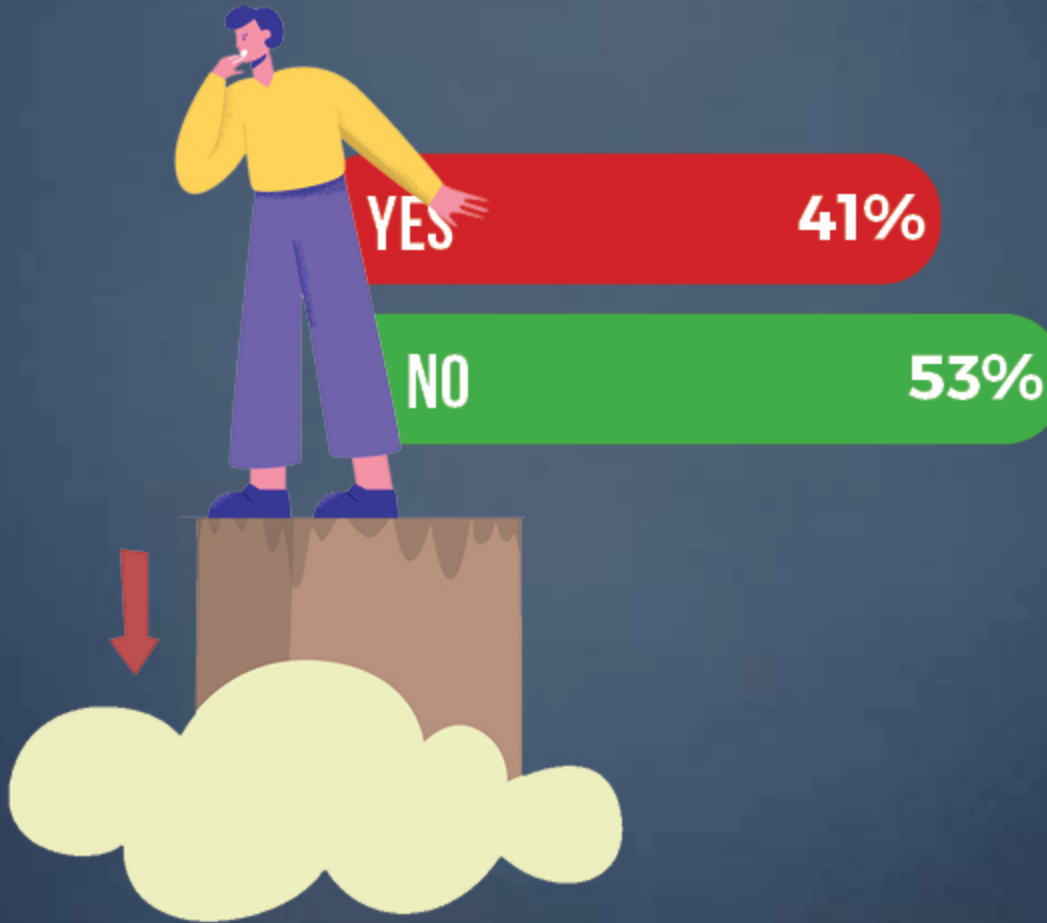

4 in 10 Pakistanis claim that they are afraid of heights: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), June 16, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 41% Pakistanis claim to be afraid of heights.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Please tell us that do you have height phobia/ are you afraid of heights?*” In response to this question, 41% said ‘Yes’, 53% said ‘No’ while 6% did not know/did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 616 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 24, 2021 – May 15, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
