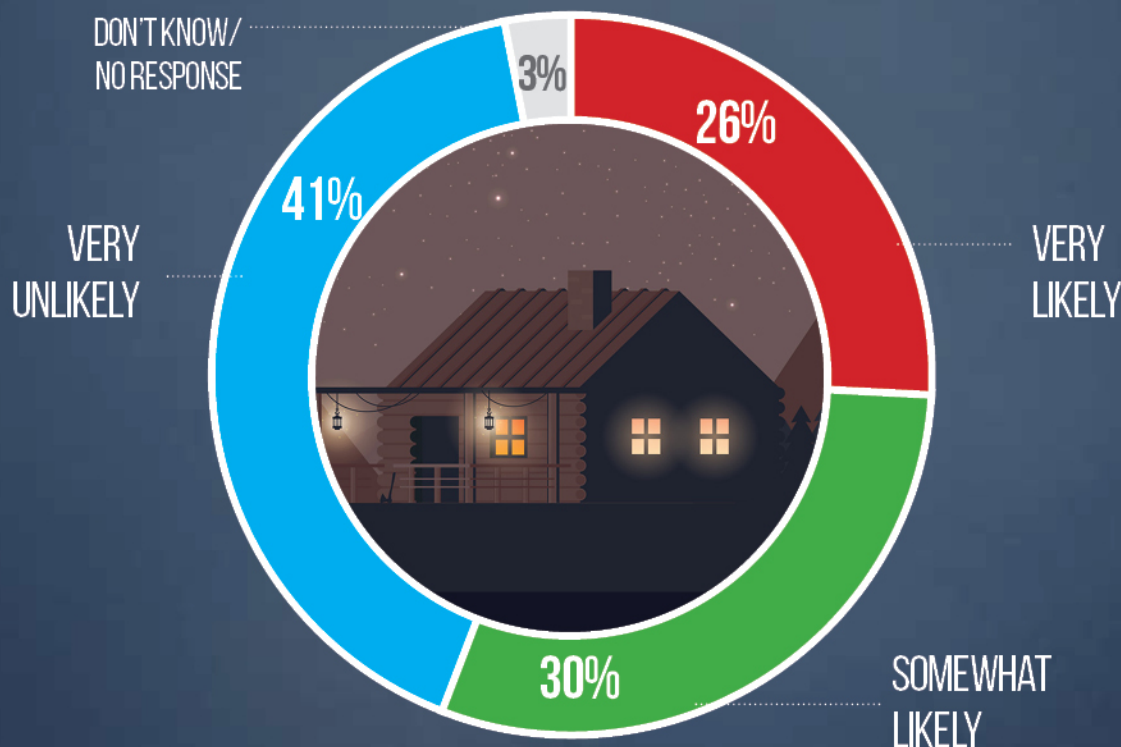

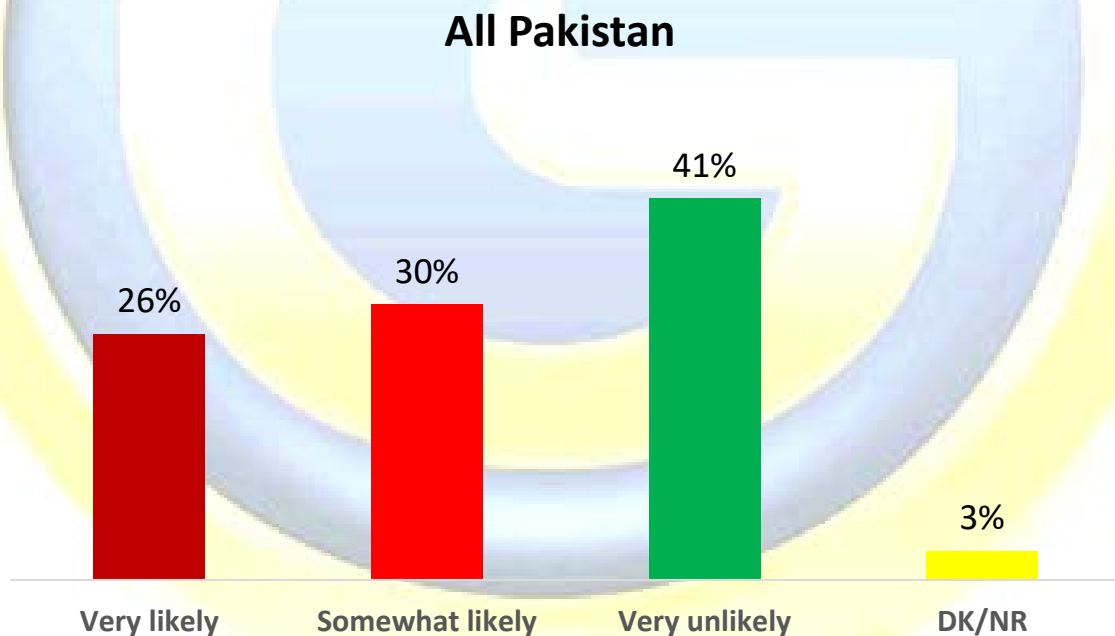

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 1 in 4 Pakistanis (26%) believe that if a family in their neighborhood locks their home and moves away, an incident is very likely to occur there.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “If a family in your neighborhood locks their home and moves away, what is the probability of an incident occurring in that home?” In response to this question, 26% said very likely, 30% said somewhat likely, 41% said somewhat unlikely and 3% did not know/did not respond.

Question: “If a family in your neighborhood locks their home and moves away, what is the probability of an incident occurring in that home?”

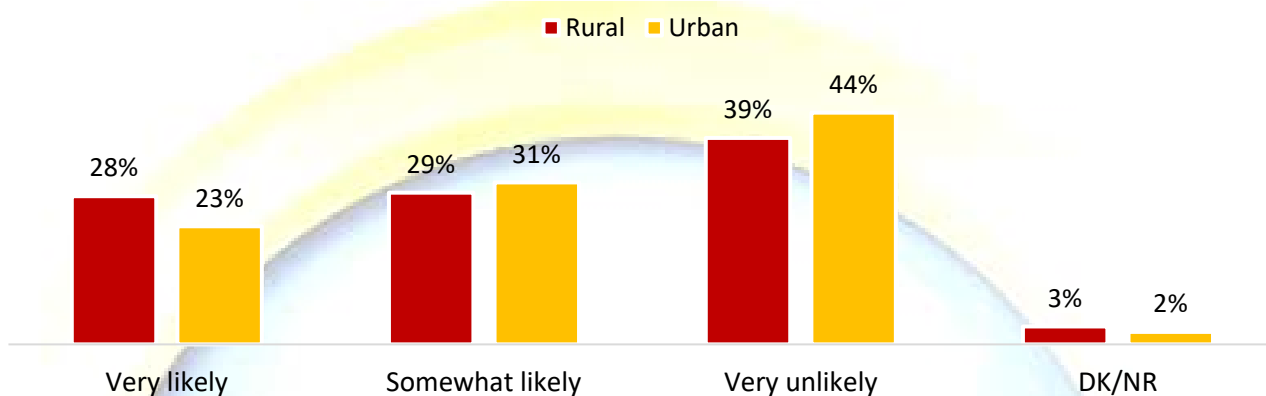

Urban-Rural Breakdown

More Pakistanis from rural areas (28%) as compared to those from urban areas (23%) believe that if a family in their neighborhood locks their home and moves away, it is very likely that an incident will occur in that home.

Rural-Urban Breakdown



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1418 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 05, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
