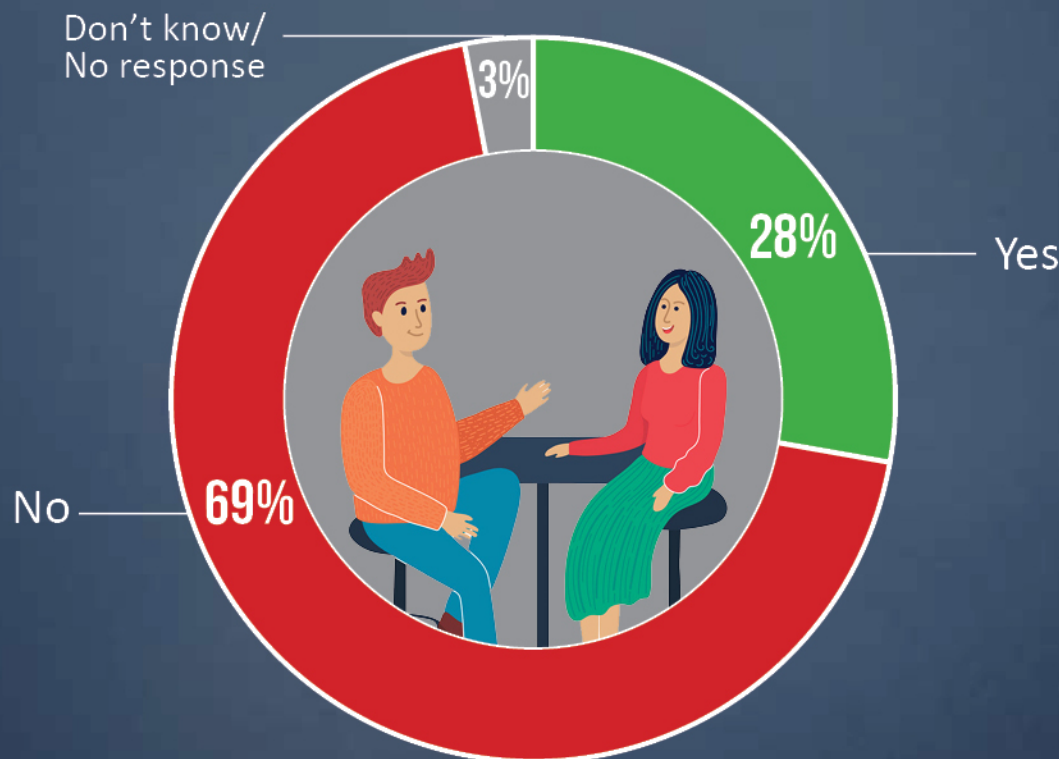

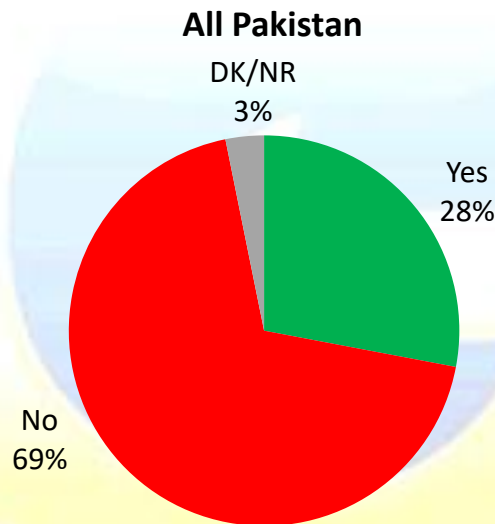
Majority (69%) of Pakistanis feel that women talk more than men; gender disparity exists: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), November 30, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, majority (69%) of Pakistanis feel that women talk more than men; gender disparity exists.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you think men talk more than women?” In response to this question, 69% said no and 28% said yes. 3% did not know or provided no response.

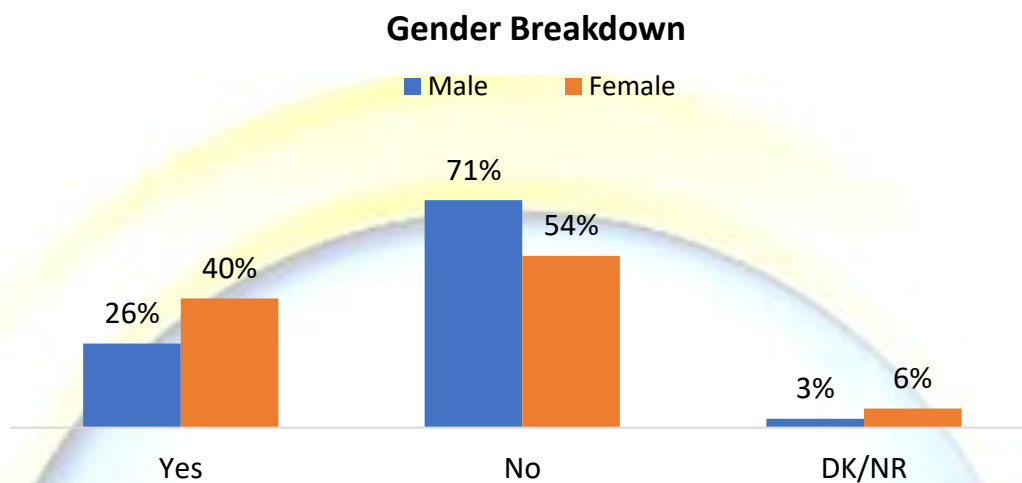
Question: “Do you think men talk more than women?”

Gender Breakdown

As compared to females (54%), considerably more males (71%) are of the opinion that men do not talk more than women.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 552 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 25, 2021 – October 28, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
