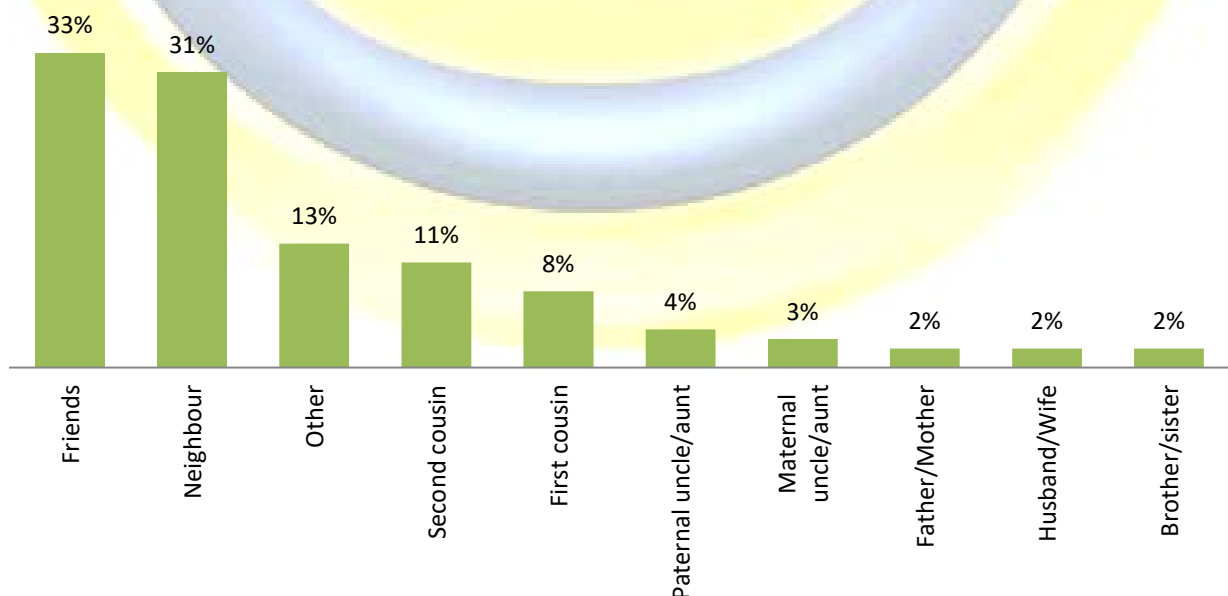
According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, out of those who said that they knew someone who passed away due to coronavirus, 33% said it was their friends and 31% said neighbors.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “In your social circle, do you know anyone who has lost his/her life due to the Corona Virus?” In response to this question, 12% said ‘Yes’, 88% said ‘No’ while 1% did not know/did not respond. The 12% who said ‘yes’ were asked: “How are you related to the individual in your social circle who lost his/her life due to the Corona Virus?” 2% said ‘Father/Mother’, 2% said ‘Husband/Wife’ 2% said ‘brother/sister’, 8% said ‘first cousin’, 11% said ‘second cousin’, 4% said ‘paternal uncle/aunt’, 3% said ‘maternal uncle/aunt’, 31% said ‘neighbor’, 33% said ‘friends’, while 13% gave other responses.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,590 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 19, 2021 – April 6, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was phone interviews. Respondents hailed from over 100 districts of Pakistan.
