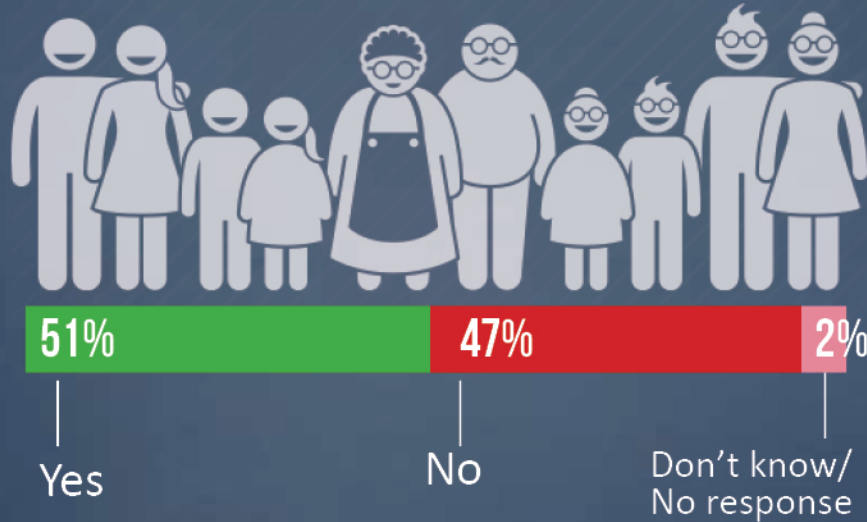

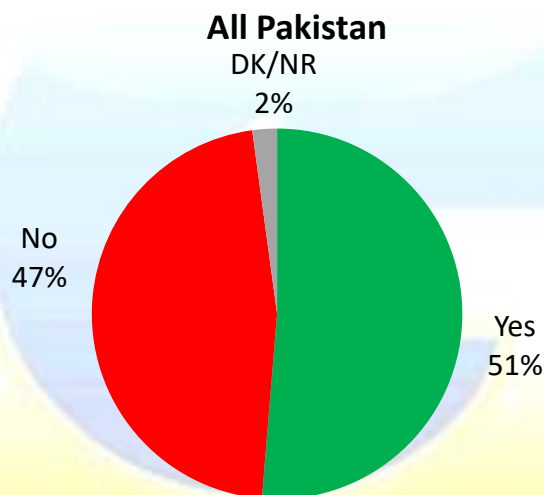
1 in 2 (51%) Pakistanis feel that living in a joint family set-up after getting married is not an issue: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), December 1, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 2 (51%) Pakistanis feel that living in a joint family set-up after getting married is not an issue.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you think living in a joint family set-up after getting married is not an issue?” In response to this question, 51% said yes and 47% said no. 2% did not know or provided no response.

Question: “Do you think living in a joint family set-up after getting married is not an issue?”

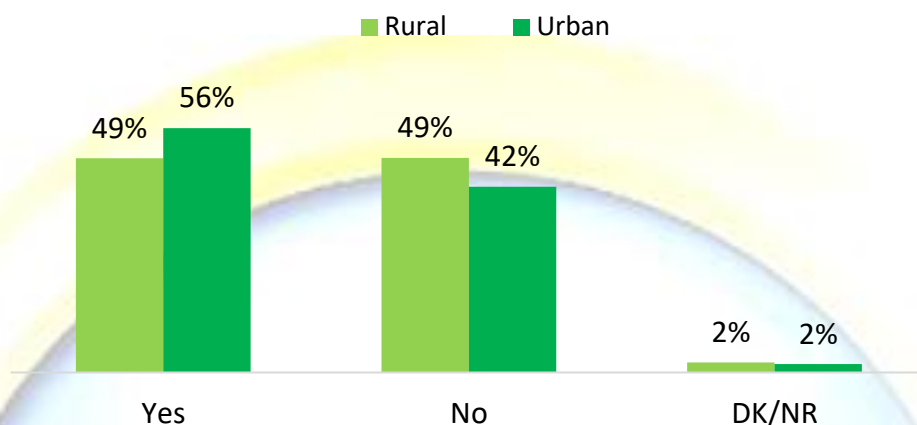

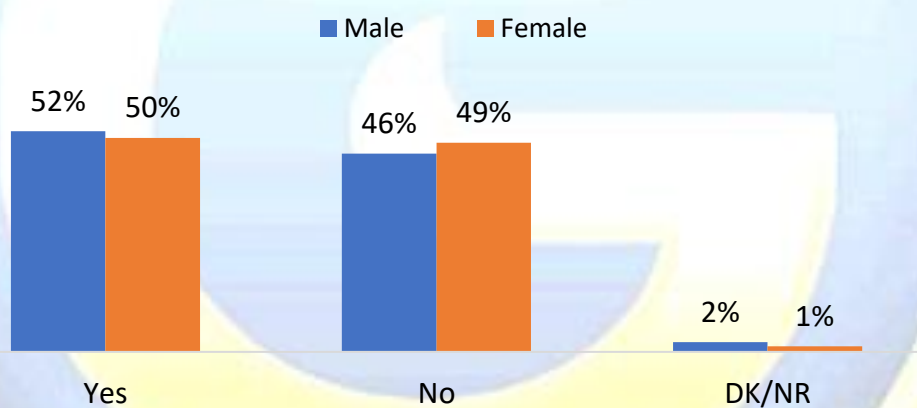
Breakdown

Those living in urban (56%) areas are more likely to feel that living in a joint family set-up after getting married is not an issue as compared to those living in rural (49%) areas. Gender-wise, males (52%) and females (50%) are almost equally likely to feel the same.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 552 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 25, 2021 – October 28, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
