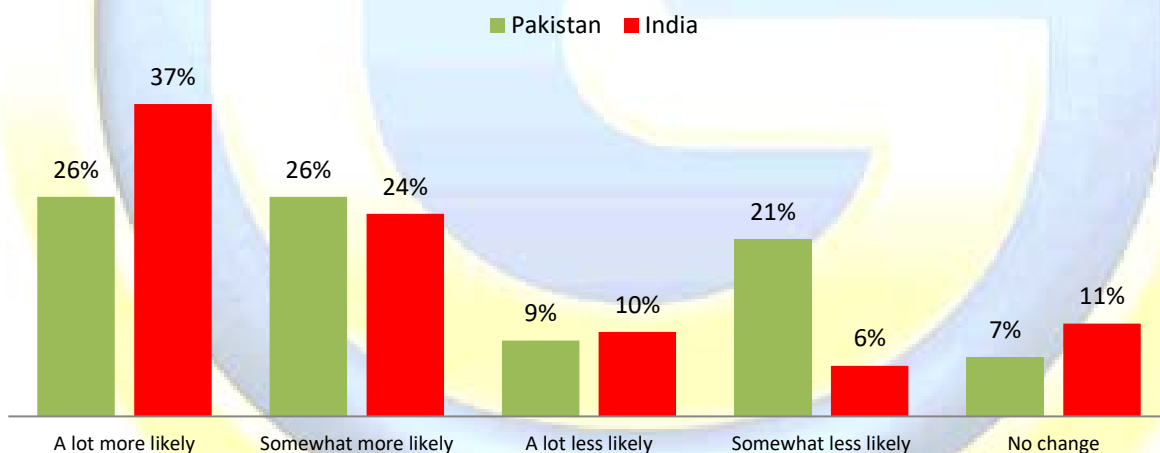

Regional comparative results: People in India 9% more likely to say that the COVID-19 pandemic has made people in their country more likely to vaccinate themselves in general.

The survey was also conducted in India as part of the international study. Responding to the same question, in India, 61% said that the COVID-19 pandemic has made others in their country more likely to vaccinate themselves in general. This is higher than Pakistan where 52% have said that people in Pakistan are now more likely to vaccinate themselves.

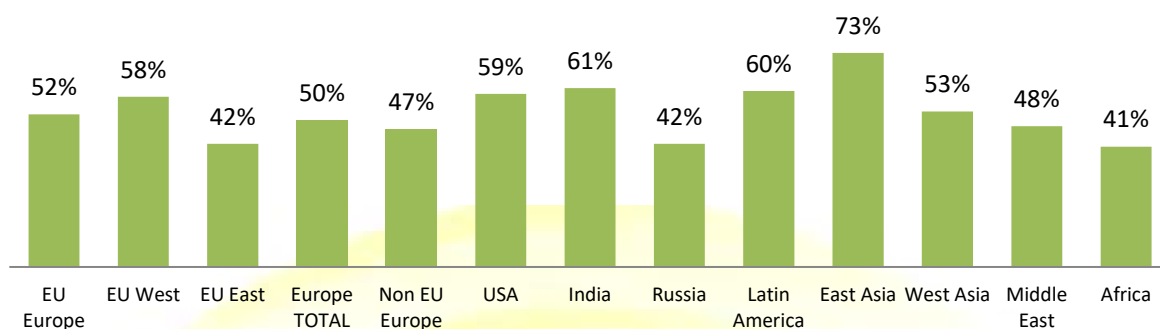

Regional comparative results: 52 % Pakistanis think that people in their country are more likely to vaccinate in general now; this is nearly the same as the West Asia region average of 53 %

The highest percentage was in East Asia (73%), followed by India (61%) and Latin America (60%). 59% in USA and 50% in Europe opine that COVID-19 has made people in their country more likely to vaccinate in general.

COVID-19 has made people in my country are more likely to vaccinate in general



Vietnam ranks 1 among 47 countries surveyed in terms of the COVID-19 pandemic increasing peoples' likelihood to vaccinate in general

Among all the 47 countries surveyed in this international study, people in Vietnam were most likely to say that the COVID-19 pandemic has increased likelihood of people in their country to get vaccinated in general.

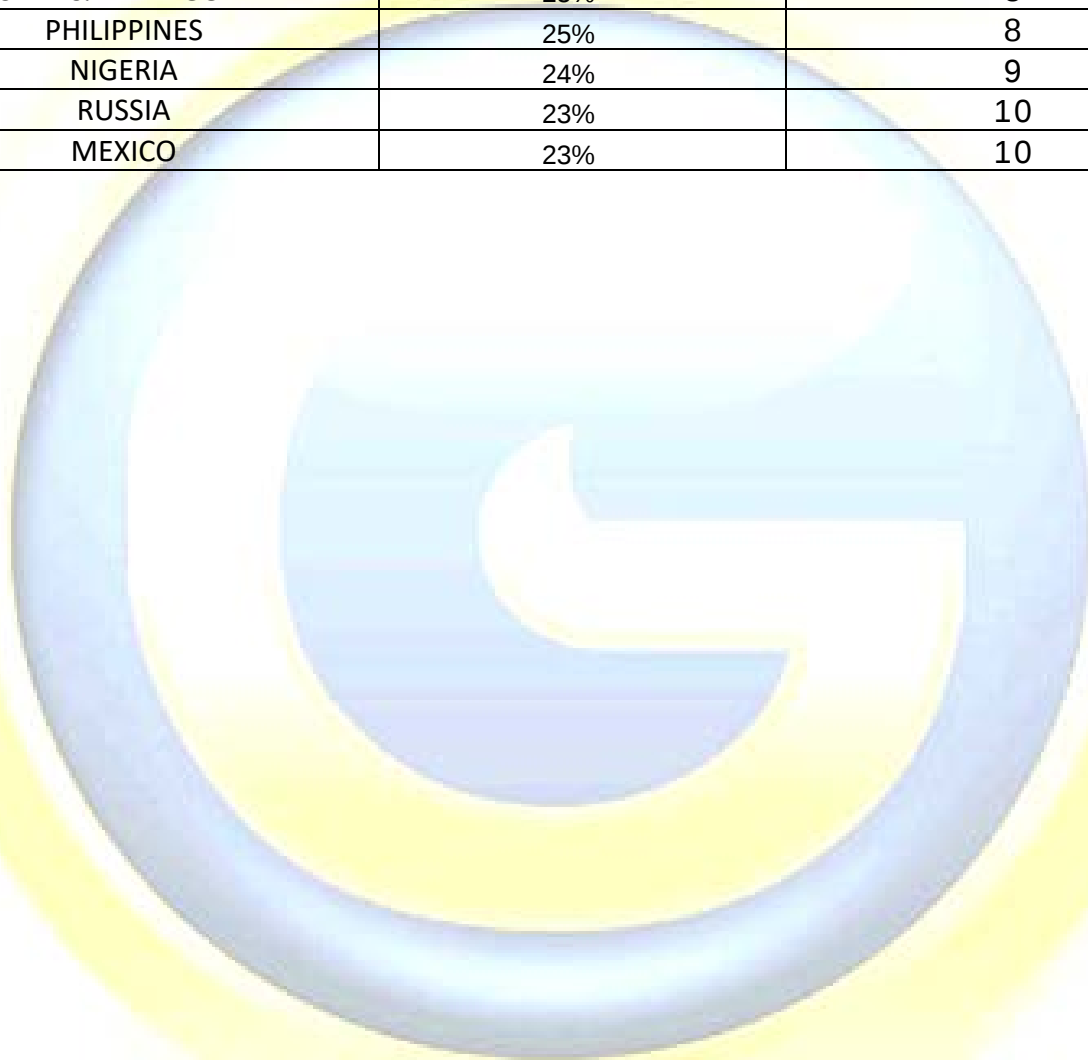
