NEARLY 1 IN 4 PAKISTANIS (24%) CLAIM THAT THEY KNOW SOMEONE IN THEIR SOCIAL CIRCLE WHO HAS BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH COVID-19; THIS IS A 6% INCREASE FROM 18% IN JULY, THE HIGHEST SINCE JUNE 2020: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

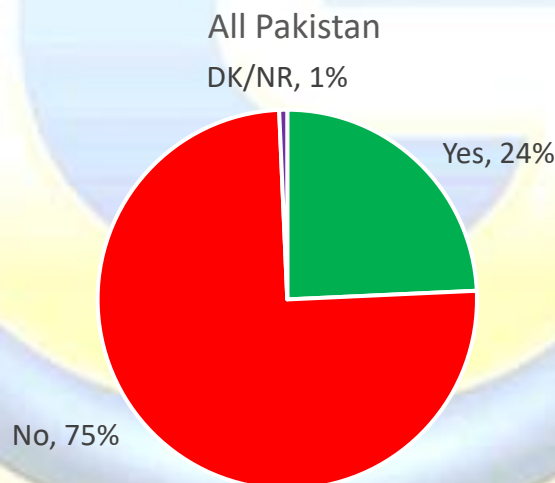

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 24% of Pakistanis claim that they know someone in their social circle who has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you know someone in your social circle who has been diagnosed with COVID-19?” In response to this question, 24 % said yes, 75% said no, while 1% did not know or did not provide any response.

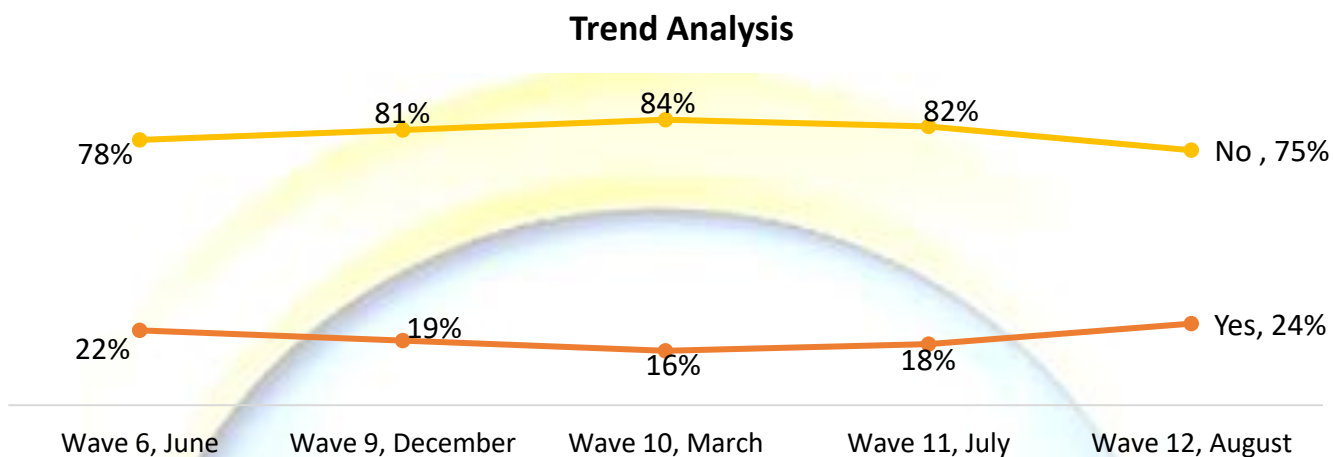
Question: “Do you know someone in your social circle who has been diagnosed with COVID-19?”

Trend Analysis

24% of Pakistanis claim that they know someone who has contracted coronavirus in Wave 12 in August. This is a 6% increase from Wave 11 in July, the largest change recorded since Wave 6 in June 2020.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1727 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 5, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
