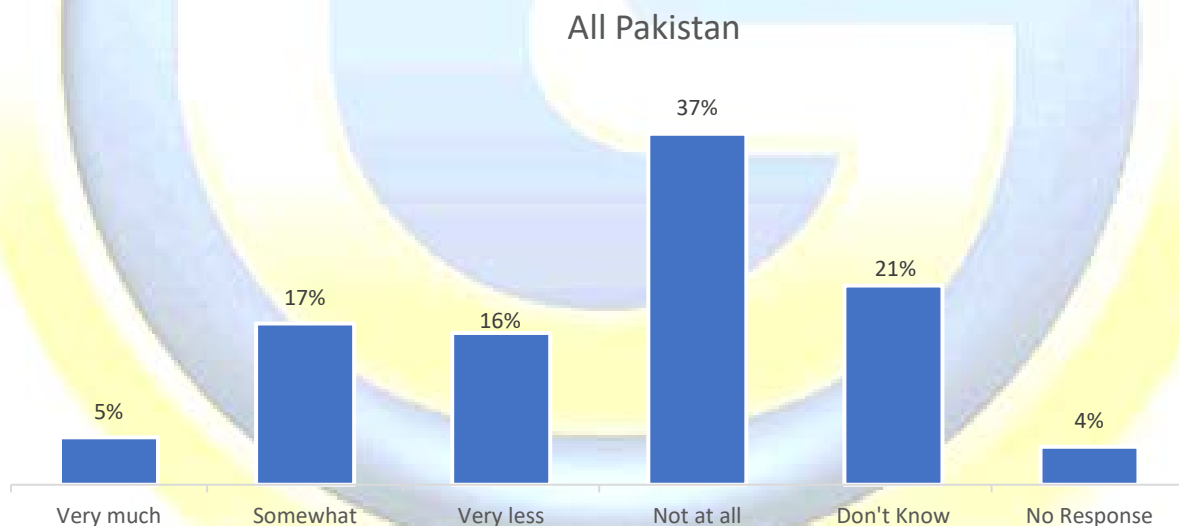
Majority 53% Pakistanis believe that the recently passed Annual Federal and Provincial budget will not create any ease or offer very little relief to the common man: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), July 16, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 37% of Pakistanis believe that recently passed budget will not at all create ease for the common man, with another 16% are very less hopeful on this issue, resulting in a majority 53% who are skeptical about recently passed budget and its ability to offer relief to Pakistanis.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*To what extent do you think the current budget will create ease for the common man?*” In response to this question, 5% said very much, 17% said somewhat, 16% said very less, 37% said not at all, while 21% did not know. 4% did not respond.

Question: “To what extent do you think the current budget will create ease for the common man?”

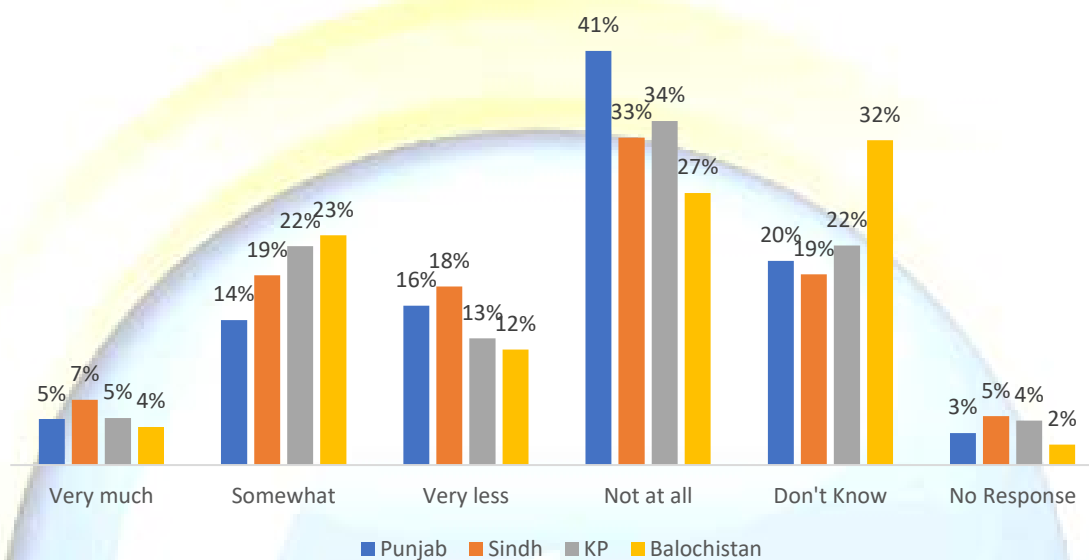

Provincial Breakdown: Punjab topped among all provinces with respect to skepticism regarding the current budget offering any relief to Pakistanis

5% in Punjab, 7% in Sindh, 5% in KPK, and 4% in Balochistan think that the current governmental budget will create a lot of ease for the common man. 14% in Punjab, 19% in Sindh, 22% in KPK, 23% in Balochistan think that the current governmental budget will somewhat create ease for the common man. 16% in Punjab, 18% in Sindh, 13% in KPK, 12% in Balochistan think that the current governmental budget will very less create ease for the common man. 41% in Punjab, 33% in Sindh, 34% in KPK, 27% in Balochistan think that the current governmental budget will not at all create ease for the common man. 20% in Punjab, 19% in Sindh, 22% in KPK, 32% in Balochistan think that the current governmental budget will not create ease for the common man. 3% in Punjab, 5% in Sindh, 4% in KPK, 2% in Balochistan think that the current governmental budget will not create ease for the common man.

Provincial Breakdown



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1066 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01, 2021 – July 13, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
