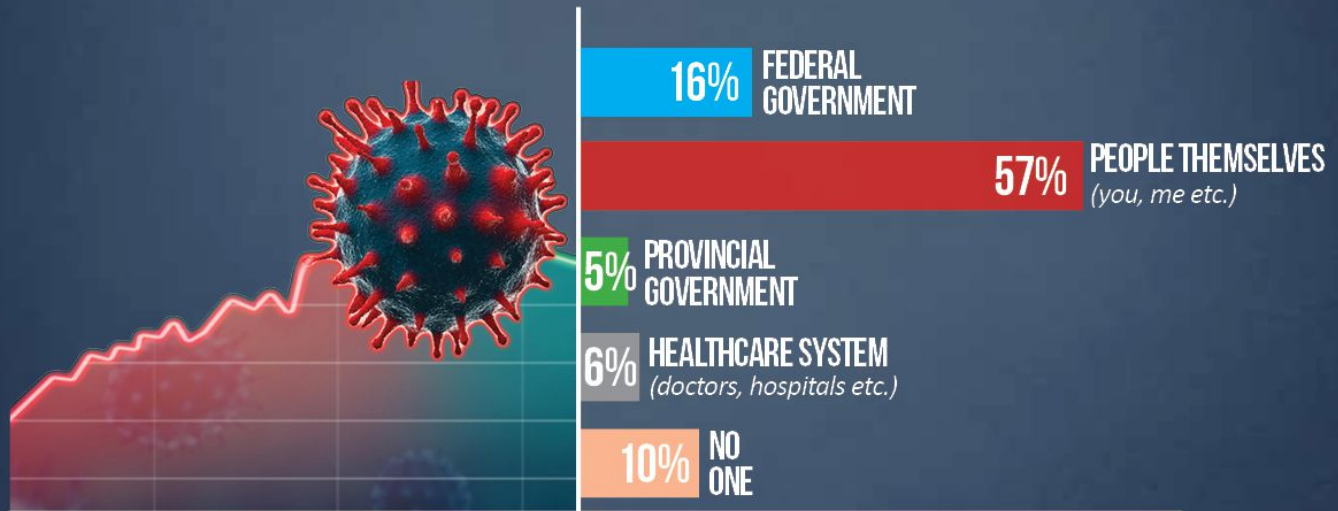

57% of Pakistanis believe that the people themselves would be to blame should there be a potential increase in COVID-19 cases in the future: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

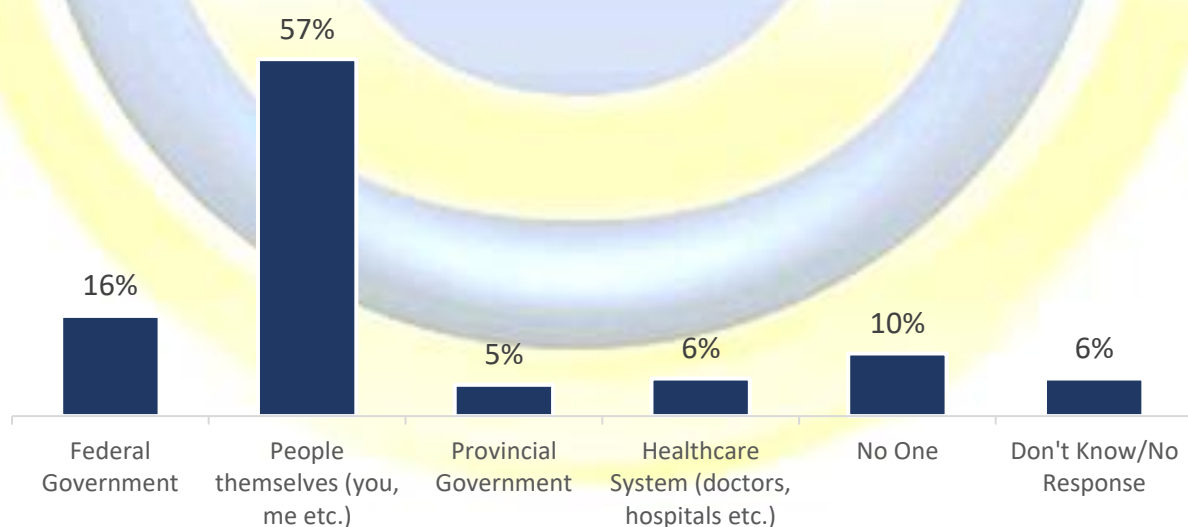

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 57% of Pakistanis believe that the people themselves would be to blame should there be a potential increase in COVID-19 cases in the future.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Assuming a significant increase in the number of people infected with the coronavirus over the next few weeks/months, who do you think will be most responsible for this?” In response to this question, 16% believed that the federal government would be responsible, 57% said they would hold themselves responsible, 5% believed that the provincial government would be responsible while 6% believed that the responsibility would lie with the healthcare system. 10% believed that no one would be responsible while 6% did not know or provided no response.

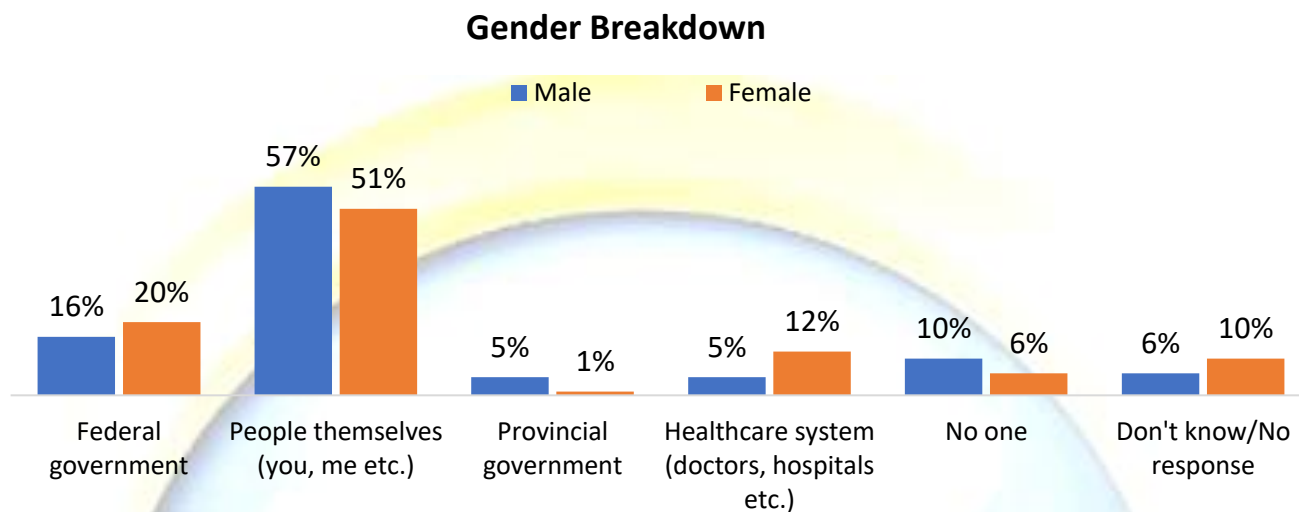

Gender Breakdown

Females (12%) are relatively more likely to hold the healthcare system responsible should there be a hypothetical increase in COVID-19 cases in the coming months as compared to males (5%).

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1727 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 5, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
