Opinion Poll Health Coronavirus

63 % of Pakistanis are not afraid that they themselves or someone in their household will be infected by the coronavirus: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

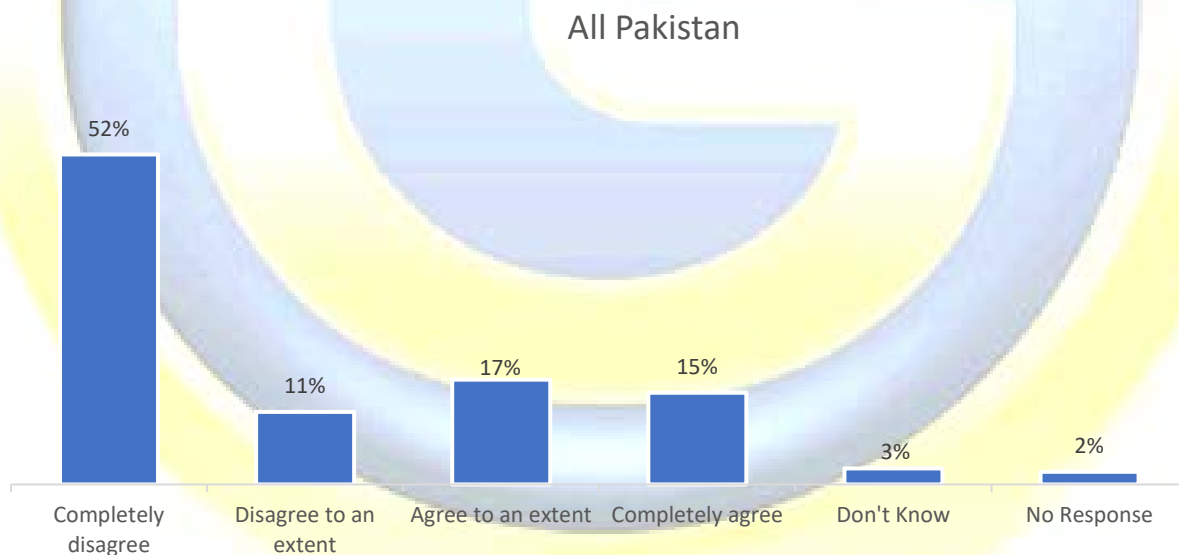

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 63% of Pakistanis disagree with the statement that they are afraid that they themselves or someone in their household will be infected by the coronavirus.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “To what extent do you agree or disagree that ‘I am afraid that myself and someone in my household will be infected by coronavirus?’” In response to this question, 52% completely disagreed, 11% disagreed to an extent, 17% agreed to an extent, 15% completely agreed while 3% did not know. 2% did not provide any response.

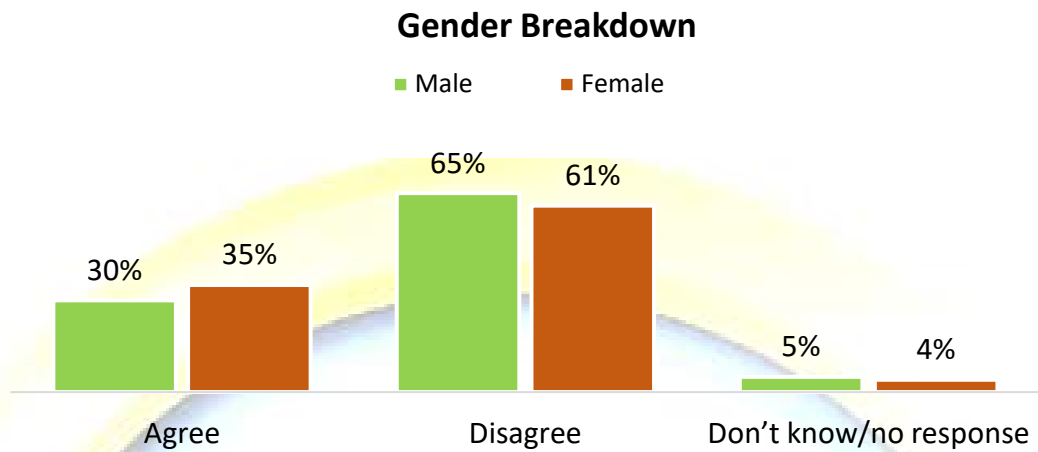
Question: “To what extent do you agree or disagree that ‘I am afraid that myself and someone in my household will be infected by coronavirus?’”

Gender Breakdown

Relatively more females (35%) than males (30%) are afraid that someone in their household will be infected by the virus.



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1066 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01, 2021 – July 13, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
