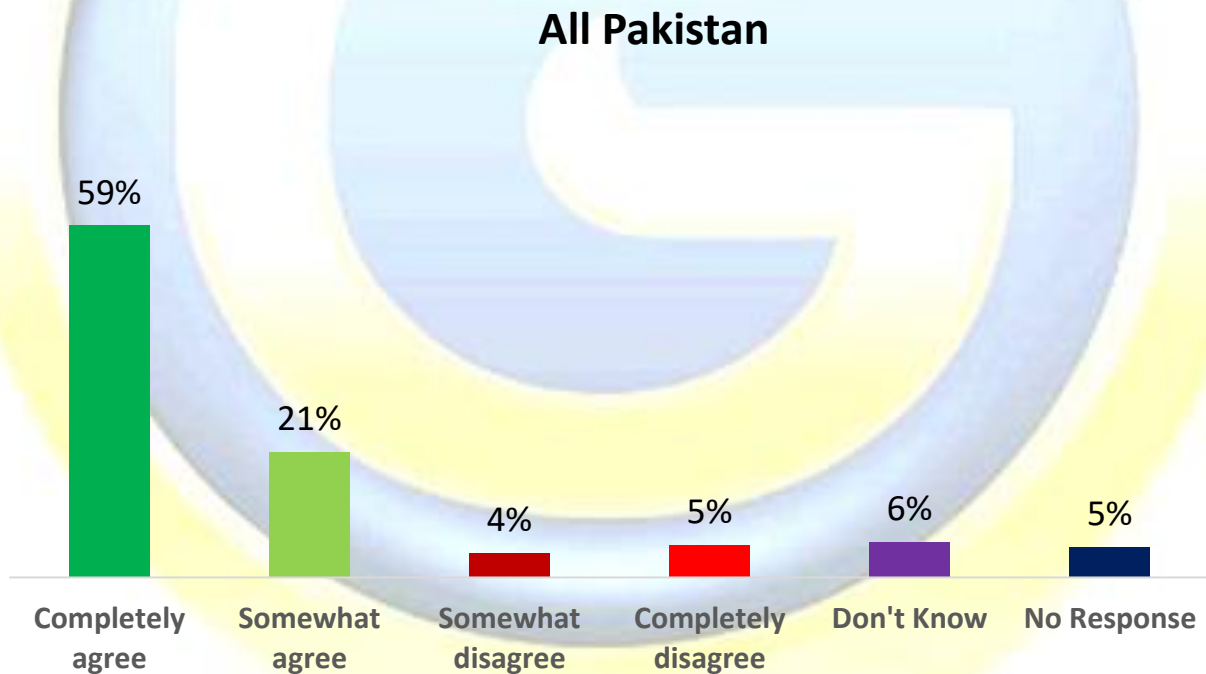
4 in 5 Pakistanis agree that local experts do not understand the lives of ordinary people: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), September 17, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 4 in 5 Pakistanis agree that local experts do not understand the lives of ordinary people.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“Please indicate to what extent you agree or disagree with the following statement? - Local experts do not understand the lives of people like me”* In response to this question, 59% said they completely agreed, 21% somewhat agreed, 4% somewhat disagreed and 5% completely disagreed. 6% did not know and 5% did not respond.

Question: “Please indicate to what extent you agree or disagree with the following statement? - Local experts do not understand the lives of people like me”

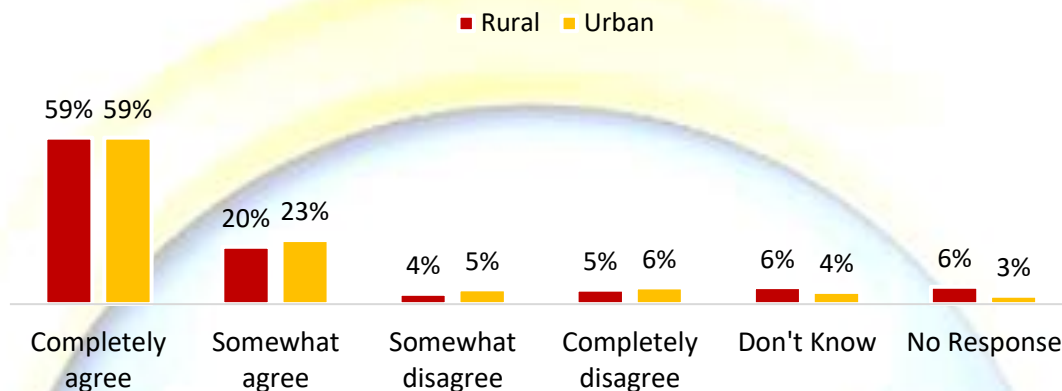

Urban-Rural Breakdown

Urban and rural Pakistanis are both almost equally likely to agree with the idea that local experts do not understand the lives of ordinary people.

Rural/Urban Breakdown



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1418 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 05, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
