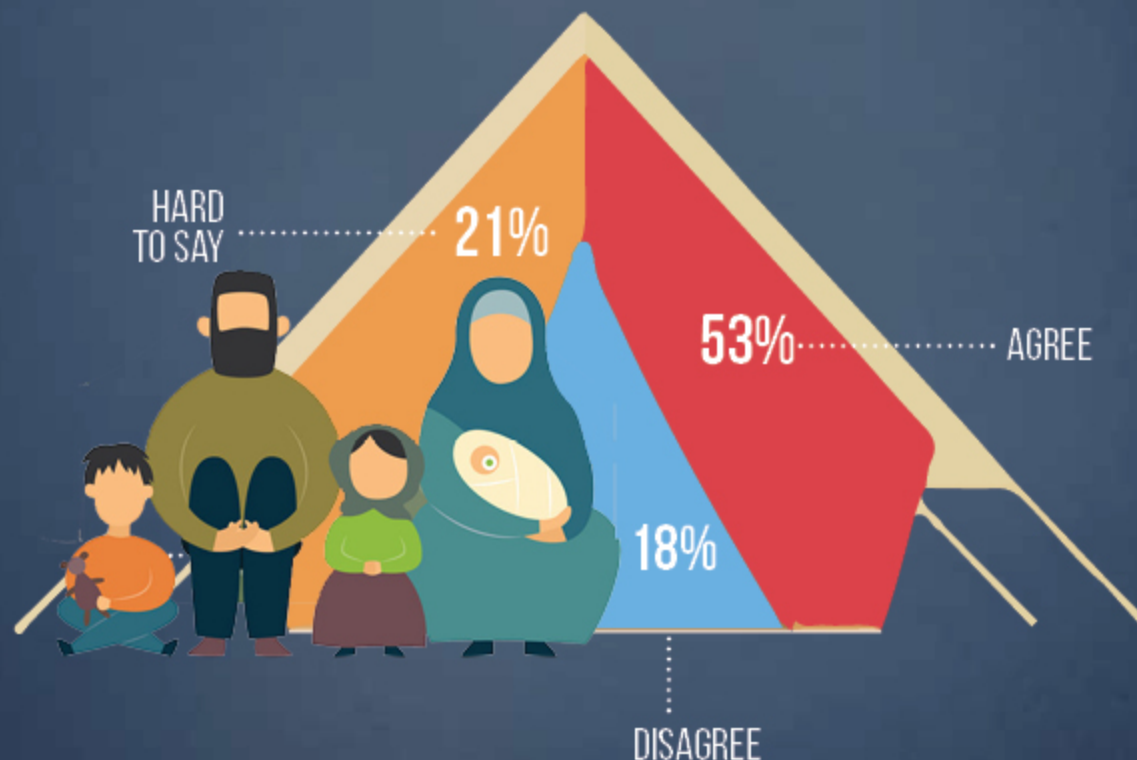

NEARLY HALF PAKISTANIS (53%), HIGHER THAN THE GLOBAL AVERAGE, BELIEVE THAT IMMIGRANTS INCREASE THE RISK OF TERRORISM: WORLD VALUES SURVEY AND GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

Nearly half Pakistanis (53 %), higher than the global average, believe that immigrants increase the risk of terrorism: World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

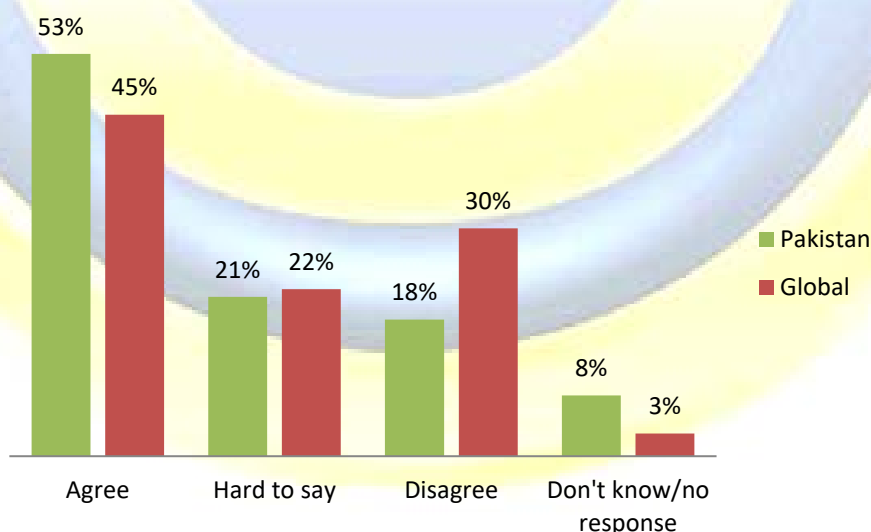
According to a World Values Survey conducted in 2018 by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 53% Pakistanis are of the opinion that immigrants increase the risk of terrorism.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“From your point of view, what have been the effects of immigrants on the development of your country? Do they increase the risk of terrorism?”* In response to this question, 18% disagreed, 21% said ‘hard to say’, 53% agreed while 8% did not know/did not respond.

Global Comparison: Pakistan ranks higher than the global average in terms of believing that immigrants increase the risk of terrorism

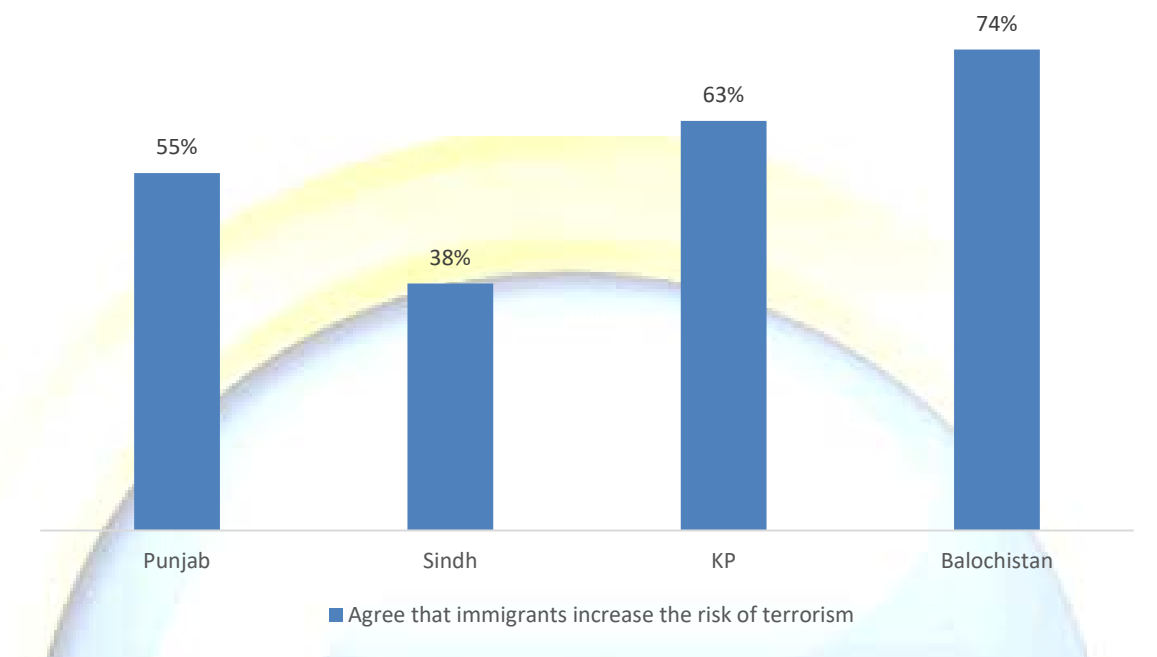
When the same question was asked in around 70 other countries across the world with more than 70,000 respondents, 45% agreed, 30% disagreed, 22% said ‘hard to say’ while 3% did not know/did not respond.

Provincial Breakdown: Respondents from Balochistan (74%) followed by Sindh (63%) most likely to agree that immigrants increase the risk of terrorism.



The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of Pakistan, between 4th November and 11th December 2018. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
