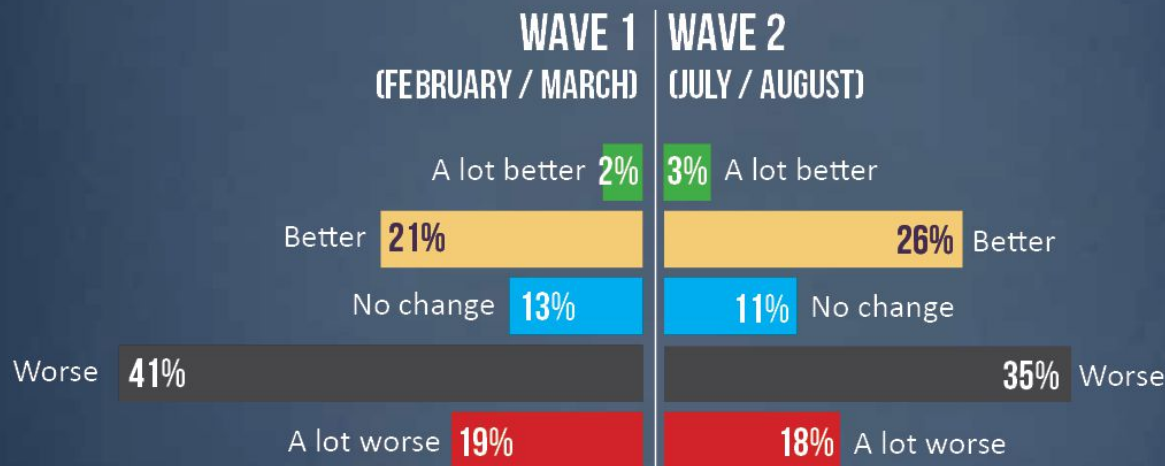

According to Dun&Bradstreet and Gallup Pakistan Consumer Confidence Index, 53% Pakistanis said that in comparison to the last 6 months, Pakistan's economic situation has worsened.

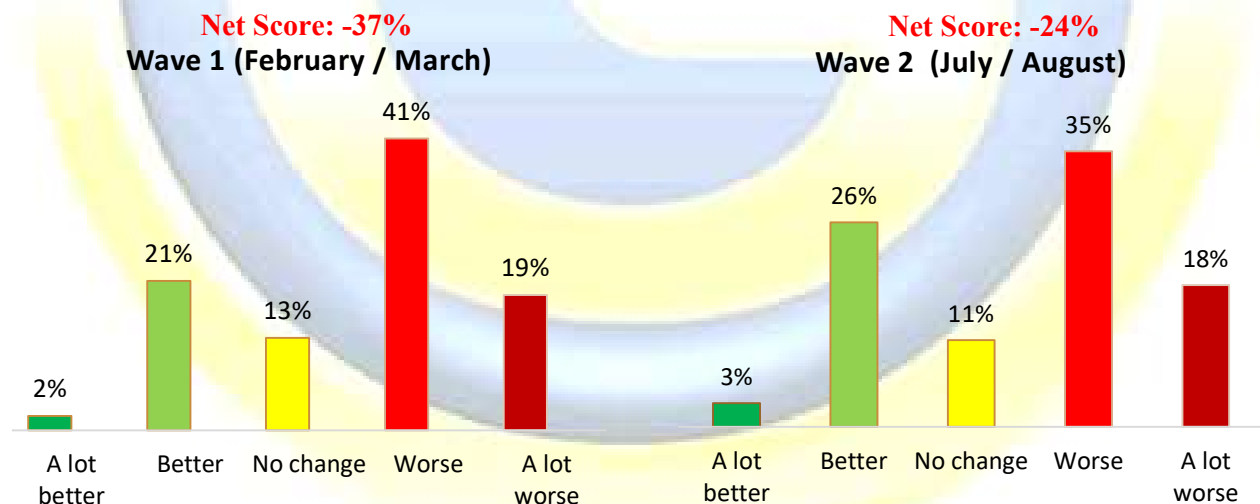
The Consumer Confidence Index (CCI) is a reflection of current sentiments and future outlook as seen through the eyes of consumers across Pakistan. The CCI score is an indicator of consumer optimism/pessimism about the economy, as well as their own financial situation. Consumer Confidence Index is a leading indicator of the economic health and social well-being.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, "In your opinion, how would you describe the current economic situation in Pakistan in comparison to last 6 months?" In response to this question, 3% said a lot better, 26% said better, 11% said no change, 35% said worse and 18% said a lot worse.

Question: "In your opinion, how would you describe the current economic situation in Pakistan in comparison to last 6 months?"

Optimists: 23% / Pessimists: 60% / Neutrals: 13%

Optimists: 29% / Pessimists: 53% / Neutrals: 11%

Dun&Bradstreet Pakistan and Gallup Pakistan collaborated to launch the Pakistan CCI, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. Wave 1 of the survey was carried out among a sample of 1590 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, in March 2021. Wave 2 of the survey was carried out among a sample of 1997 men and women in June 2021.
