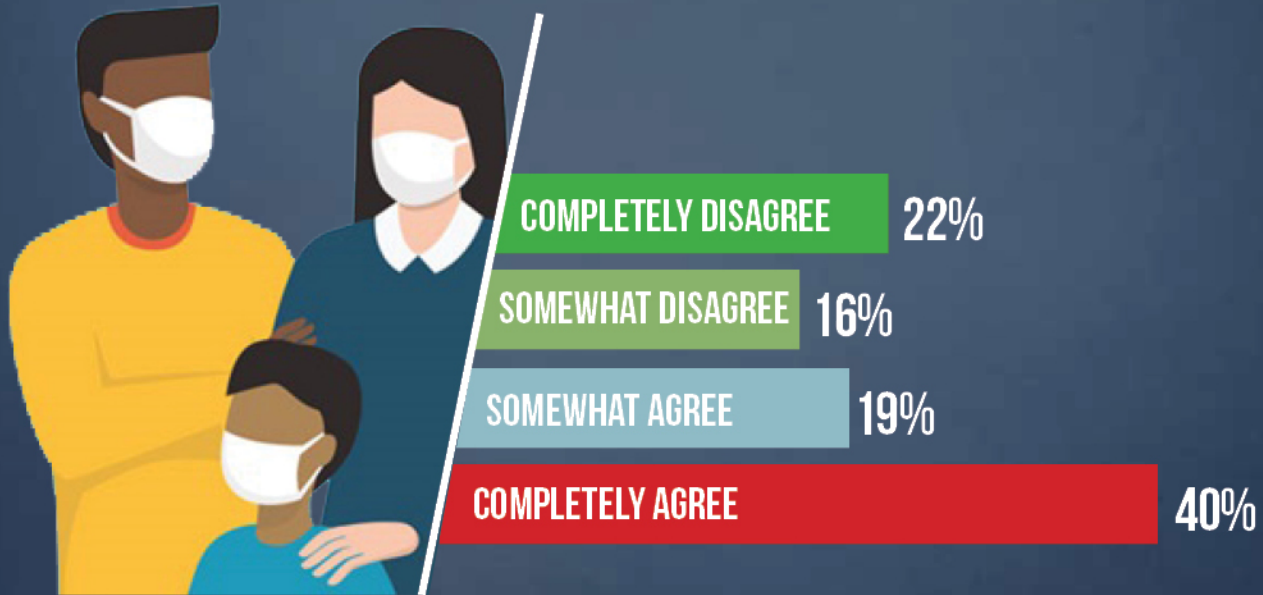

NEARLY 6 IN 10 PAKISTANIS (59%) ARE AFRAID THAT THEY THEMSELVES OR SOMEONE IN THEIR HOUSEHOLD WILL BE INFECTED BY THE CORONAVIRUS; THIS IS AN INCREASE FROM 32% IN WAVE 11 IN JULY:

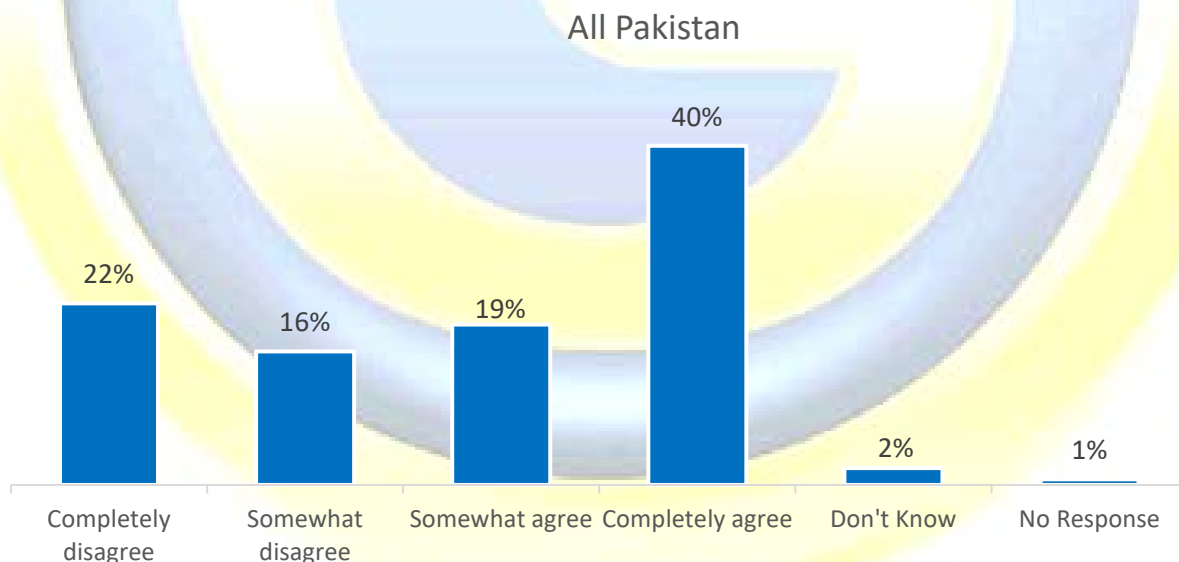

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 59% of Pakistanis are afraid that they themselves or someone in their household will be infected by the coronavirus.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: ‘I am afraid that myself and someone in my household will be infected by coronavirus?’” In response to this question, 22% completely disagreed, 16% somewhat disagreed, 19% somewhat agreed, 40% completely agreed while 2% did not know. 1% did not provide any response.

Question: “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: ‘I am afraid that myself and someone in my household will be infected by coronavirus?’”

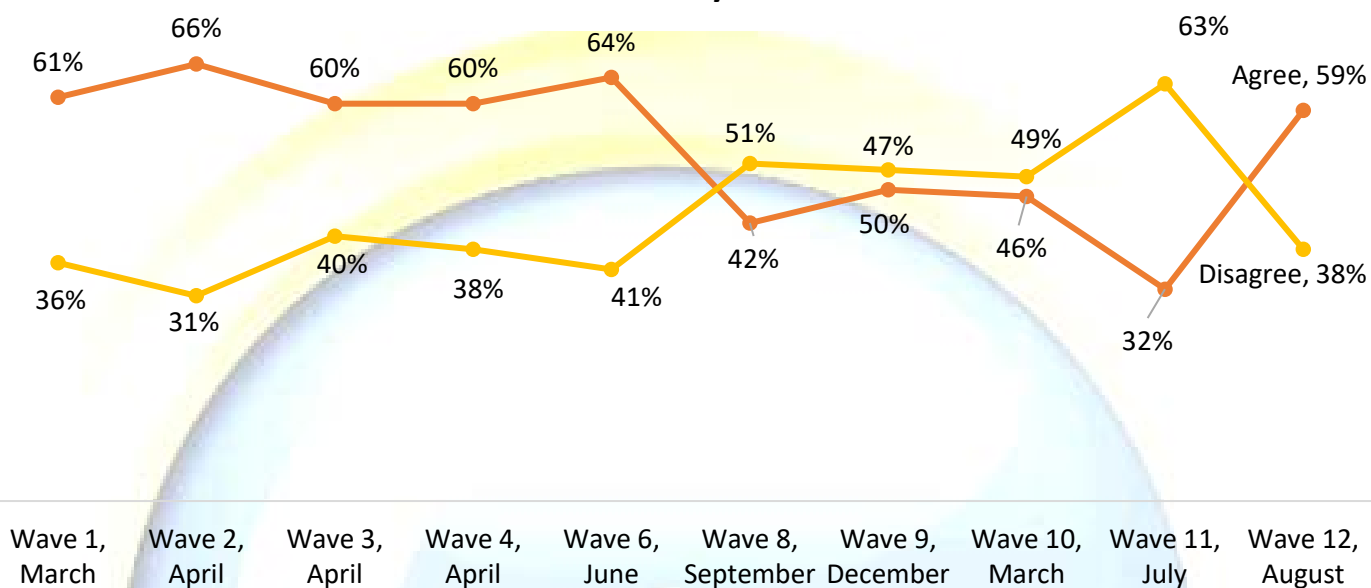

Trend Analysis

While 32% Pakistanis in Wave 11 in July were afraid that they themselves or someone in their household would be infected by the virus, this number has increased to 59% in Wave 12 in August.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1727 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 5, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
