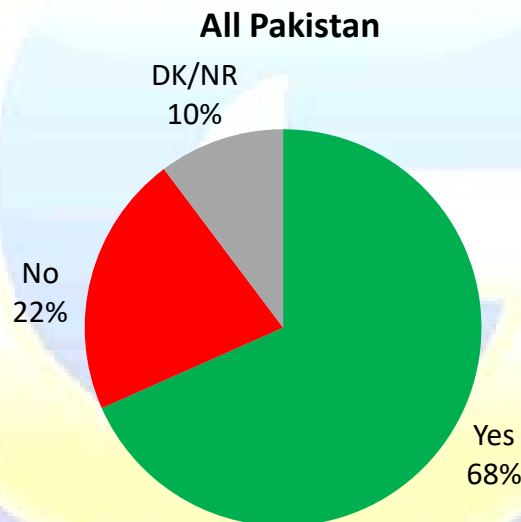
Nearly 7 in 10 (68 %) Pakistanis think that men are able to understand new technology better than women: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), December 3, 2021

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 7 in 10 (68%) Pakistanis think that men are able to understand new technology better than women.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you think men are able to understand new technology better than women?” In response to this question, 68% said yes and 22% said no. 10% did not know or provided no response.

Question: “Do you think men are able to understand new technology better than women?”

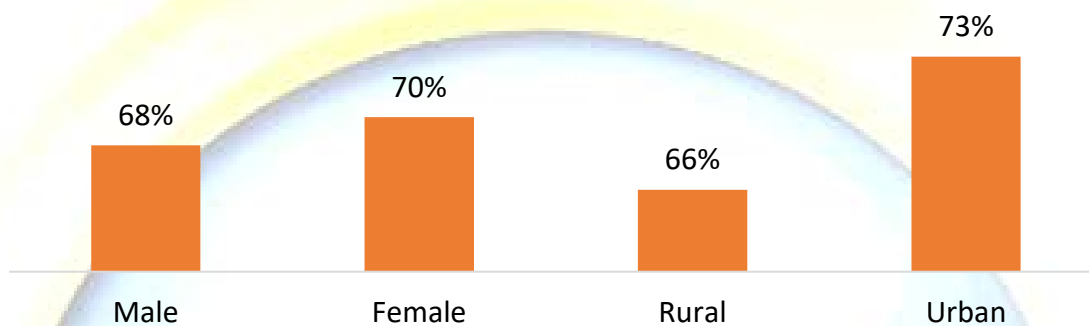

Breakdown

Slightly more females (70%) feel that men are able to understand new technology better than women as compared to males (68%). Location-wise, this opinion was more common among urban (73%) respondents as compared to rural (66%) respondents.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 552 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 25, 2021 – October 28, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
