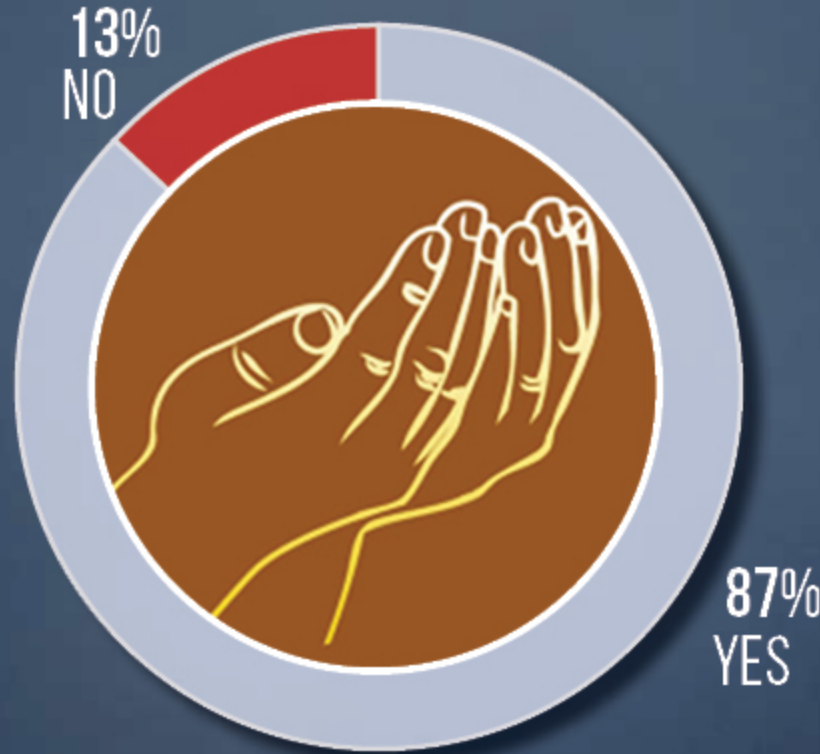

**Nearly 9 in 10 Pakistanis claim that they read Safar ki dua while traveling:
Gallup & Gilani Pakistan**

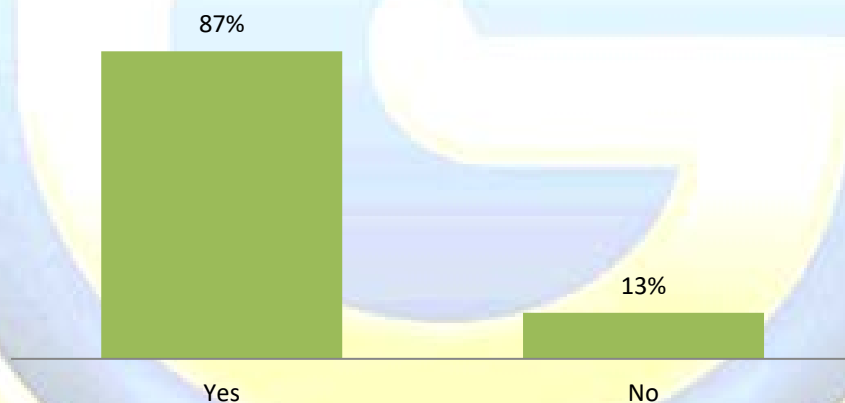
(Islamabad), March 11, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 87% Pakistanis claim to read Safar ki dua while traveling.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you read ‘Safar ki dua’ while traveling?” In response to this question, 87% said ‘Yes’ while 13% said ‘No’.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,080 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 6, 2021 – February 27, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was phone interviews. Respondents hailed from over 100 districts of Pakistan.
