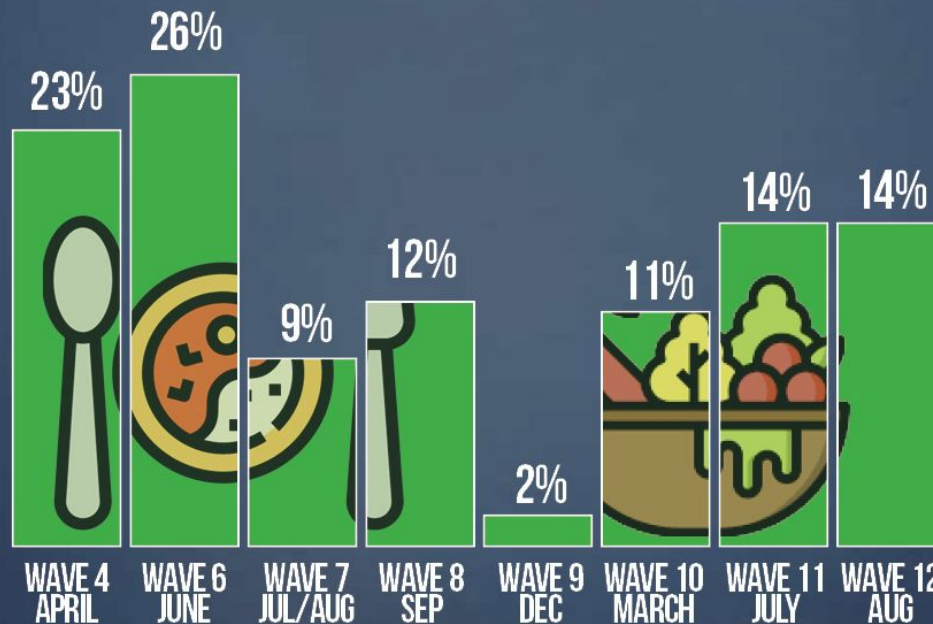

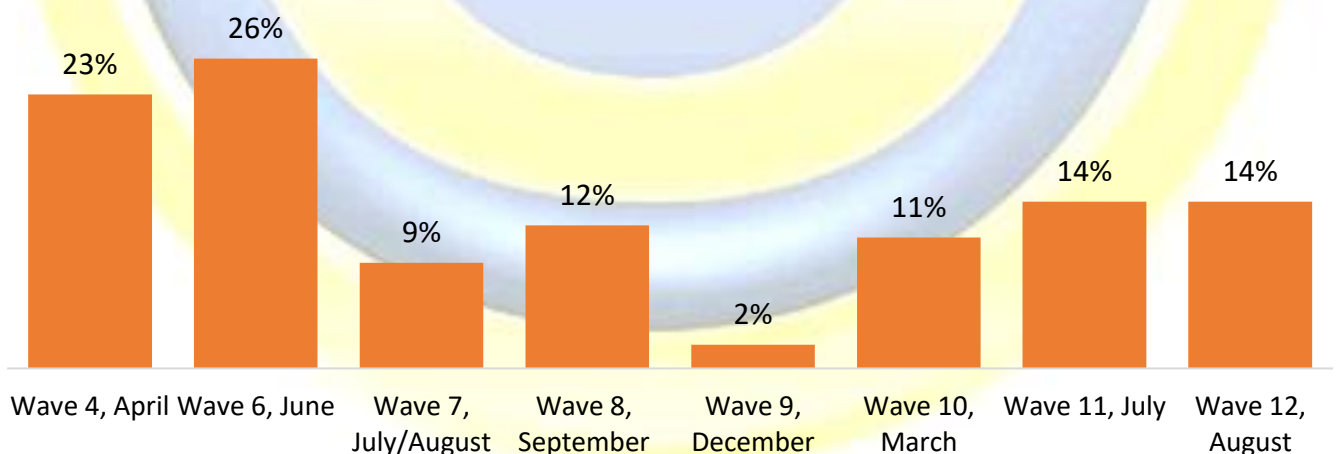

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 14% of Pakistanis in August 2021 reported to have reduced the number or size of meals for some household members to cover their basic household needs.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*In the past 7 days, did you ‘reduce the number or size of meals for some household members’ to cover your household’s basic needs? (Only reporting percentage of people who agreed).*” In response to this question, 14% of people in August 2021 agreed that they have reduced the number or size of meals for some household members to cover their basic household needs.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1727 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 13, 2021 – September 5, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
