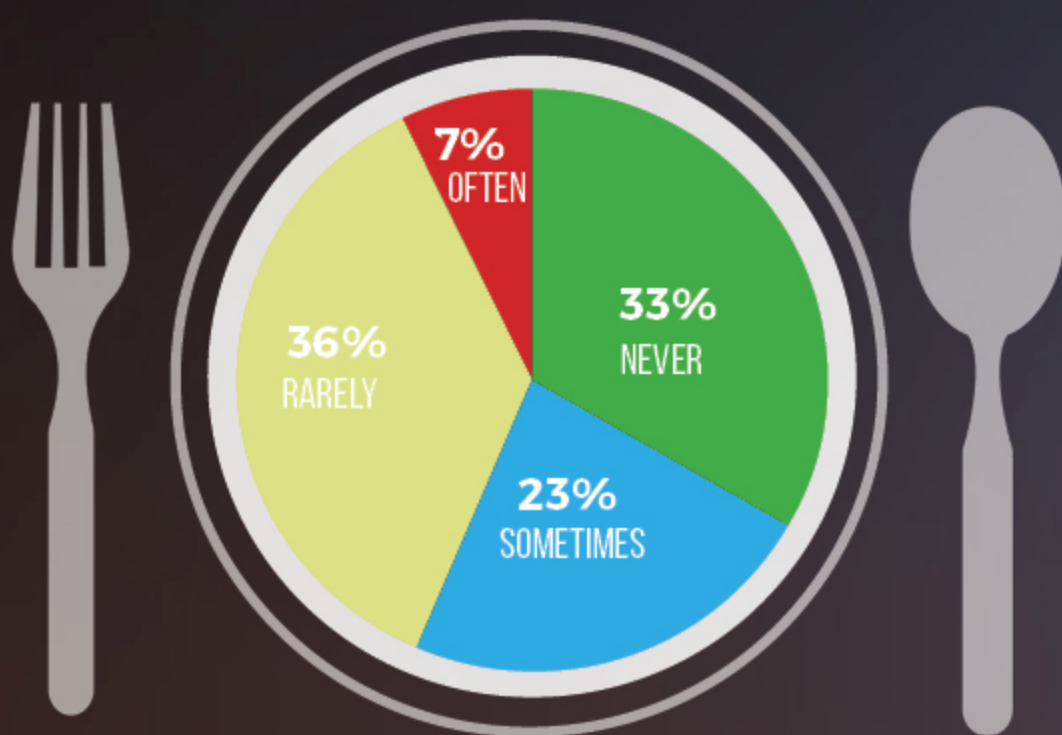


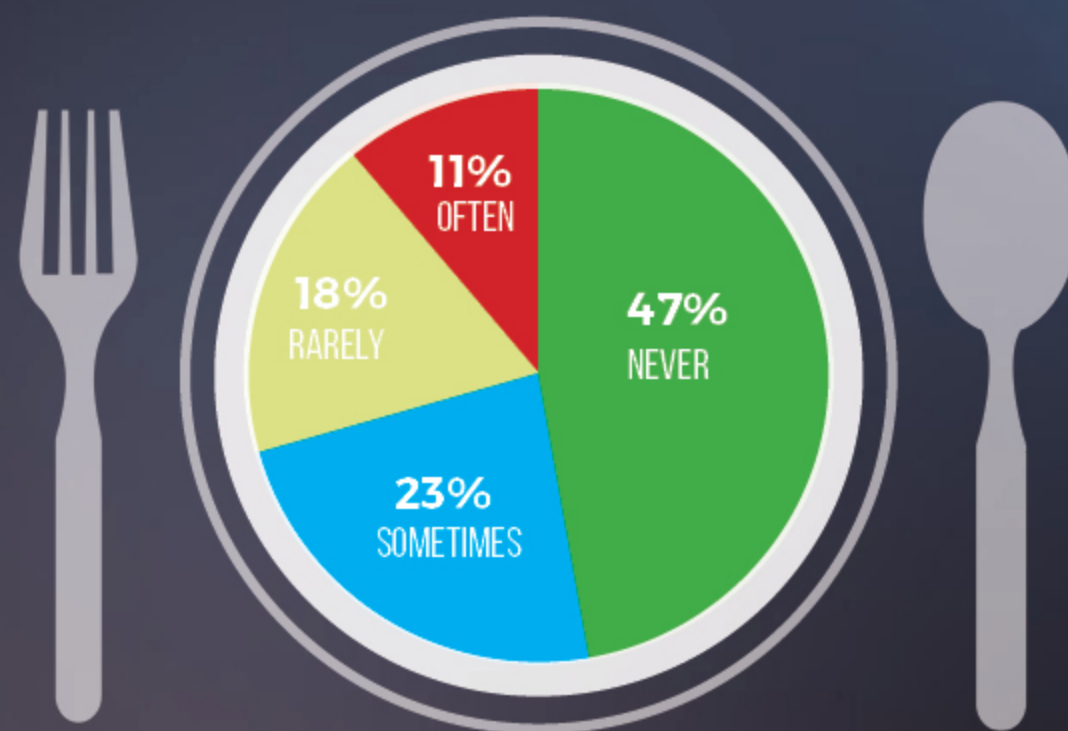

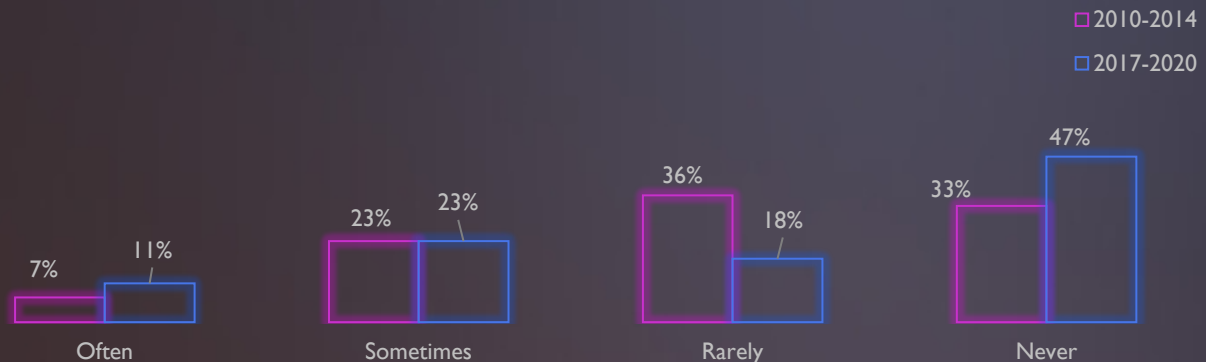

According to the World Values Survey conducted between the year 2010-2014, respondents were asked “In the last 12 months, how often have you or your family gone without enough food to eat?” In response 7% said ‘often’, 23% said ‘sometimes’, 36% said ‘rarely’, 33% said ‘never’ and 1% did not know/did not respond.

Comparative Picture: The question was asked again between 2017-2020 during Wave 7 of the World Values Survey to enable a comparison across the years. According to the 2020 results, 11% said ‘often’, 23% said ‘sometimes’, 18% said ‘rarely’, 47% said ‘never’ and 1% did not know/did not respond.

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision making in Pakistan.
