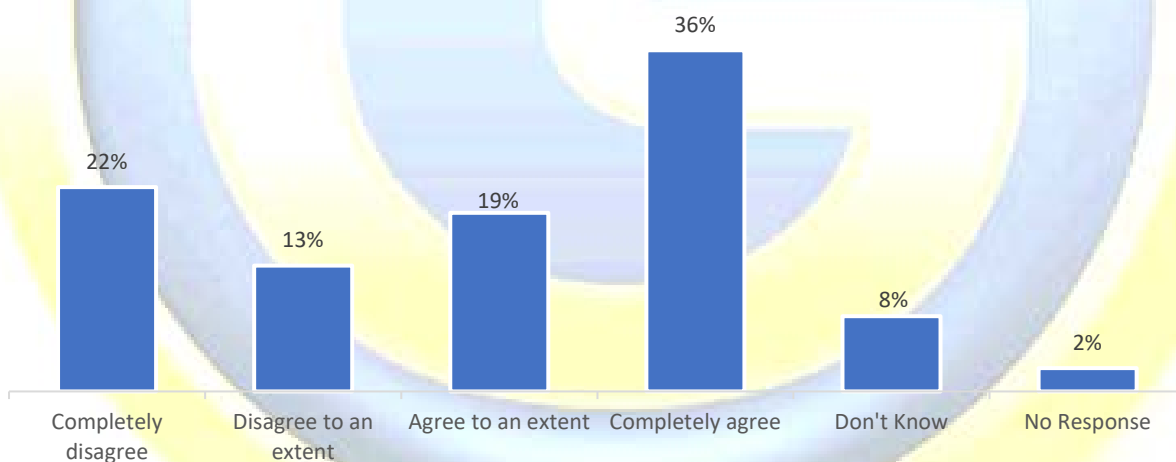
According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 55% of Pakistanis believe that the threat of Coronavirus is exaggerated.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*To what extent do you agree/disagree that the threat of Coronavirus is being exaggerated?*” In response to this question, 22% completely disagreed, 13% disagreed to an extent, 19% agreed to an extent, 36% completely agreed while 8% did not know. 2% did not provide any response.

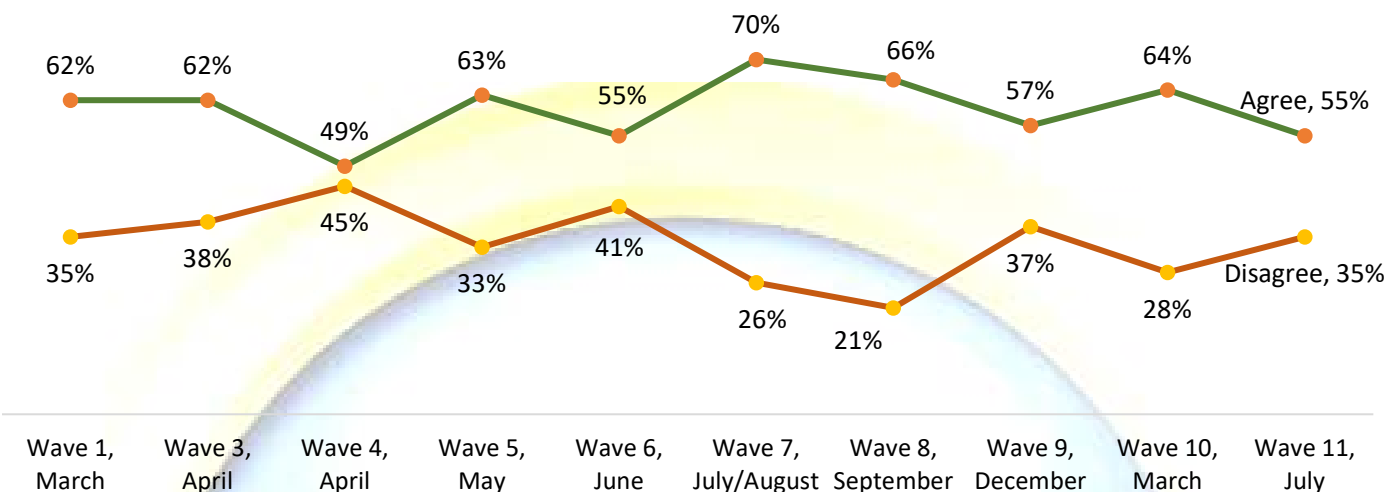

Trend Analysis

Compared to 64% in Wave 10 in March, the proportion of Pakistanis who consider the threat of coronavirus to be exaggerated has decreased to 55% in Wave 11 in July.

Trend Analysis



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1066 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 01, 2021 – July 13, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
