**65 % Pakistanis are willing to get a COVID-19 vaccine if it is safe to use:  
Gallup & Gilani Pakistan**

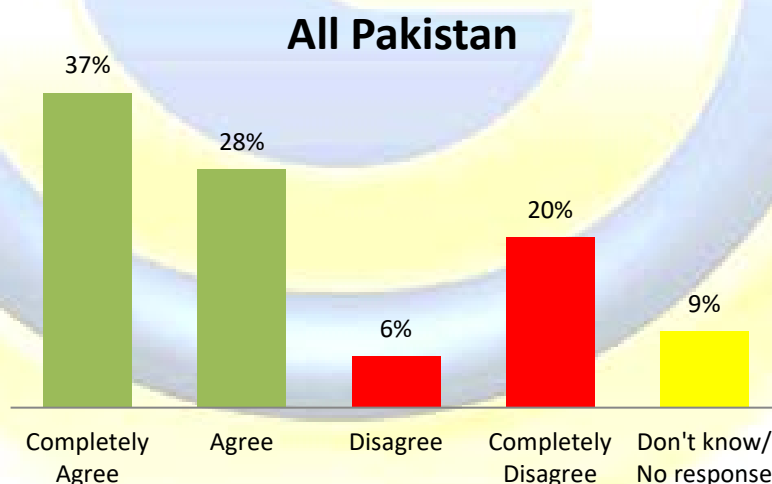
According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 65% Pakistanis are willing to get a COVID-19 vaccine if it is safe to use.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“Keeping the Corona Virus in mind, kindly state the extent to which you agree or disagree with this statement - If there is a COVID-19 vaccine that is safe to use, I will get it?”*

In response to this question, 37% completely agreed, 28% agreed to an extent, 6% disagreed to an extent while 20% completely disagreed. 9% did not know or did not respond.

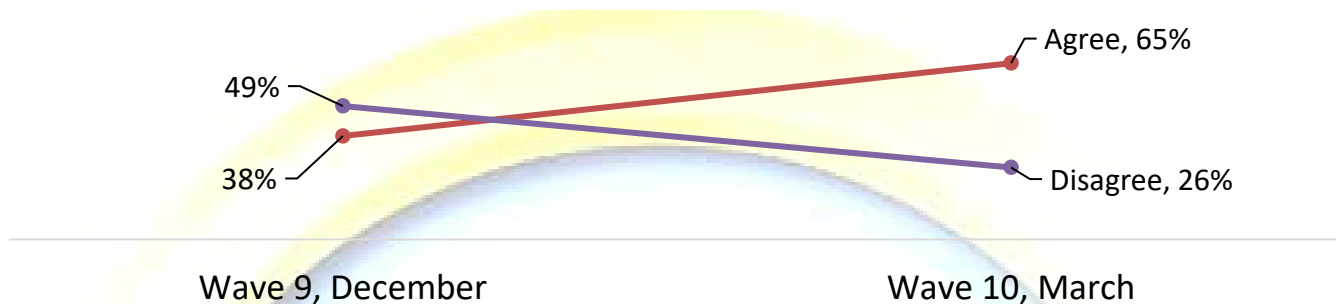

### Trend Analysis:

When asked in December 2020 whether they were willing to get a COVID-19 vaccine if it was available and safe to use, 38% Pakistanis agreed. This number has risen sharply to 65% in March 2021 indicating that more people are now willing to get vaccinated. This can likely be explained by more awareness and actually opening up inoculations as compared to December when vaccinations were still on the horizon.

### Trend Analysis



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,590 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 19, 2021 – April 6, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 2-3$  percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was phone interviews. Respondents hailed from over 100 districts of Pakistan.
