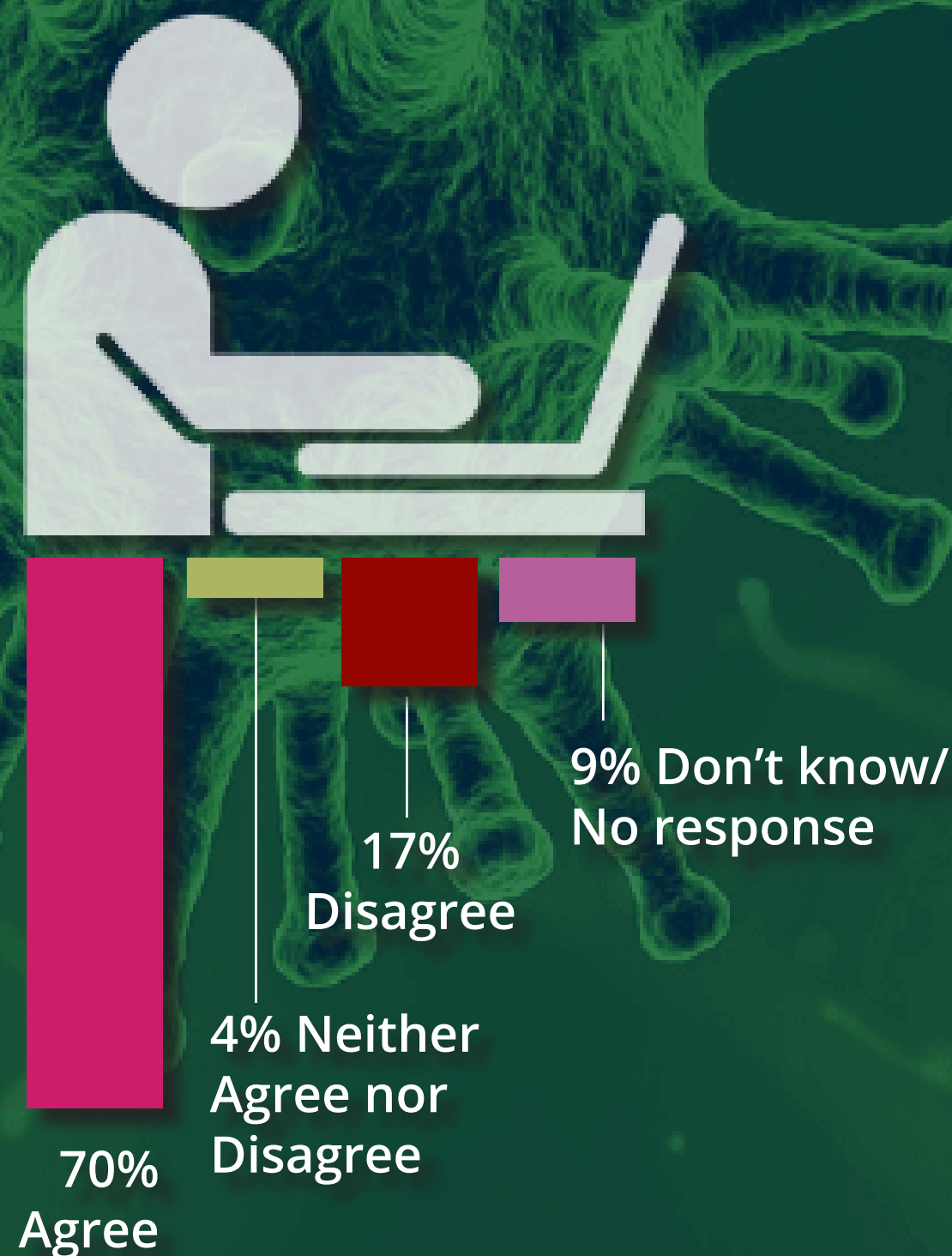

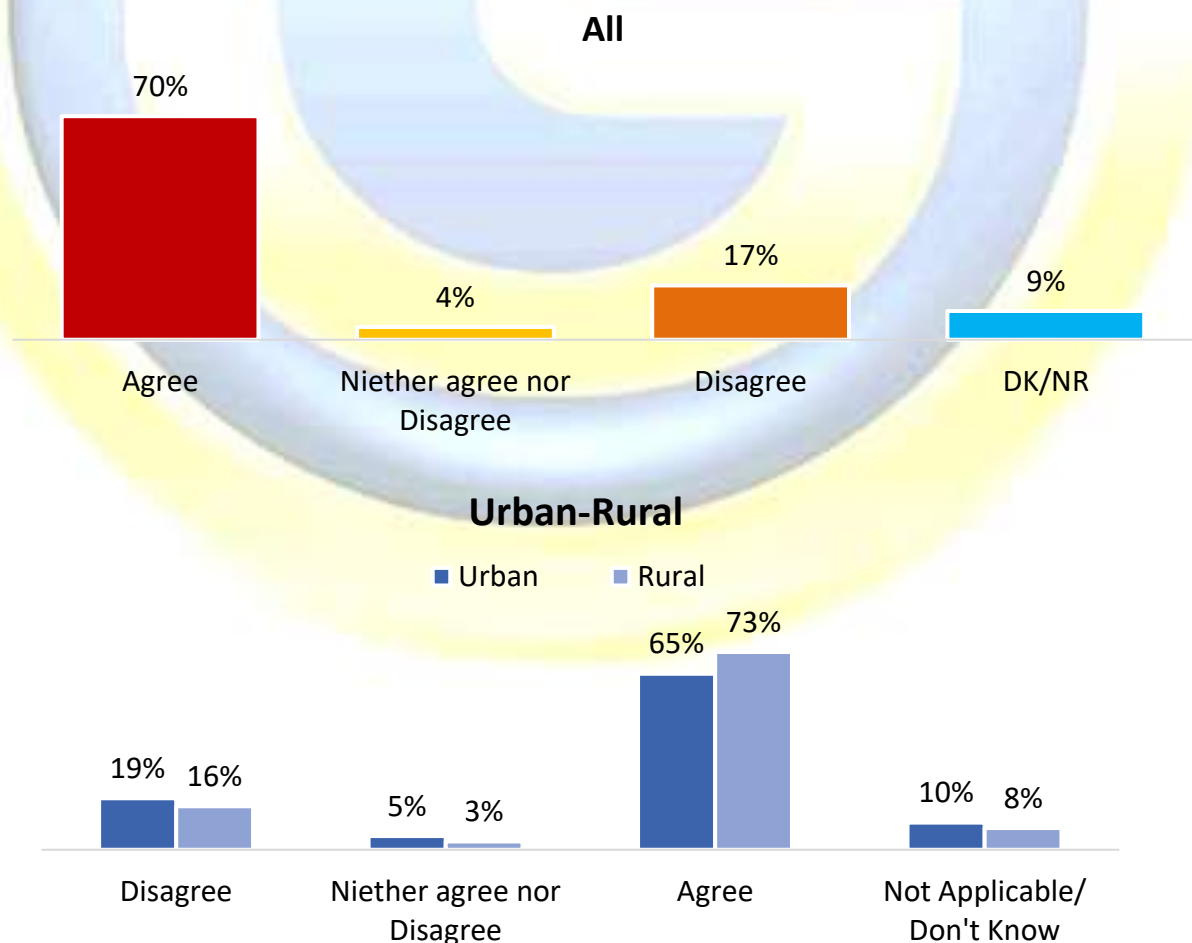

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 3 in 4 (70%) Pakistanis claim that they are concerned about having reduced ability to work in the current situation.

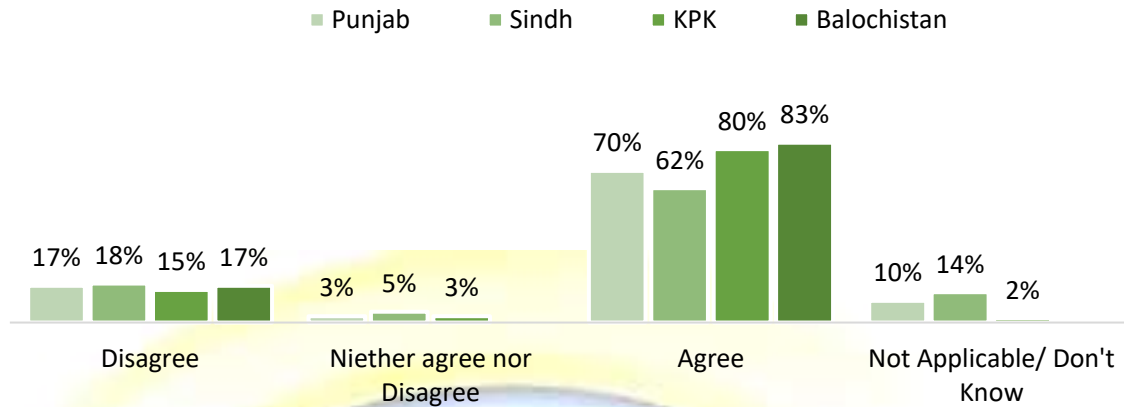
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: I am concerned over having reduced ability to work?” In response to this question, 70% said they agree, 4% said they neither agree nor disagree, 17% said they disagree and 9% said they did not know/did not respond.

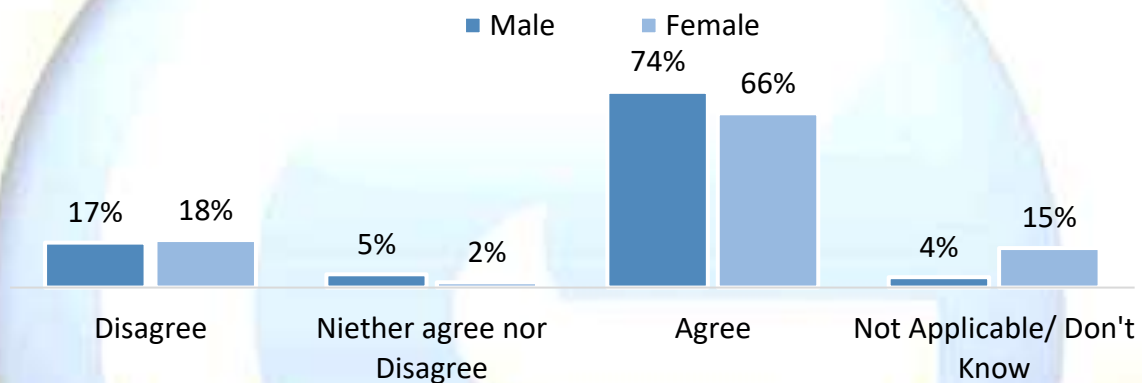
Question: “Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: I am concerned over having reduced ability to work?”



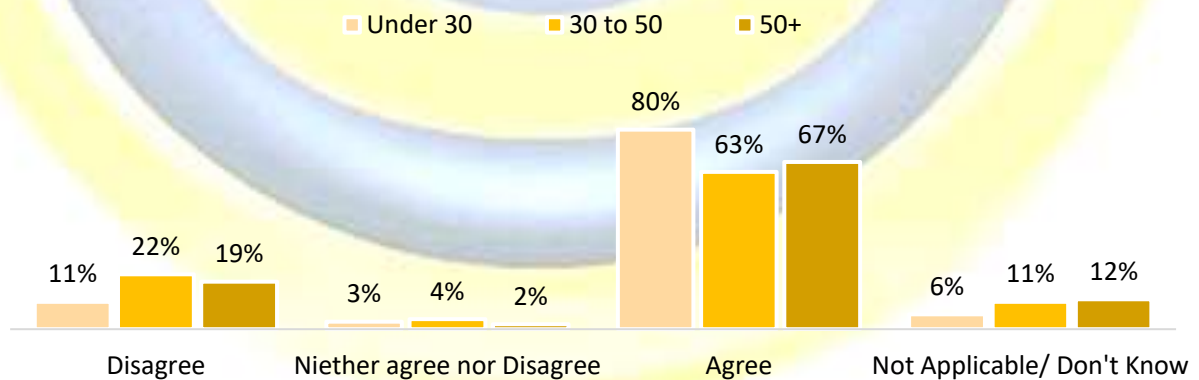
Provincial Breakdown

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,050 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 04 – June 13, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 6. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
