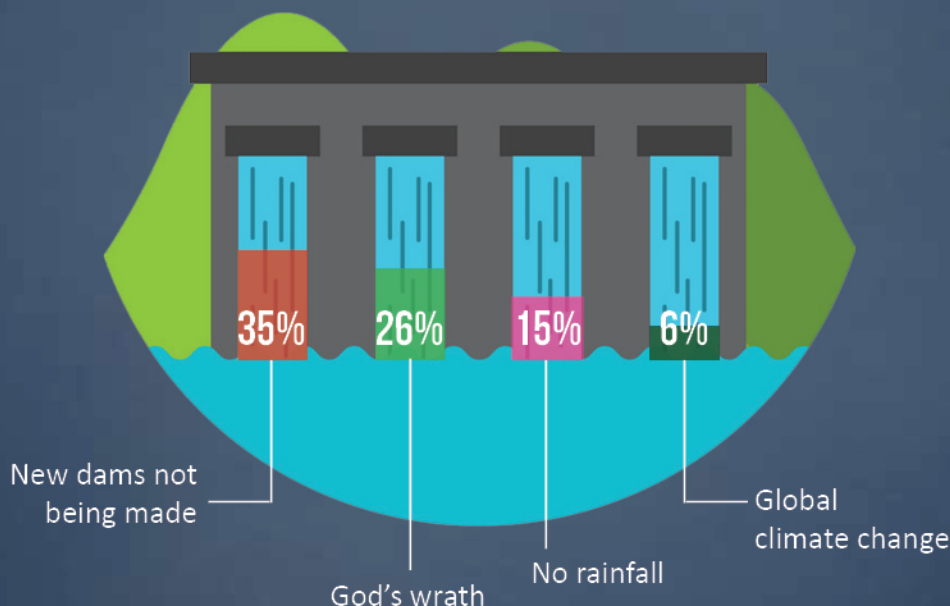

35% OF PAKISTANIS BELIEVE THAT PAKISTAN IS FACING WATER SHORTAGES BECAUSE NEW DAMS ARE NOT BEING BUILT: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

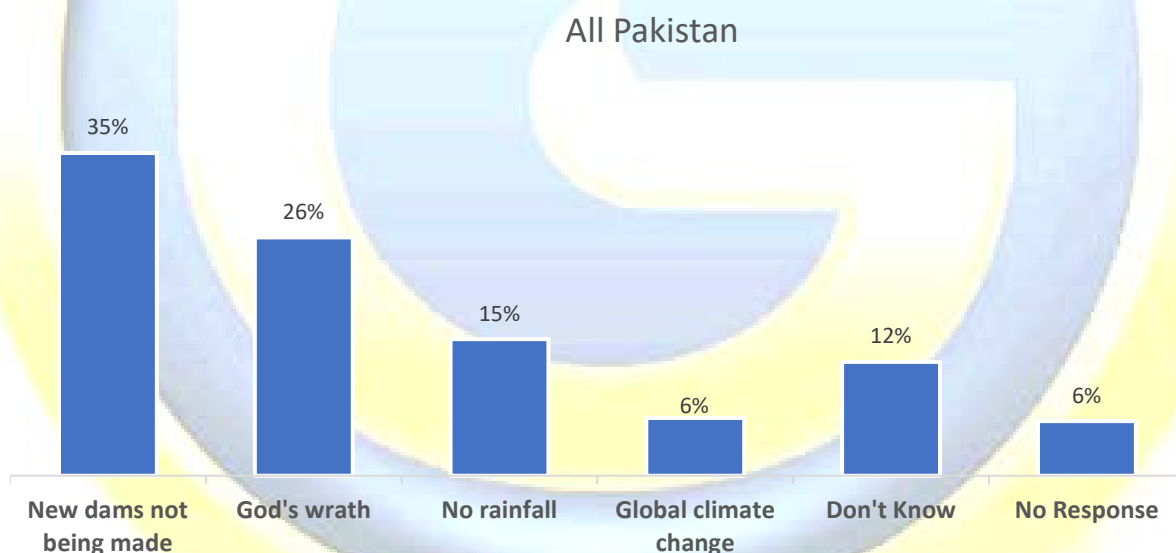
35 % of Pakistanis believe that Pakistan is facing water shortages because new dams are not being built: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), August 5, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 35% of Pakistanis believe that Pakistan is facing water shortages because new dams are not being built while 26% attribute the reason for water shortages in Pakistan to God's wrath.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, "Nowadays, various areas of Pakistan are facing water shortages. What do you think is the biggest cause of this?" In response to this question, 35% attributed it to new dams not being built, 15% attributed it to no rainfall, 6% attributed it to global climate change, 26% attributed it to God's wrath, 12% did not know while 6% did not respond.

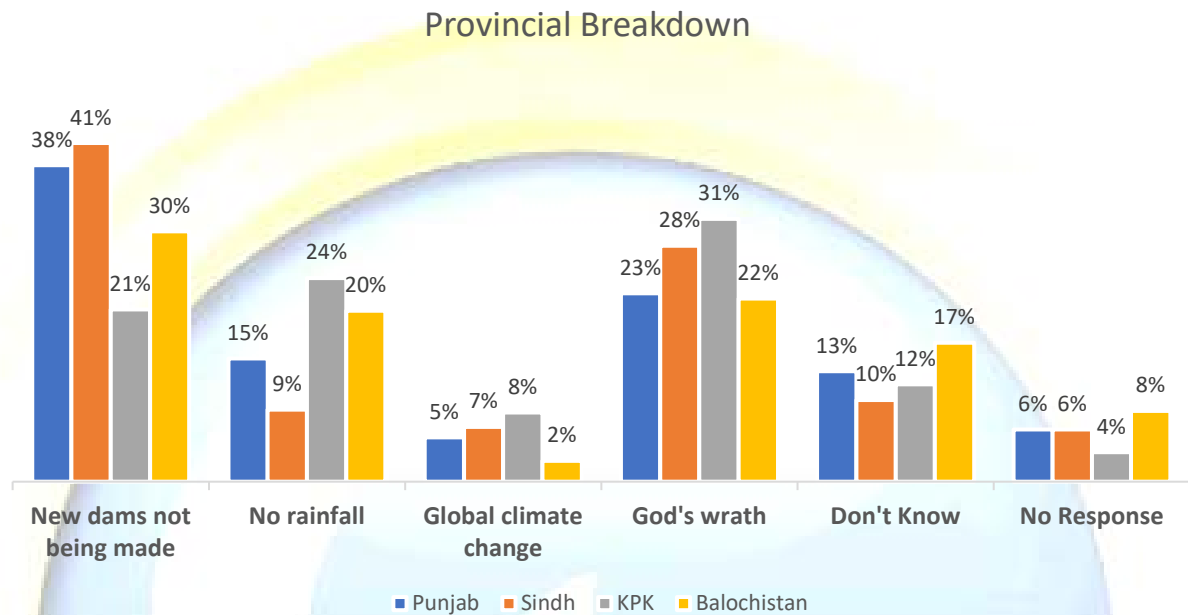
Question: "Nowadays, various areas of Pakistan are facing water shortages. What do you think is the biggest cause of this?"

Provincial Breakdown: Nearly 2 in 5 people from Sindh believe that the reason for water shortages in Pakistan is because new dams are not being made, the highest from all provinces.

41% of people from Sindh, 38% people from Punjab, 21% people from KPK and 30% attribute the reason for water shortages in Pakistan to new dams not being made. Conversely, 31% from KPK, 23% from Punjab, 28% in Sindh and 22% in Balochistan cite God's wrath as the reason for water shortages occurring all across Pakistan.



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1066 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01, 2021 – July 13, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
