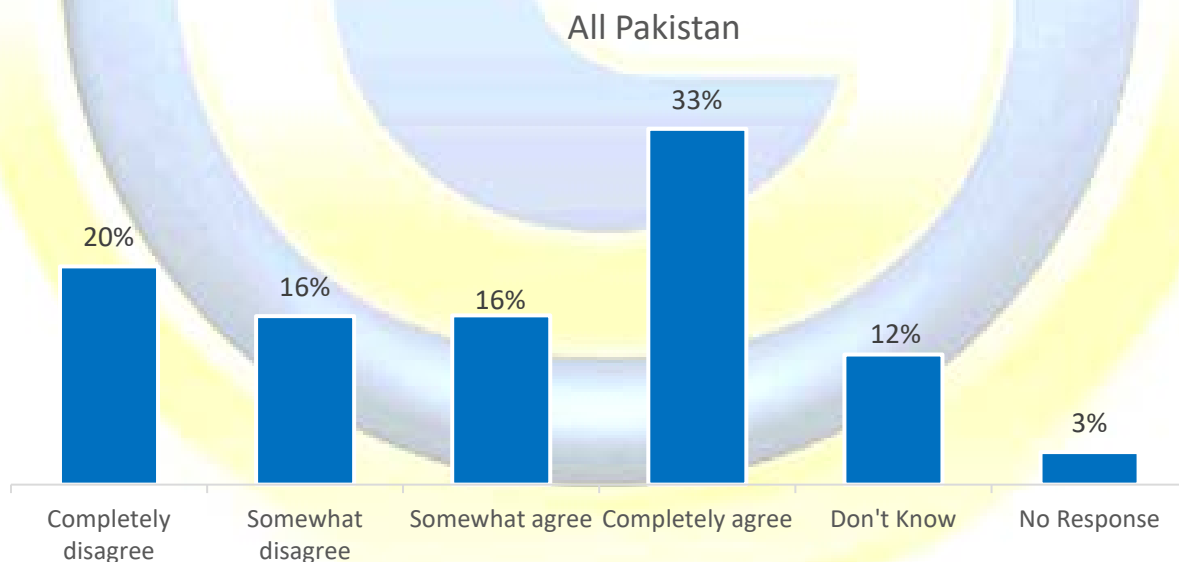

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 49% of Pakistanis still hold the opinion that coronavirus is a foreign conspiracy, a 12% increase from the previous wave in July.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: ‘I think Coronavirus is a foreign conspiracy’?” In response to this question, 20% completely disagreed, 16% somewhat disagreed, 16% somewhat agreed, 33% completely agreed while 12% did not know. 3% did not provide any response.

Question: “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: ‘I think coronavirus is a foreign conspiracy’?”

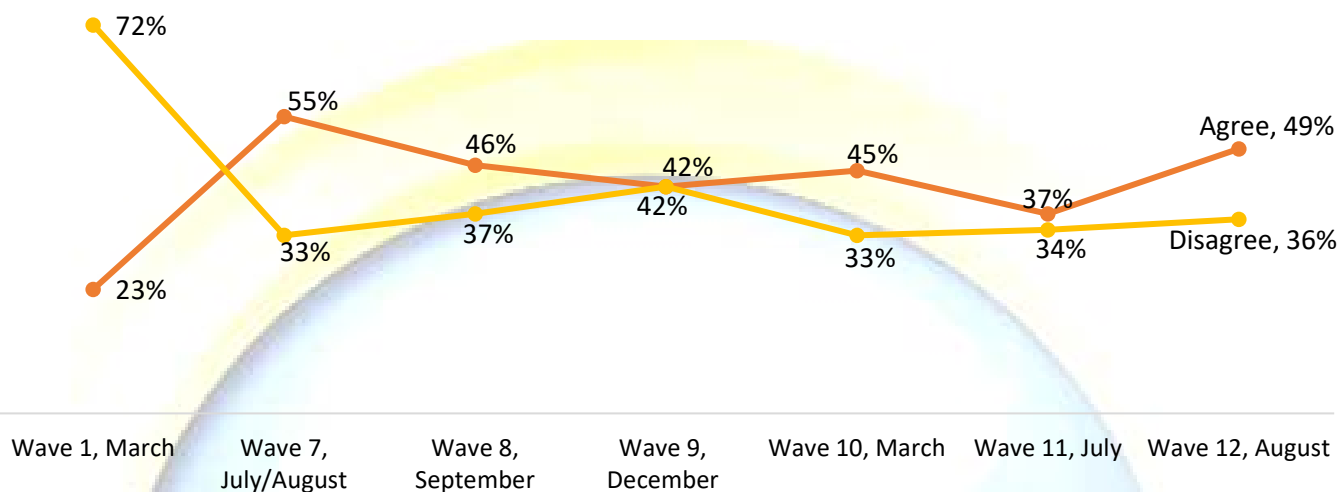

Trend Analysis

49% of Pakistanis still hold the opinion that coronavirus is a foreign conspiracy. This is a 12% increase from 37% in Wave 11 in July.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1727 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 5, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
