38% PAKISTANIS SAY THAT THE COUNTRY IS GOING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

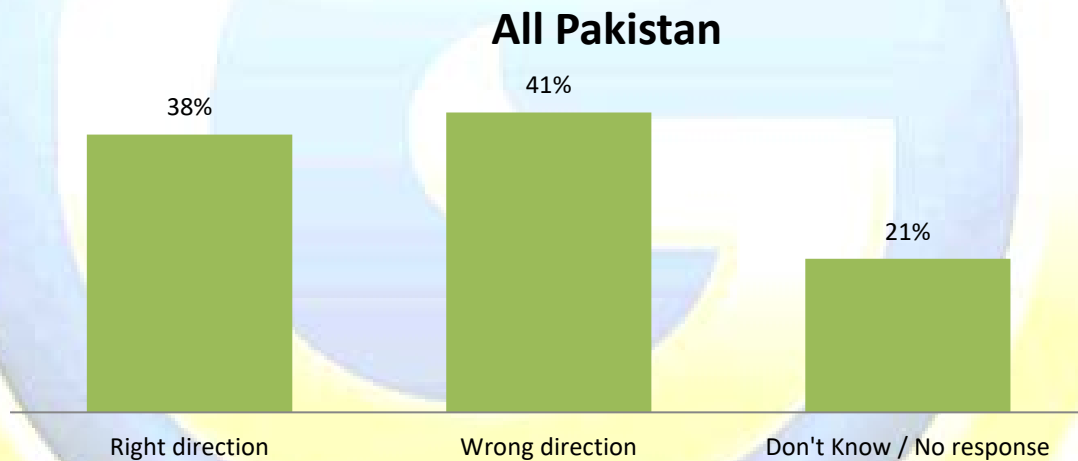
38 % Pakistanis say that the country is going in the right direction: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), April 20, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 41% Pakistanis believe the country is going in the wrong direction.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Do you think our country is going in the right direction?*” In response to this question, 38% said that the country is going in the right direction, while 41% said that the country is going in the wrong direction, another 21% said that they do not know or did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,590 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 19, 2021 – April 6, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was phone interviews. Respondents hailed from over 100 districts of Pakistan.
