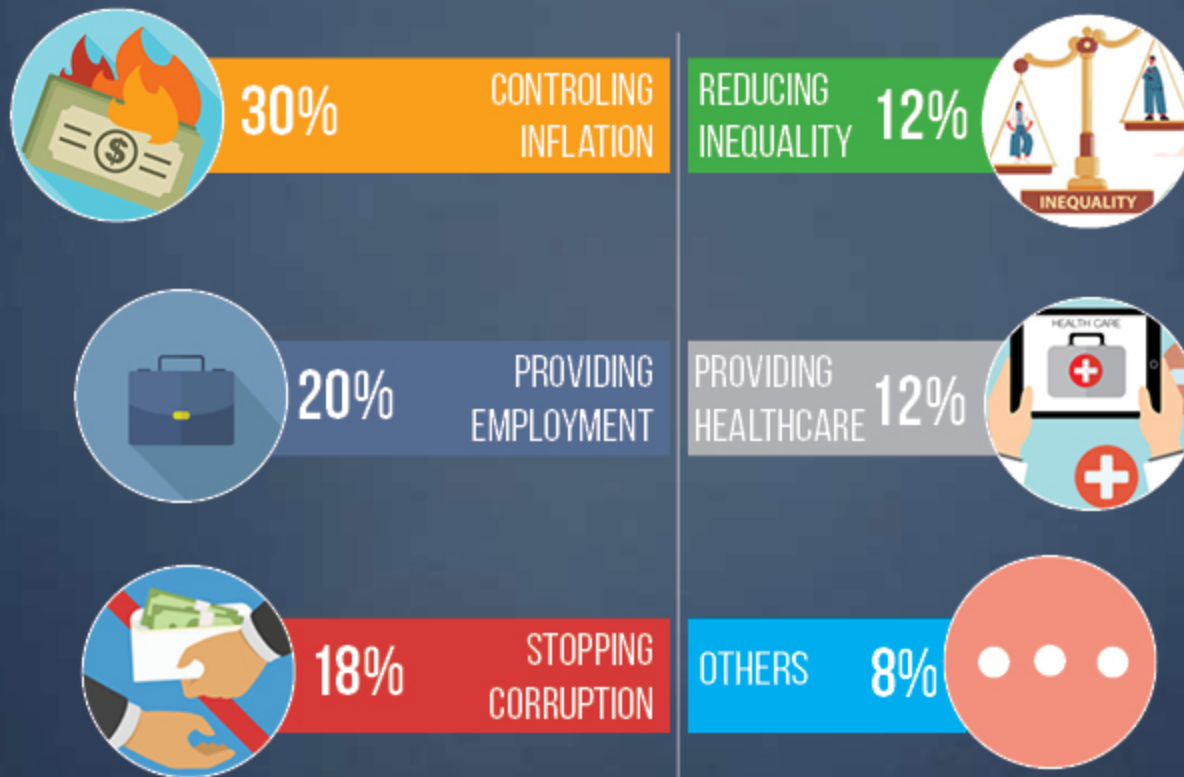

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PTI government's top priority: More than 6 in 10 Pakistanis say that controlling inflation, unemployment redressal and healthcare provision should be the top priority areas for the PTI government to focus on: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

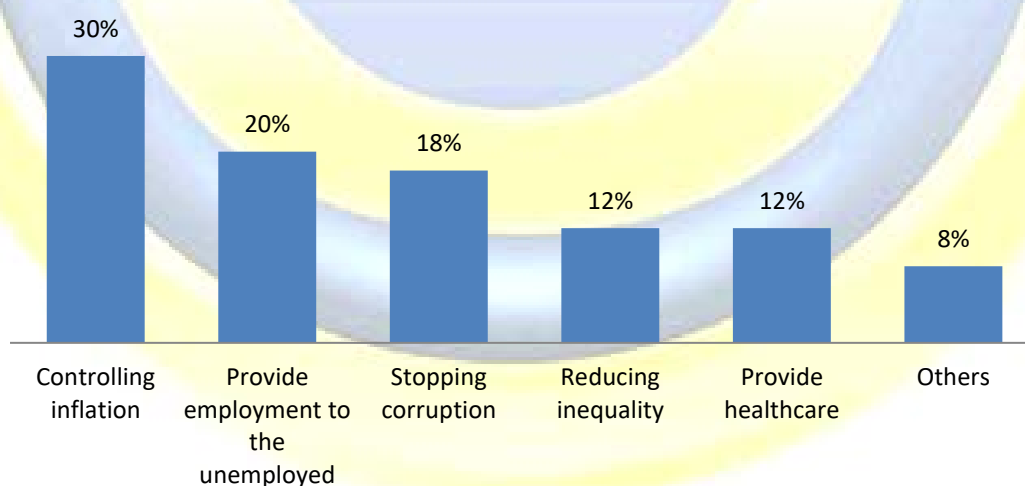
(Islamabad), February 25, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 30% Pakistanis think that the first priority of the federal government should be to control inflation, 20% think it should be to provide employment and 12% think that the top priority should be health care provision.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, "In your opinion, what problem do you think the federal government should solve first?" In response to this question, 30% said 'Controlling inflation', 20% said 'Provide employment to the unemployed', 18% said 'Stopping corruption', 12% said 'Reducing inequality', 12% said 'Providing healthcare', and 8% mentioned other problems.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,080 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 24, 2020 – January 15, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was phone interviews. Respondents hailed from over 100 districts of Pakistan.
