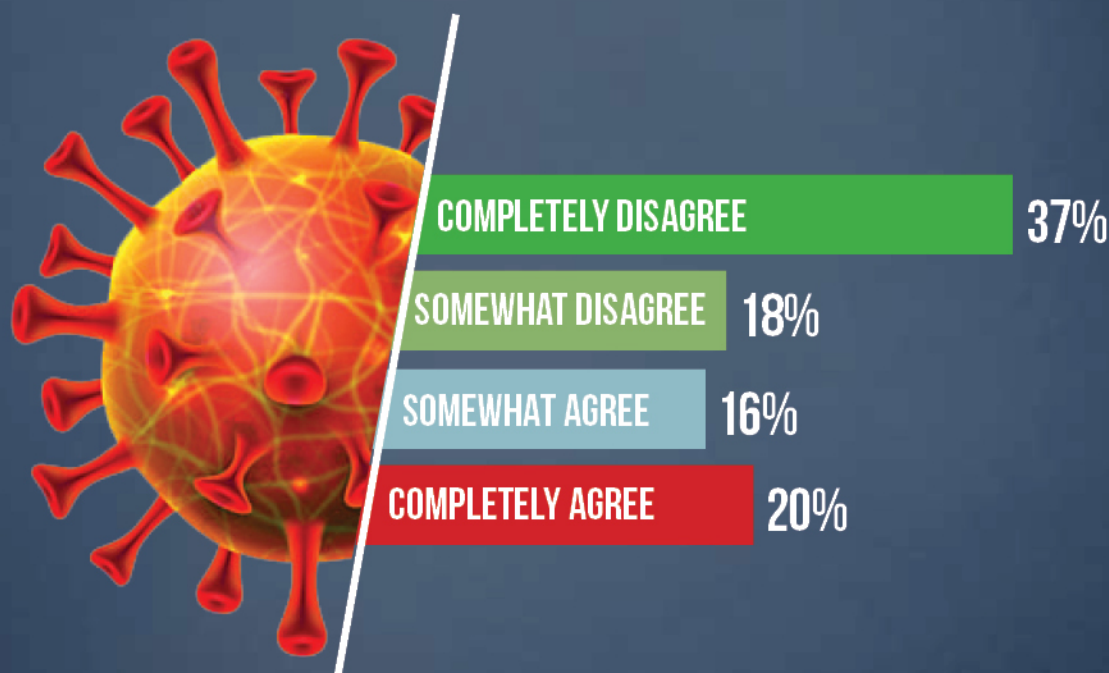

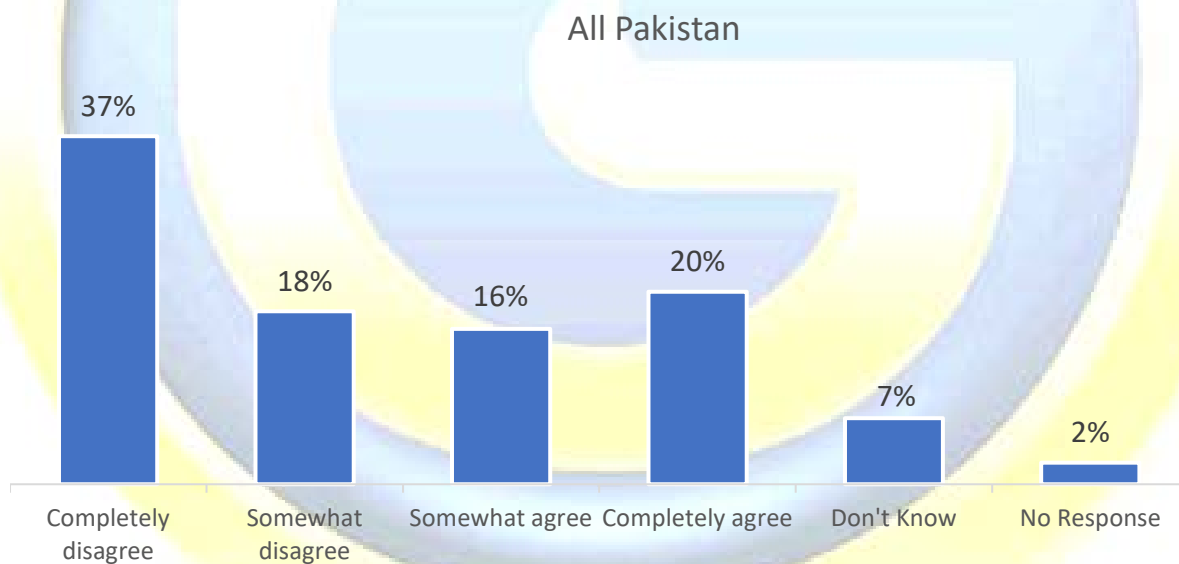

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 36% of Pakistanis consider the threat of coronavirus to be exaggerated – a 19% decrease since the previous wave in July.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “To what extent do you agree/disagree that the threat of Coronavirus is being exaggerated?” In response to this question, 37% completely disagreed, 18% somewhat disagreed, 16% somewhat agreed, 20% completely agreed while 7% did not know. 2% did not provide any response.

Question: “To what extent do you agree/disagree that the threat of Coronavirus is being exaggerated?”

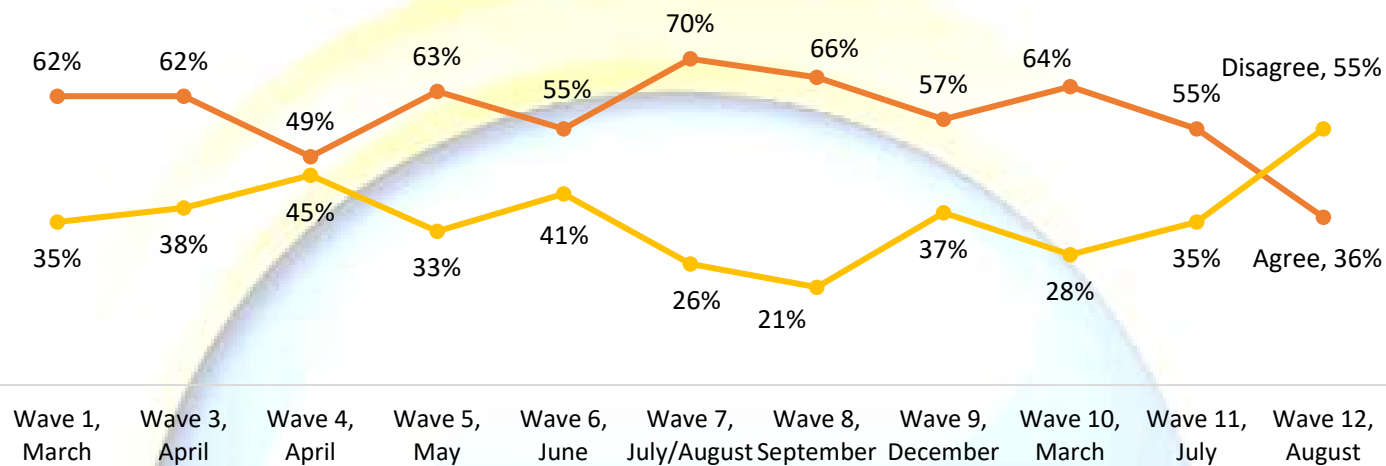

Trend Analysis

Compared to 55% in Wave 11 in July, the proportion of Pakistanis who consider the threat of coronavirus to be exaggerated has decreased to 36% in Wave 12 in August indicating that more people are taking it seriously now.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1727 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 5, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
