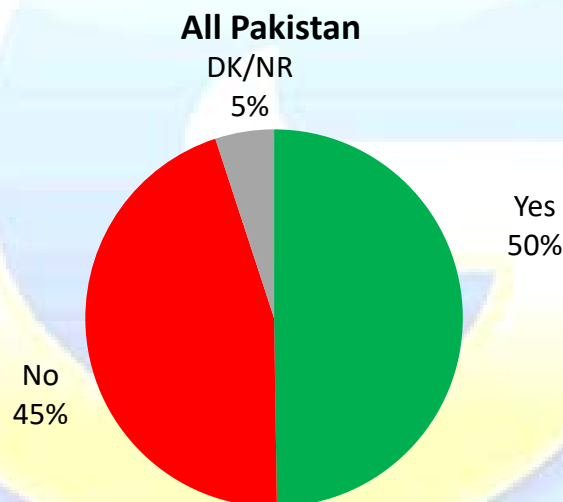
Public opinion split on the issue of whether men forget important dates; slightly more women (53%) than men (49%) think that men forget important dates: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, public opinion split on the issue of whether men forget important dates; slightly more women (53%) than men (49%) think that men forget important dates.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you think men do not remember important dates?” In response to this question, 50% said yes while 45% said no. 5% did not know or provided no response.

Question: “Do you think men do not remember important dates?”

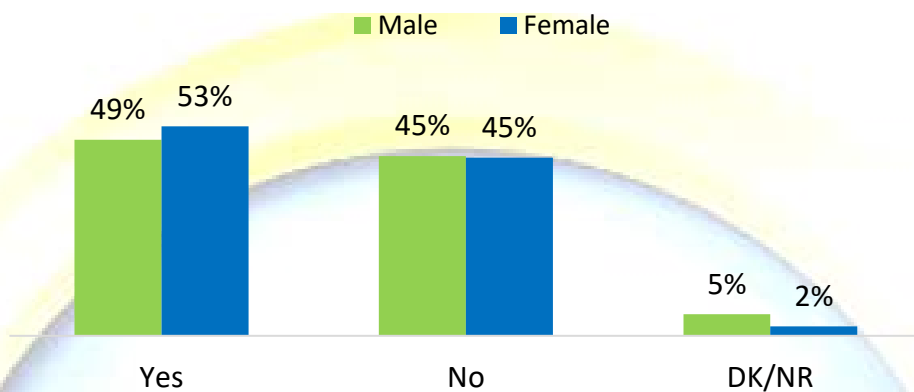

As compared to males (49%), females (53%) are slightly more likely to report that men do not remember important dates.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 552 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 25, 2021 – October 28, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
