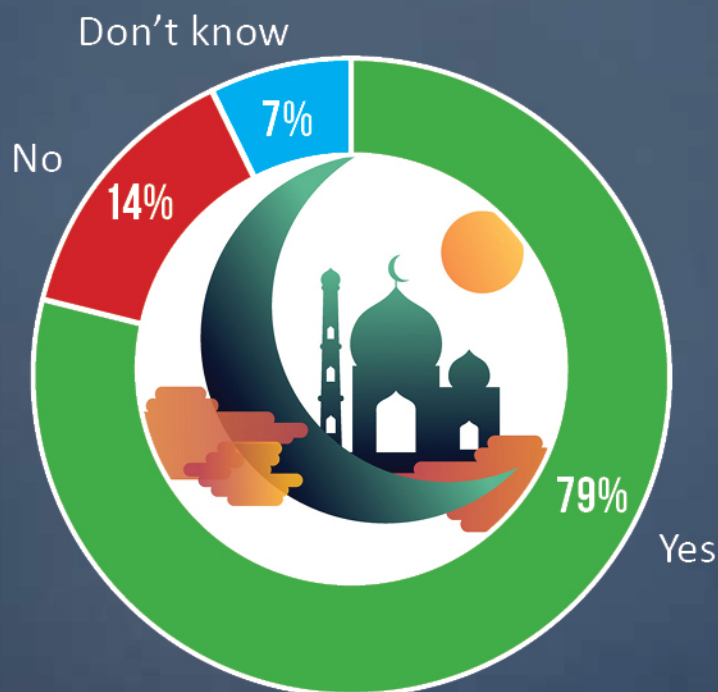

NEARLY 4 IN 5 (79%) PAKISTANIS AGREE THAT MUSLIMS SHOULD MAKE THEIR OWN UNITED NATIONS: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

Nearly 4 in 5 (79%) Pakistanis agree that Muslims should make their own United Nations: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

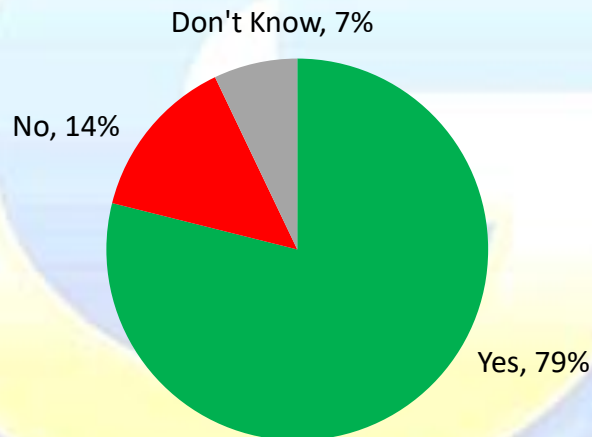

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 4 in 5 (79%) Pakistanis agree that Muslims should make their own United Nations.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Do you think Muslims should make their own United Nations?*” In response to this question, 79% said yes, 14% said no while 7% said don’t know.

Question: “Do you think Muslims should make their own United Nations?”

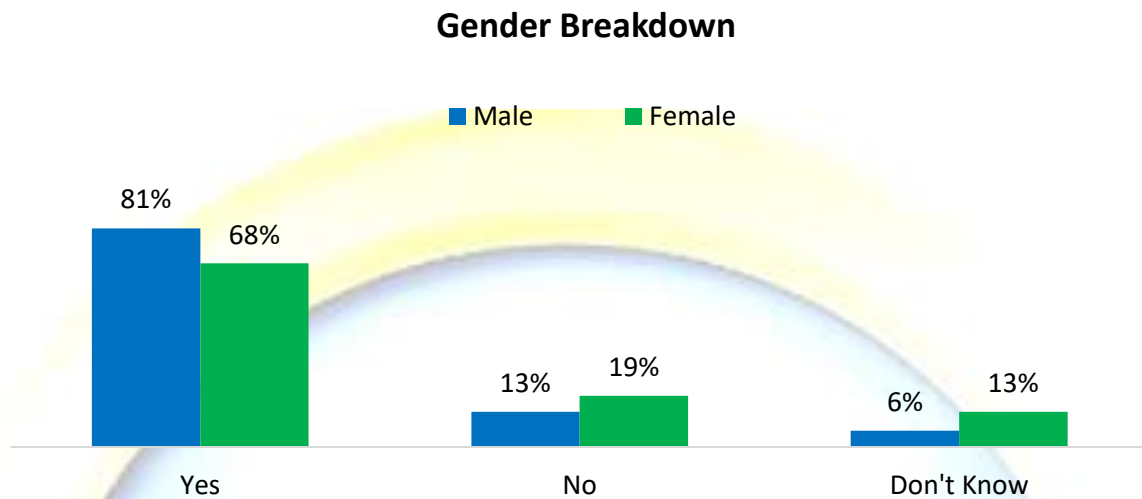

More males (81%) as compared to females (68%) are of the opinion that Muslims should make their own United Nations.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1730 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 23, 2021 – October 08, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
