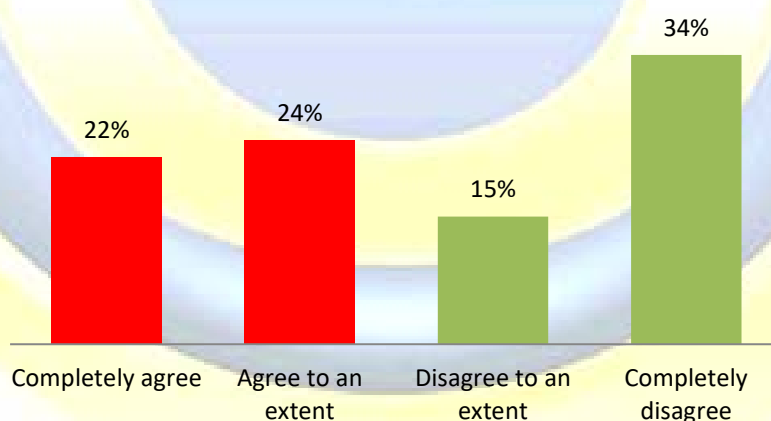
According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 46% Pakistanis are scared that they or their family members will contract the virus.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Please state the extent to which you agree or disagree with the given statement? I am scared of me or my family members contracting the virus” In response to this question, 22% completely agreed, 24% agreed to an extent, 15% disagreed to an extent while 34% completely disagreed. 5% did not know or did not respond.

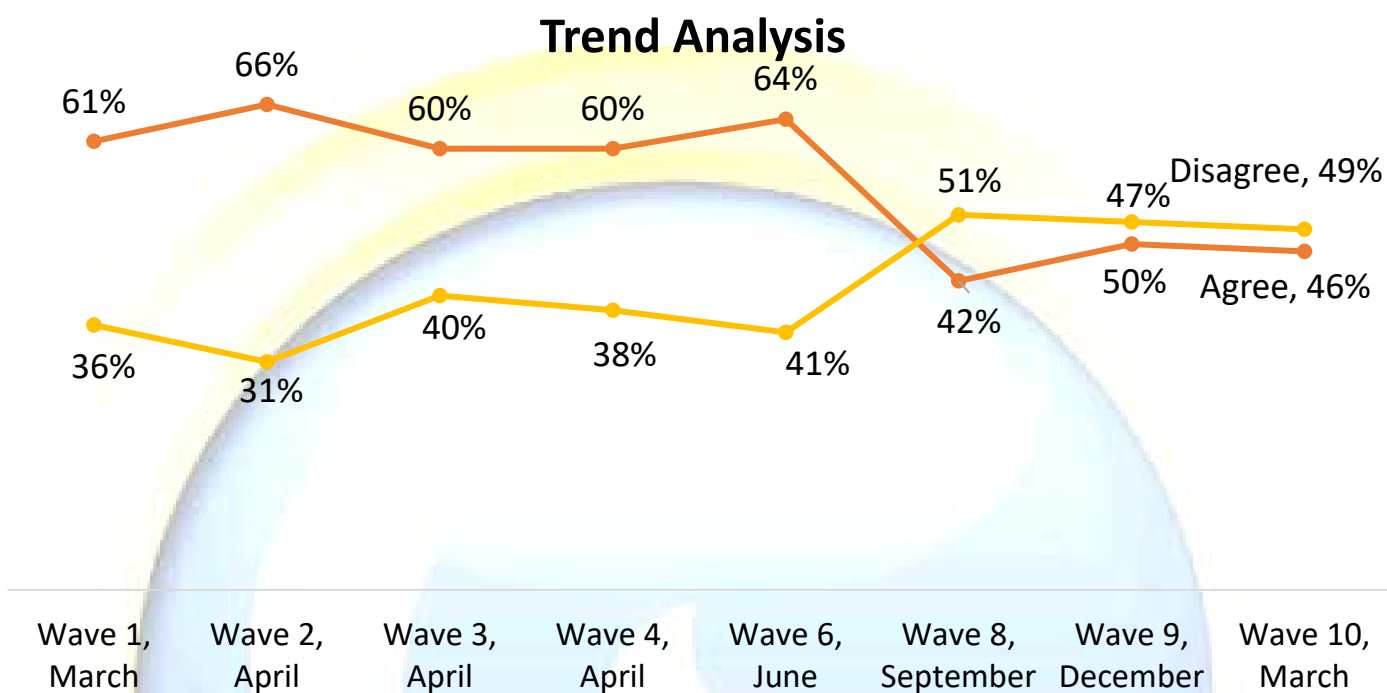

Trend Analysis:

Fear of contracting the virus was initially high. In the first 6 waves of this survey, 60% to 66% Pakistanis said that they were scared that they or someone in their family would contract the virus. However, this percentage fell sharply after June 2020. In September 2020, 42% expressed this fear. This number then rose to 50% in December 2020. As of March 2021, 46% Pakistanis express this fear. This is much lower than the number in the early months of the pandemic.



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,590 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 19, 2021 – April 6, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was phone interviews. Respondents hailed from over 100 districts of Pakistan.
