

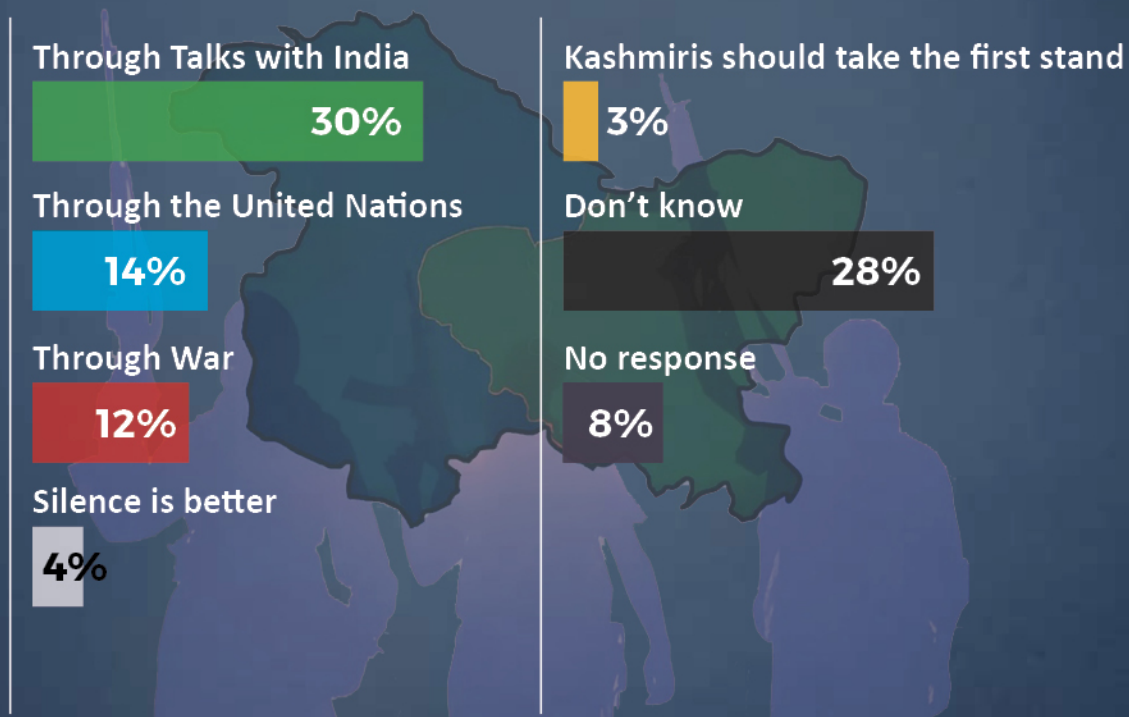

3 IN 10 PAKISTANIS THINK THAT THE KASHMIR ISSUE SHOULD BE RESOLVED THROUGH TALKS WITH INDIA; PEOPLE IN PUNJAB MOST LIKELY (34%) TO HAVE THIS OPINION:

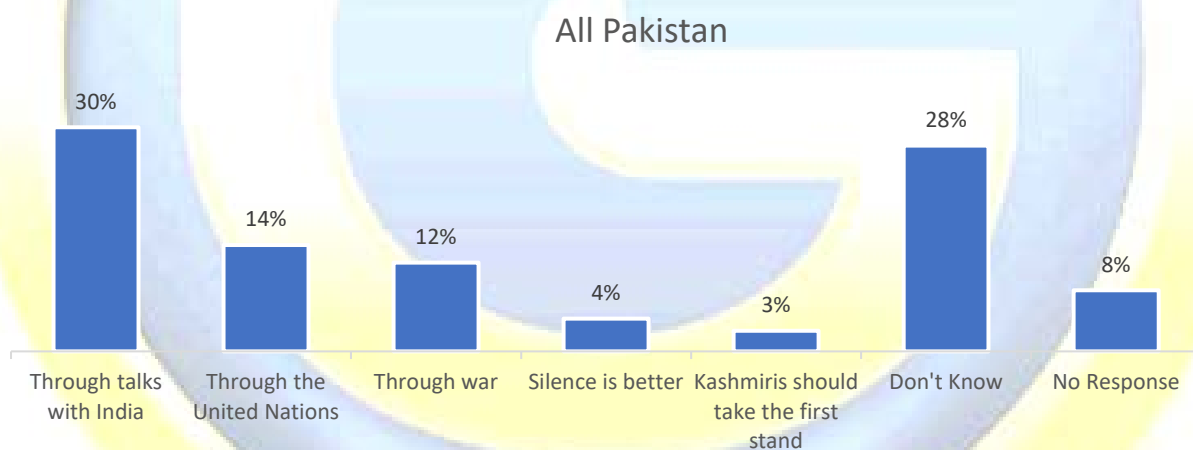
3 in 10 Pakistanis think that the Kashmir issue should be resolved through talks with India; people in Punjab most likely (34 %) to have this opinion: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), July 2, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 30% Pakistanis think that the Kashmir issue should be resolved through talks with India.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*How do you think the Kashmir Dispute should be resolved?*” In response to this question, 30% of Pakistanis said through “talks with India”, 14% said “through the United Nations”, 12% said “through war”, 4% said, “silence is better”, 3% said “Kashmiris should take the first stand” and 28% said they “don’t know.” 8% did not respond.

Question: “How do you think the Kashmir Dispute should be resolved?”

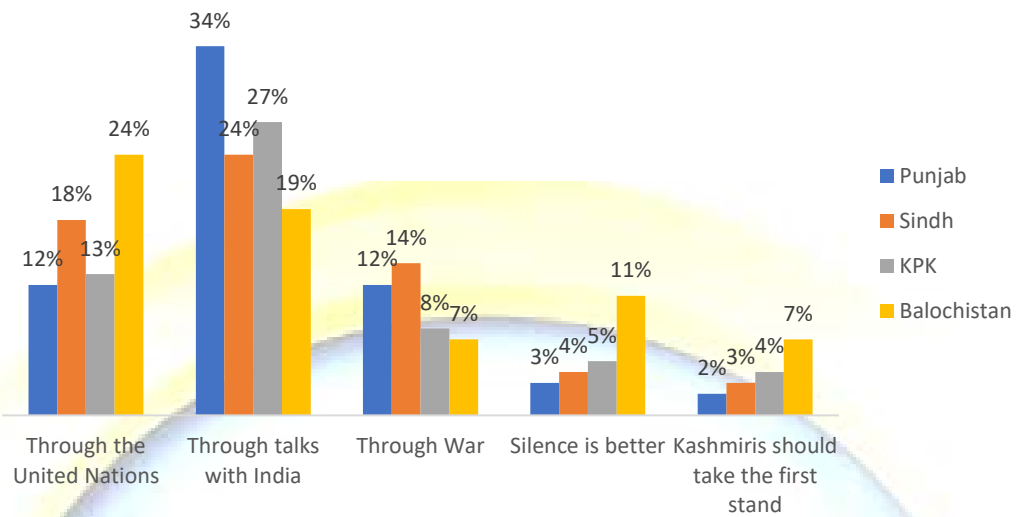

Provincial Breakdown: People in Punjab (34 %) most likely to think that Kashmir issue should be resolved through talks with India.

When asked, “*How do you think the Kashmir Dispute should be resolved?*”, 34% in Punjab said that the Kashmir issue should be resolved “through talks with India”, followed by 24% in Sindh, 27% in KPK and 19% in Balochistan.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 616 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 24, 2021 – May 15, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
