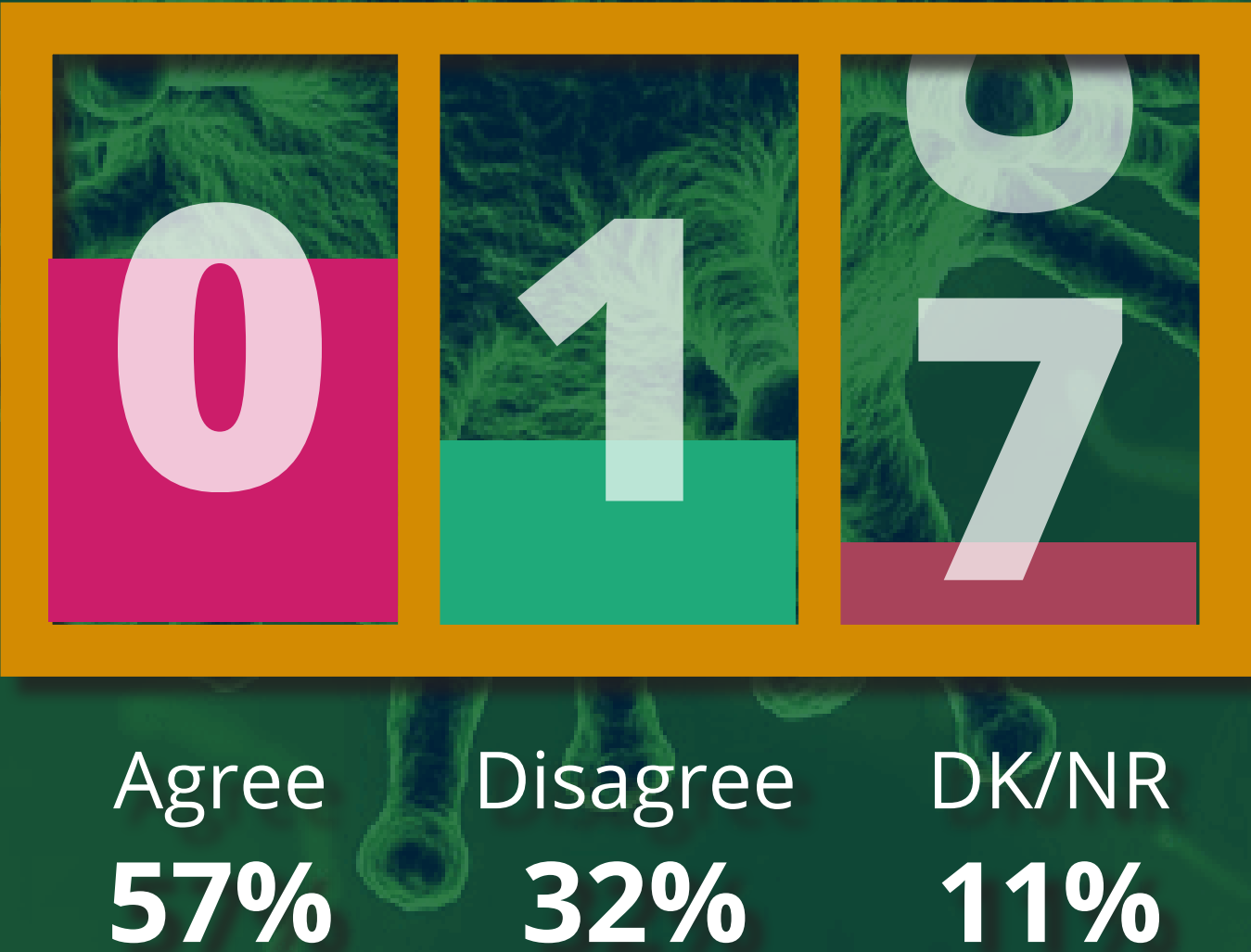

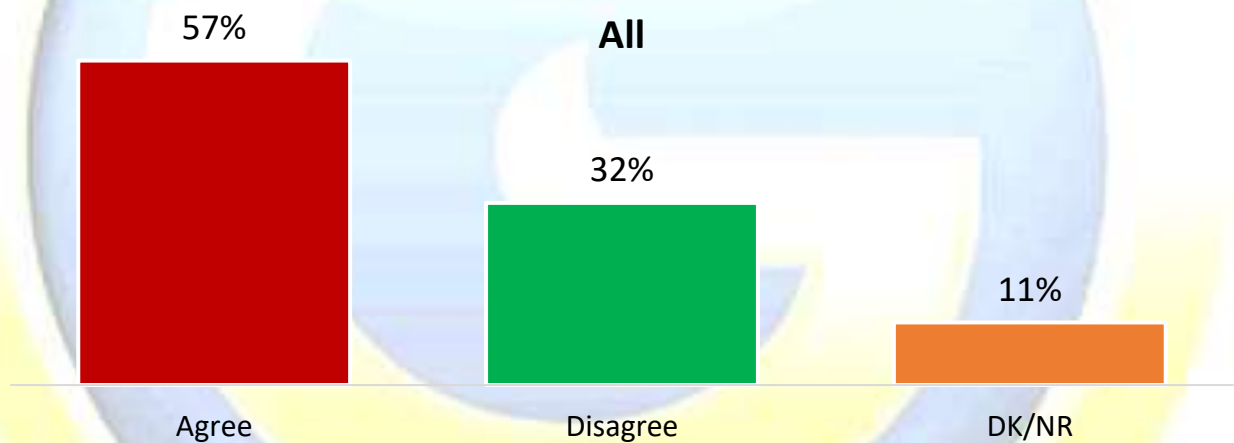

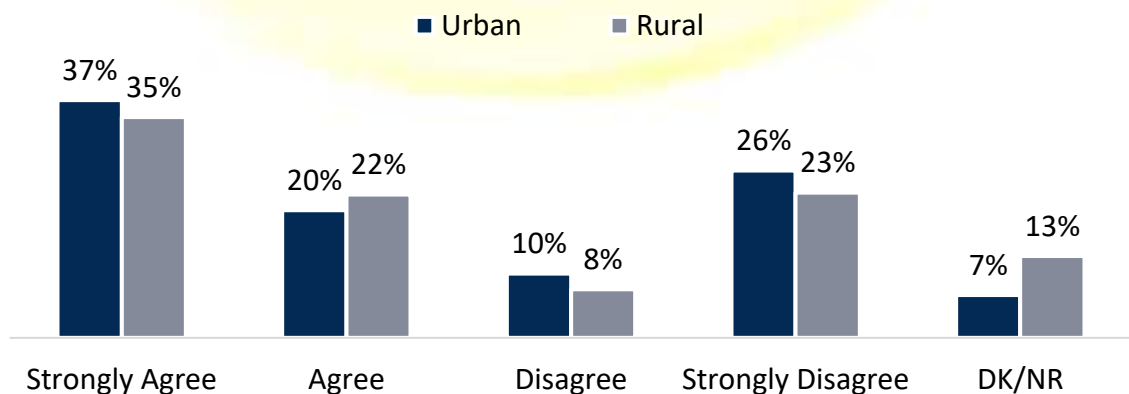
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 3 (32%) Pakistanis are skeptical about the number of COVID-19 cases being reported by the government.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: ‘I believe the number of Coronavirus cases being reported by the government are accurate’?”* In response to this question, 57% say they agree that the cases being reported by the government are accurate, 32% disagree and 11% say they do not know/did not respond.

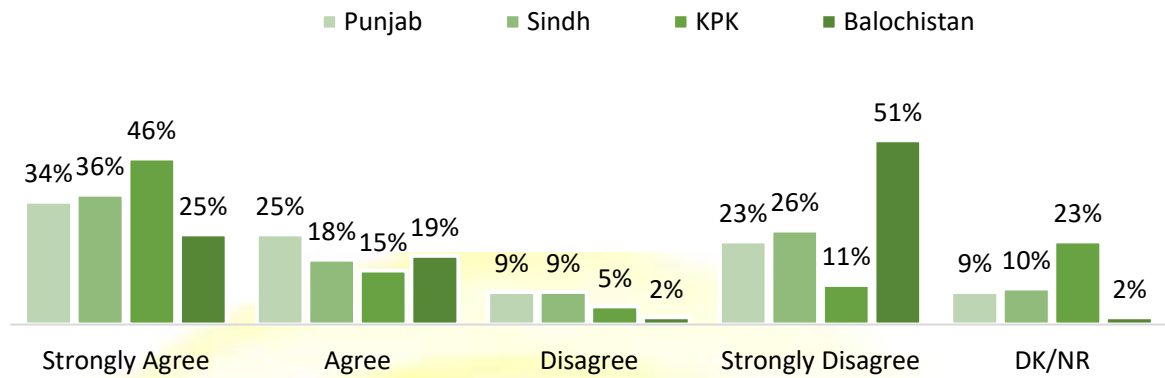
Question: “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: ‘I believe the number of Coronavirus cases being reported by the government are accurate’?”



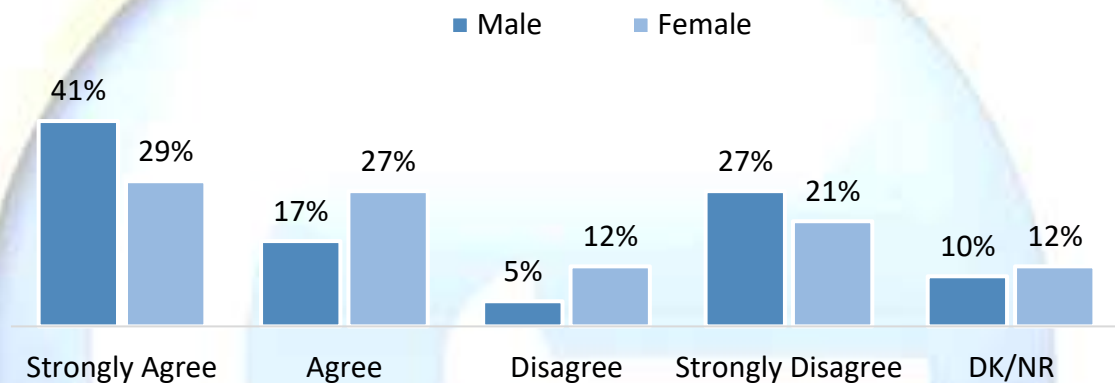

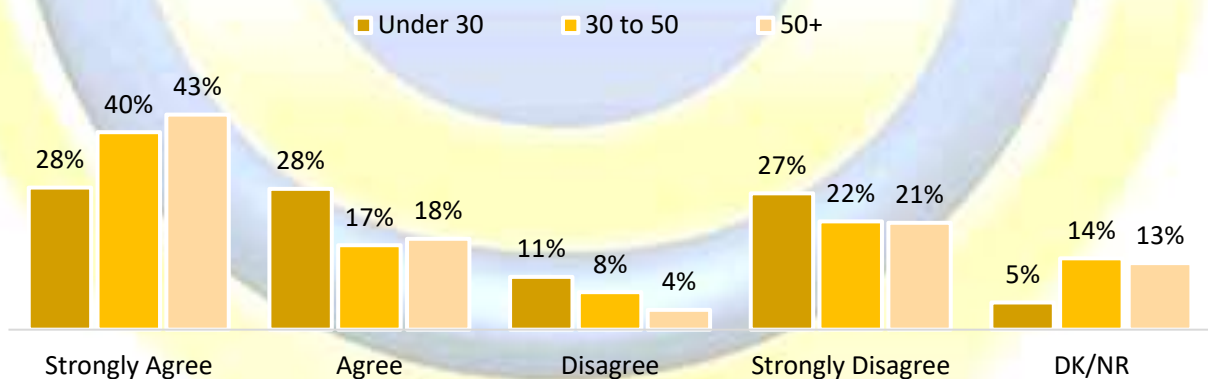
Provincial Breakdown

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,219 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 04 – June 13, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 6. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
